

Editorial

After a rather slow start recent events seem to have stimulated interest in celebrating the Oucen's Golden Jubilee, I see from local news reports that over 60 roads have now enquired about street parties and these are only the ones that have applied to the council for information, I am sure many more are being planned in private grounds thus dispensing with the legalities. Let us hope 50 years on the weather is kinder to the nation, I think most people remember June 2nd 1953 for the torrential rain that fell throughout the morning rather than for the celebrations, many of which were cancelled or postponed. If you have not yet decided how to celebrate we include details of community events to be held at Rainham, Wigmore and Upchurch which are in the final stages of preparation, you would be very welcome to join in any or indeed all of these planned activities. Writing of these events reminds me of the years during which we were involved with the Rainham Spectacular (for the newcomers to the area this was a grand Fete held for about 20 years on the Spring Bank Holiday Saturday in Cozenton Park). In its early days, run as a fund raising activity for Rainham Community Centre, the Spectacular attracted huge crowds - the first one in 1971 had traffic queuing back almost to Gillingham - but as local schools and churches gradually introduced their own events the Rainham Spectacular faded into history. The weather for the Spectacular was notoriously fickle, with hindsight I think I can remember more days when gumboots and raincoats were the order of the day rather than shorts and sunshades, so cross your fingers that this year is one for sunbathing. The Spectacular may have been abandoned but Rainham Community Centre continues to thrive. This month they have a couple of special events that you are very welcome to attend, the centre beside Rainham Station is there for your use so if you do not know it why not pay a visit and see what is going on.

The Ranger service at our local country parks is under threat as a cost cutting exercise by the local council. Our community open space is valuable to Medway and well used, even on bleak winter days there are always visitors walking the dog, or just getting some fresh air at Riverside when I deliver

copies of Action Forum to the Visitor Centre. Without the constant care and attention by the Rangers (who also plan and supervise many community activities throughout the year) these pleasant parks would soon become rundown and neglected, do not let this happen. You can make your voice felt by signing the petition to keep our Rangers available either at Riverside Country Park or The Rainham Bookshop. Meanwhile make the most of the good weather to enjoy the countryside during this, the best month of the year. Have a happy month of May and we will see you again in June.

Macklands House Pat Black DISTRIBUTORS NEEDED

As I am sure you know Action Forum is distributed to your door by a willing band of volunteers. Currently we have about fifty people who give up their time each month to bring you your copy of Action Forum. Inevitably though, as circumstances change, we are constantly in need of more helpers. The money that is earmarked for distribution is now given to charity. To date we have donated £1,940 to the Kajiedo project and £590 each to St Margaret's and St Matthew's Church Roof Appeal Funds. The number of copies each distributor handles, and the amount of time taken of course, varies considerably from 100 copies to 1,000 plus. I try to complete the 20,000 copies we print by filling in the areas that have no distributor and by doing those of regular helpers when they are on holidays, last month this was just over 3,000 copies. Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR APRIL

In March Nature Notes I recalled a walk along the River Medway at Rochester. In the April Notes, by way of comparison, I write about a visit to Canterbury and the Great Stour.

I commenced my walk in Westgate Gardens. In contrast with the muddy, tidal waters of the Medway the fresh waters of the Stour were clear. According to a leaflet on the river, they contain salmon, trout and perch. Heading upstream I went under Rheims Way (the Canterbury ringroad) and into Whitehall Meadows which are one of the few remaining water meadows along the Stour. They are regularly flooded in winter and, at least in the past, were grazed or mowed in the summer. They were still boggy in places during my April visit. The vegetation consists of rushes, sedges and grasses.

Part of Whitehall Meadows were turned into a pleasure garden for the people of Canterbury between the two world wars and many large weeping willows and white poplar trees appear to have been planted during that era. There are also a number of alder trees which would have grown naturally by the river.

Clumps of marsh marigold (or kingcups) were in flower. Before the extensive draining of the English countryside, from the eighteenth century onwards, kingcups must have been the most conspicuous plants the cathedral. By contrast, the west end of Rochester of early spring, blooming in water meadows and other wet places. Also growing along the bank of the river were extensive stretches of hemlock water dropwort, a tall umbellifer, whose white flowers will not blossom until May.

Mute swans and mallard were swimming in the river. I had seen the same two species on my visit to the Medway. Here on the Stour they would be nesting among the lush vegetation on the banks. I went under a railway bridge and into a field where, in the summer, one can sit and watch the punts go by. On the opposite bank to the field was Wincheap Meadow which, particularly in winter, is the haunt of snipe, mallard, teal and lapwing.

I retraced my steps. On the return journey I had views of Canterbury Cathedral which, from my position to the south west of the city, looks as though it is surrounded by water meadows. As it flows through the city itself the Great Stour divides into two. The northern arm runs close to old walls and bastions and mill sites. The southern arm passes by the Norman castle, former friaries and monasteries and the one-time houses of Flemish weavers. Where it was possible, I walked beside each arm, from Bingley Island where the river divides to Kingsmead Meadows where it becomes one channel again.

Even in the centre of the city I came across a number of water hens moving furtively along the edges of the river. Much more tame and much more noisy were many mallard. In the river itself I observed what appeared to me to be a shoal of chubb. Lime, sycamore and London plane trees were in evidence among the red bricked and vellow stock bricked houses of the city. There was little or no bird life in the streets but I did notice a couple of old house martins' nests under the eaves of a house in Broad Street. It was a reminder that the air above Canterbury would soon echo to the calls of house martins (and their more gregarious cousins the swifts).

I ended my walk in the precinct of Canterbury Cathedral. A large London plane tree with a massive bulbous trunk stands prominently to the east end of Cathedral sports an impressive Indian bean tree. Looking around me I concluded that Rochester Cathedral has the edge over its elder sister in the leafiness of its surroundings.

RAINHAM'S CORONATION CELEBRATIONS

In 1953 the population seemed to be captivated by the Coronation of our young Queen and almost everyone entered into the spirit of the occasion, Rainham was proud to play its part.

The most heated arguments occurred after the event when the Committee had to decide how to dispose of a balance of £164 which was left after all accounts had been paid. Many ideas were eventually eliminated in favour of a village clock. Barclay's Bank, at the junction of Station Road and the High Street, was one obvious location but Mr C.D. Lake, the Deputy Borough Engineer, who still lives in Wigmore, suggested that the Church Clock be renovated and a new face placed on the western side of the Tower. He had ascertained that the clock mechanism had been constructed around 1730 by William Gill of Maidstone and that this originally operated an hourly strike on the tenor bell. Apparently the peal of bells go back to the 16th century and the treble and No. 2 were provided by parishioners in 1913 in memory of King Edward VII and the Coronation of King George V and Oueen Mary. Mr Lake suggested that the chestnut trees on the grass bank be removed and new trees planted in the churchyard, this would have thrown the Church tower into more prominence and given a wider vista along the High Street. Apparently the Vicar at that time was quite keen on the project and thought that a small additional contribution could be made.

The arguments in Committee created our first real divisions, the Church scheme seemed to follow a precedent but a most vocal group considered it wrong in principle to apply money, which had been raised by residents of all faiths and none, upon the Parish Church. The arguments that everyone would view the clock were not persuasive enough. That is why an 'English Electric' Arctic clock is still situated on Barclay's Bank building with a plaque to the left of the front door.

Incidentally Gillingham Borough Council maintained it until 1998 when Medway assumed responsibility. I have frequently telephoned when it has stopped and I hope that others will do the same. The present officers are Mr Strila and Mr Dray on 331151. Perhaps our Rainham Councillors will also note the arrangement which has been reasonably honoured for 50 years but Councils do need reminding at times.


