

# Nature Notes

#### NATURE NOTES FOR DECEMBER

December's Nature Notes are based on a visit to Leeds Castle, near Maidstone.

The entrance to the grounds from the ticket box leads through some impressive oak and sweet chestnut trees planted in the early eighteenth century. Jackdaws can usually be seen and heard as they fly among the tree tops. They swoop down at feeding times to steal corn from the ducks and geese in the duckery. The eider ducks and barnacle geese are among my favourite birds in the duckery. Neither species are readily observable in the wild in Southern England but here at Leeds Castle one can walk among them.

On our left as we came out of the duckery we could see six cormorants silhouetted against the sky as they perched on the top-most branches of a tall oak tree. Cormorant populations have been on the increase across Europe for many years and the birds have accordingly become a bone of contention with amateur inland fishermen. Ahead we could see two massive Cedar of Lebanon trees. Cedars grow comparatively quickly and so, despite the two trees having been planted only in the middle of the nineteenth century, they have now reached a very large size indeed.

We began the woodland walk beside the little River Len. Colour was provided by the red bark of thickets of dog wood and by the catkins of alder trees which took on a reddish brown hue in the winter sunshine.

On the lawn in front of the wooden summer house was a large group of coots. During the breeding season males will fight each other ferociously but during the winter they usually feed peaceably together.

On the croquet lawn beyond the gatehouse were some five or six pied wagtails. The birds walk with a deliberate, stepping gait, head and tail bobbing up and down. They catch insects on the ground by sudden dashes and swerves. In these winter months wagtails roost communally and those at Leeds will probably

We crossed the causeway and went through the courtyard into the Culpepper Garden which is a cottage garden; a very English garden. It has low box hedges as borders. The garden is not of course as colourful in winter as in summer but in the winter one has the opportunity to see almost the complete layout of the garden from a number of vantage points.

Next to the Culpepper Garden is the Lady Baillie Garden which contains Mediterranean and sub tropical plants laid out on terraces overlooking the Great Water. None of the plants had been wrapped up for the winter so the gardeners are presumably hoping for a mild one. On the Great Water we could see flocks of tufted duck, pochard and mute swan. There were also four whooper swans which are distinguishable from mute by their yellow, wedge shaped bills. In the wild whooper swans are winted visitors to this country from Arctic Russia.

The dahlia beds at the back of the greenhouses had been turned over for the winter. The greenhouses themselves were full of cuttings and plants, including some very colourful cyclamen.

We returned to the courtyard in which two Indian bean trees grow, one of which was decorated with white Christmas lights. The tree is a native of the USA and has long thin fruit pods which hang down from the tree like runner beans. There is also an Indian bean tree outside Rochester Cathedral. We went into the Fairfax Hall restaurant to hear the Christmastide Choristers singing carols and to have a mince pie each.

Around 50 years ago Mrs Coats, the District Nurse, asked if she could start a Red Cross Detachment to help train people to home nurse their family. Six people were needed to start the venture and they were eventually found. A dear friend Mrs Isabel Wyles (now 93) was one, she still likes to hear news of the Red Cross.

When I came into the service in September 1971 the detachment was meeting in the old Holding Street Clinic and the Commandant was Mr Ernest Musslebrook. Coffee Mornings and Jumble Sales were being held to raise funds towards a permanent building. This came about 28 years ago when 46 Orchard Street was acquired. Strong friendships were made whilst we scrubbed, cleaned, painted, dug the garden, etc. Mrs Marion Jones was the first Centre Creaniser and soon had us all sorted. Various groups d the house, Fund Raisers, Cadets (Bob Britten in charge of 11-16 year olds and Barbara Hoy, later Gillian Stanfield, for the Links 6-11 years).

Jumble Sales in St Margaret's Hall provided much needed funds, once the old garage and sheds had been removed from our site we held these events and coffee mornings at the side of the Centre and in our members' gardens.

Throughout the time we carried out First Aid duties by request at local schools, RATS, Blood Doning sessions, Crisis at Christmas, walks, Allhallows and Leysdown Beach Huts, International Hockey Festivals, Dockyard Open Days and the Ice Bowl to name a few, by many willing members. Rochester Cathedral Services have for many years been covered by Rainham First Aiders, it is sad to think we may not be called to the Christmas Crib Service and Midnight Service any more. The Lions Club donated an ambulance, which saw many years of good service. During two ambulance strikes it was on standby at the Police Station manned by our members.

15 years ago three members were invited to join the Therapeutic Care Volunteers and went to Maidstone to learn the art of hand care in hospitals. Iris, Brenda and Alma were then placed in All Saints' es and Queens wards and started work in April 1986. We enjoyed our days there, talking and making patients feel a little brighter just for having time spent




