Editorial

The origins of Rainham go back much further than the recorded history we have available, as has been highlighted by the finds shown on our front cover and outlined on page 7.



Rainham was on the Roman route from Canterbury to London, which followed older tracks. We know of Roman villas in the vicinity at Hartlip, as well as the recently-discovered Roman temple in Newington, but there is now evidence dating back much further. Another site was excavated at Grange Farm, Gillingham back in 2006 but the results have only just been published, showing that

the area was occupied from Stone Age through Bronze and Iron Ages to Roman times with a Roman road linking Watling Street to the River Medway (parallel to the current Ito/Yokosuka Way) as well as a Roman Mausoleum and silver smelting works. It will be fascinating to hear what has been discovered in Rainham when the archaeologists publish their report on the site but it hints at what else must be waiting to be found underneath our houses and gardens!

It has been suggested that the Barclays Bank building may become a café and art studio. If this is the case then it would be great news that the building has a new use so we await developments with interest.

During the lockdown, St Margaret's Church set up a service to help local people keep in touch by starting 'Rainham News' videos, fronted by ex-Meridian reporter Sandy Fleming, with stories from local people and about local events. It has been great to find out what has been going on around Rainham and generate more of a community heart so it's worth checking out their YouTube channel. They are now looking for more stories so if you have any local news please contact them (see p5).

Climate Conversations

The sun has got its hat on - hip, hip, hip hooray!

As two of our team have already invested in solar panels, a solution that converts the sun's energy



directly into electricity for use in your home, I thought it time to find out whether it was right for me. The more so, as 'Solar Together Kent' group-buying scheme launched on February 7th and you have until March 15th to register your interest at www.solartogether.co.uk/medway/home, without any commitment to buy.

Those who have already installed solar panels will tell you that the sun doesn't actually need to be shining to begin generating your own electricity, but the longer it is bright the better. A survey of your roof, typically done remotely via satellite images, including which direction it faces and whether trees are likely to put your panels in the shade, will determine what you can expect to generate and save. I do appreciate that this is unlikely to be affordable for everyone, as the 8-panel (3 kw) set-up I am investigating has been illustrated (after group purchase benefit) to cost around £3,000. But with energy prices set to increase significantly during 2022, any investment in solar panels will reduce my monthly bills, especially as I can organise our domestic life around the time the sun is shining, e.g. programme the washing machine to operate during good sunlight hours.

Many appear keen to investigate, knowing that they can cut CO² emissions by well over

half a metric tonne per year on average, as Kent is in a good geographical location for solar panels.

The www.energysavingstrust.org.uk calculator I used forecast an annual saving of £276 per year off my electricity bill, so compared to around £15 per year in interest if the same money were in my bank current account, this appears to be a very decent return.

Do let us know your experiences and we will keep you updated on our progress and savings achieved.

The air that we breathe...

On the 13th January, I received an email alert from <u>www.Kentair.org</u> forecasting that Rainham's air quality the following day would reduce to mainly 'Moderate' - caused by atmospheric conditions preventing air pollution dispersing as normal.

The forecast included a health warning particularly for adults and children with preexisting lung problems and adults with heart problems but also the general population. The recommendation with this warning was to consider reducing strenuous physical exercise, particularly outdoors.

I posted the forecast and recommendation onto the Rainham Eco-hub Facebook page and will continue to do so if air quality in Rainham is forecast to worsen.

Saxon Discoveries in **Rainham** (from p1)

Anyone driving past the Manor Farm pub on the A2 at Rainham may have noticed that 4 bungalows have been demolished to make way for the new Churchill Living retirement complex. However, out of view behind the hoardings advertising the new apartments, some intensive archaeological investigations have been taking place over the last few months, with a team excavating across the

When the Premier Inn was built in the Manor Farm car park there were some significant finds made which flagged the area for further studies if other building work was proposed. Finds at that time included items from both the Iron Age and Roman era, as well as a substantial multi-room air raid shelter constructed for the staff of the old gas showrooms, dating from 1940, which must have been filled in after the war.

In the latest excavations, initial finds from the area closest to Manor Farm were of Iron age saltern hearths - salt production kilns to evaporate sea water to make salt for food preservation - as well as evidence of Iron Age round houses from the post holes left behind. Some Roman pottery fragments were also found but no evidence of Roman

The most surprising discoveries were located on the opposite side of the site closest to the A2 and underneath what would have been the first bungalow and front garden. Here a series of 10 early Saxon graves,

dating from 1500 years ago, including one of a child were found. Unfortunately, due to the high acidity of the soil, no bones were left but the more resistant enamel in teeth meant some of them survived.

The graves were all laid out on an East-West axis with heads facing west and grave goods such as iron knives, a set of keys and a belt buckle were still present. Most fascinating were the Neolithic arrow heads buried in 3 of the graves. These date from nearly 6000 years ago so it's suggested they must have had some special meaning to be used in much later Saxon burials.

The finds have all been removed from the site for further investigation but will be displayed at a later date.

The name of Rainham has been changed over the years so the older names of Rygingaham and Raegingaham have Anglo-Saxon origins. The people buried here, known as Franks rather than Angles or Saxons, had connections to France and emulated their burial practices. They would have been some of the earliest people to make Rainham their home.

It's an intriguing thought that this area is at

the end of Berengrave Lane which historian Freddie Cooper found shown as **Burying Grave** on a map from 1801 - could that name have older origins?

Nature Notes (Joe Ennis)

WINTER NATURE NOTES

The winter months are an opportunity to admire the unobstructed, often magnificent, structures of deciduous trees before their leaves reappear in the spring. For me, one delight is to view the trees at the junction of Maidstone Rd and Deanwood Dr as the red, winter sun rises behind them; oak, sweet chestnut, ash, beech and sycamore. I am familiar with these neighbourhood trees, but it They are apparently adept at remembering the is not always easy to identify species in the absence of leaves. For example, beech, lime and ash trees all have a smooth, grey bark. Both beech and sweet chestnut trees have massive lower branches that droop down to the ground. Horse chestnut and ash trees have boughs that sweep out, down then gracefully up again.

However, even in January, there are some still -dormant, deciduous trees that are a sign of spring, other than just an object of admiration. By the end of the month, rooks are spending more time in their treetop rookeries, typically oak, poplar or ash. Their bulky nests of sticks and mud would have deteriorated over winter and the males will have begun to come up from the fields to inspect and tinker with them. Before long, the females will have joined them and it is they who will eventually do most of the building work. If a pair uses an old nest again, it will probably be just a convenient base, on top of which they will construct a new one. However, most pairs construct a completely new nest close to the old one, pulling out the best of last year's sticks to use as fresh building material. It becomes very noisy in the rookery as the new nest-building gets under way, with rooks cawing furiously as sticks are stolen. Before the end of March, there will be sturdy nests dotted all over the rookery. By April, the females will be in their nests, sitting on eggs. There are rookeries in a line of poplar trees that cross over the A2 towards Newington, a short distance beyond the Rainham boundary; in oak trees at Keycol Hill on the A2 just before the A249 roundabout and in ash trees overlooking the A249 near Stockbury Church.

I now turn to late winter activity in nearby Bredhurst Wood, managed by Bredhurst Woodland Action Group. Male grey squirrels may be seen chasing females through the trees, sometimes with several in pursuit of a single female, while the dominant male fights off his rivals. The squirrels wave their bushy tails furiously as they chase through the branches, often leaping from tree to tree and chattering as they go. Jays can sometimes be spotted searching for the acorns and sweet chestnuts they buried in the woodland floor in autumn. whereabouts of their stored nuts. They are the shyest species of the crow family but can attract attention to themselves by their harsh, grating screeches. Recognised by their greyish -pink body and white, striking rump, as they fly off through the trees, they can often be seen in large, secretive, suburban gardens. Great spotted woodpeckers can also sometimes be surprised as they probe for larvae in the rotten wood of dead trees. Residents with gardens backing on to East Hoath Wood will be the ones most likely to see a great spotted woodpecker at their bird feeder. Cock pheasants may be seen walking slowly and boldly over dead leaves on the wood floor, turning the leaves over noisily as they look for worms, slugs, spiders or beetles. At the same time, they are selecting their spring territory as they stalk about with their habitual, proud demeanour. Despite their long residence in this country, having been introduced by the Normans, some bird watchers refuse to consider them a native British bird, as so many are reared by gamekeepers but according to the late Dr Oliver Rackham, a one-time Cambridge University botanist, no bird has had a greater impact on the English landscape than the pheasant and only the red grouse has had anything like the same level of influence. from the mid- 19th century, that pheasant shooting became a part of their social calendar. Rackham took the view that pheasants filled a vacuum which the decline of woodsmanship was leaving and gamekeepers kept alive many disused woods that might have been grubbed out. In particular some coppicing was continued, which was beneficial to certain woodland birds and flowers.

Yet Rackham also argued that game-keeping corrupted country life and produced ill-feeling between landowners and other folk. Gamekeepers took it upon themselves to persecute birds of prey and to exclude the public from ancient woods harbouring pheasants that had hitherto been everyone's heritage.

It's that time of the year...

When you walk into the garden and the urge to get mulching, sowing and digging tries to spur you into action, every time the sun shines, or it feels just a little warmer.

Immediately my eye is drawn to the dead growth still standing from last year's growth and the urge to start clearing it away, and prune back the salvias and other plants becomes almost irresistible.

But there's a reason it has been left like that when so many nearby gardens have been 'tidied' since late summer.

There is a lot of ripe seed heads that have provided vital winter food for goldfinches and sparrows, as well as the insects that climb amongst the dead stems.

And that dead growth has provided protection for overwintering insects vital to the health of my garden.

Slug-munching beetles, aphid-munching



earwigs, lace wings, ladybirds and a number of other creatures that help to maintain a healthy garden when the new growth starts to

So, with the real prospect of other cold spells yet to come, I'll resist those urges for a while yet and let it be. Those creatures can stay snug and warm until it really is time to clear it

Then I'll carefully stack the dead stalks vertically in my brush pile at the back of the rear garden so that they can continue to provide shelter and food until rotting away, to eventually be replaced by next season's cleared plants, while inviting hedgehogs, robins, wrens to set up home in the pile.

Once the flowerbeds have been cleared, it will be a case of mulching the ground several inches deep from the home made compost in the bins to put back the nutrients next year's pollinator-friendly shrubs and plants will need to produce wonderful colours and summer scents, and even more fascinating wildlife amongst the growing leaves and flowers...

First Rainham Youth Sunday League Football **Champions** (by David Wood)

Young, talented and successful, Rainham Youth Football Club became the first Rainham champions of the Medway Minor League in 1967/1968.

The league only operated as one division at under 18 level compared with the vast range of divisions and age ranges that exist today.

Playing at Rainham Recreation Ground on Sunday mornings in a strip of white shirts, black shorts and white socks, the team had considerable local support with big crowds attending home matches. Going through the entire season undefeated in the league, the team only dropped one point in a 2-2 draw with Upchurch United early in the season but were able to hold off a strong challenge from these local opponents until they met again in the final league match.

The Rainham youngsters outplayed Upchurch in this game to win 4-1 and secure the championship. This avenged a 3-0 defeat Upchurch had inflicted on the Rainham youngsters earlier in the League Cup.

Rainham Youth also did well against the men in the Medway Sunday League Cup by defeating Division 1 side, Woodfield, 6-0 in the second round although they were then eliminated by premier division team, Strand Athletic, 6-3 in a hard-fought third round

They also did well in the Kent Minor Cup

until defeated by Gravesend team, Riverside, on a very small pitch in the quarter finals.

Upchurch United went on to win the Kent Minor and League Cups as these two local teams totally dominated boy's football in the area.

Rainham had an array of talented players, including Graham Knight who later played for Gillingham Football Club. He played most of his career for Gillingham, making 274 first team appearances and scoring 10 goals as a full back from 1968 to 1979. Dave Pullen and John Higginson of Rainham Youth also played with him for Gillingham

David Wood played in goal for Rainham Youth, whilst defenders included Graham Smith, Brian Puplett and Trevor Moore. Midfield was comprised of Brian Perkins, Graham Knight and John Higginson, whilst forwards included Terry Arnold, Ray Heath, Dave Pullen, Jack Barlow, Dave Whitehead and Chris Tong.

Several people helped organise the team, including Len Harrison of Station Road.

Geoff Stone, Denis Chambers, Les Woolley, Mick Arnold, Martin Cogger, Andy Findlay and Paul Clark later performed for the team at the senior level in the League.

Most of the original team re-formed during the mid-1970s to become Rainham Social Club FC and they were also successful in the Medway Sunday League.
