

Editorial

The Summer Fair season is upon us again and we feature at least a dozen different outdoor events in our diary. Congratulations to the organisers, there are very few clashes of dates this year, rather you could probably visit a different fete each Saturday of June and July, should you so wish, with a few weekday afternoons thrown in for good measure. Now all that remains is for the weather to co-operate and success is assured. One particularly enterprising activity is the Wigmore Gardens Weekend, now is your chance to have a good look round some of those interestinglooking gardens. It is a bargain and will help provide much needed funds towards the 'Roof Appeal' for St Matthew's Church.

Talking of walking by on footpaths, we are in need of distributors for Action Forum in several parts of the area. We have a loyal band of volunteers who do a marvellous job with about nine-tenths of the copies but the final 2,000 do present a problem. To date, almost a thousand pounds has been raised for the charity, which really does help them, and we are finding our volunteers are providing a better, more reliable, service with the door to door distribution. I have noticed that nothing has ever been included in Action Forum about Kent Travellers, not the Romanys but the proud and hard working travelling showmen. My husband's family have been showmen for many years, travelling around Kent with their gallopers, traction engines and caravans. Penfold Amusements were a familiar and popular sight and Rainham was often on the agenda. My mother, who is 77, remembers having rides on Penfolds Gallopers when they were at Rainham Recreation Ground. The smell of the traction engines, the music of the old fairground organ and the calling showmen all added to the atmosphere and excitement for the children.

The picture on the front cover, taken in 1943, is of a set of Penfolds Gallopers. The ride was recently known to be owned by Carters Funfair, but in this photo we believe it is in either Rainham or Gillingham. The operator to the left of the ride is William (Bill) Penfold and standing just right of centre is James Penfold (senior); he was my husband's (David James Penfold) grandfather. I can recognise some of my family (Bakers from Upchurch and Rainham) but we would love to know more about the venue and occasion. Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR MAY

In 1983 the Kent Wildlife Trust bought two small flower-rich hay meadows from a family which had owned two farms in Marden for generations. The two farms were traditional mixed ones which grew hops, a variety of apples, a small amount of arable crops and grazing grass for their dairy herd.

The two fields bought by the Trust were about a mile from the main farm which appears to be the reason for their survival as damp unimproved meadows. It seems that the land was too wet to grow arable crops, unsuitable for growing apples or hops and, in any case, too far from the farm to be worth growing anything other than grass for hay. A late cut of hay was accordingly taken each year and carted to the main farm where it was stored in ricks and provided winter feed for the cattle. Apart from a limited amount of dung applied occasionally, and a light harrowing, the fields received no artificial fertilisers and the very minimum of mechanical treatment.

The two meadows are among the last remaining examples in Kent of flower-rich traditional hay meadows and have been designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest. In May and June the two meadows are covered in thousands of green winged orchids which are somewhat like small early purples. The 'hood' of the green winged orchid is shot through with delicate green veining. The majority of the orchids at Marden Meadow are of a deep purple colour although a small proportion vary from pale lilac through pink to white. The orchids grow in a relatively low sward of grasses and other plants including the diminutive adders tongue fern. By high summer there is a much higher sward of grasses and other flowering plants and the predominantly purple colour has changed to the pale green of grass flowers, the white of ox-eye daises and the yellow of cats' ear.

H.E. Bates, the author of 'The Darling Buds of May', moved to Kent, from his native Northamptonshire, in 1931. His recollections of childhood summers ache with regret for the lost wild flowers,

butterflies and birds which used to coexist with the farmer's crop of hay. At Marden Meadows, however, even 25 years after his death, one can still walk through a traditional flower-rich meadow of the kind that Bates recollected from his childhood.

The meadows at Marden are bounded by hawthorn hedges which are covered in white blossom in the month of May. Bates described May blossom as 'the risen cream of all the milkiness of May time'. He wrote those words in 1936, after his arrival in Kent, but he doubtless had in mind the long hawthorn hedges of the 18th century enclosure fields of his native Northamptonshire. Professor W.G. Hoskins, the author of 'The Making of the English Landscape', wrote that on the 18th May each year the miles of snowy hawthorn hedges of the Midlands reach perfection, so dense and far-reaching that the entire atmosphere is saturated with the bitter-sweet smell of May blossom whichever way the wind is blowing.

And so it is at Marden Meadows in May. Despite the profusion of green winged orchids, hay rattle, buttercups and many other flowers, the entire atmosphere is saturated with the bitter-sweet smell of May blossom.
