

On Saturday August 3rd, the last day of their season, Dave and Mavis Knowler, the owners of Knowlers' Nursery, 143 Berengrave Lane, Rainham, have very kindly offered CARE their premises and facilities to hold a fund-raising day. Teas, coffees and cakes will be on sale, together with jams, pickles and other goods made by the residents of CARE. There will also be a selection of Christmas cards at extremely reasonable prices. Refreshments and goods will be available from 10am until 4pm.

CARE is an organisation for people with learning disabilities, providing encouragement, support and guidance to its residents and day service users. The present premises are in remote Ide Hill. The residents no longer wish to be so isolated. They want to experience life as we do and be able to take up opportunities for work placements, college courses and social outings without travel arrangements becoming a major disruption to daily life. In order to meet these needs, CARE's plans for a new purposebuilt residential and day centre at Edenbridge are well underway. It will include workshops, a horticulture centre, coffee and craft shops, together with residential accommodation for thirty people with learning disabilities.

Based in nearby towns and linked with the main centre are three group homes, each housing eight people able to live more independently.

As well as creating this flexible approach, CARE is aiming to ensure that all its residents benefit from access to local facilities, together with the wealth of new experiences that this will provide.

Hand-in-hand we can help others lead the life we take for granted.

#### LOCAL NATURE RESERVE STATUS FOR FOXBURROW WOOD

Along with other residents backing on to Foxburrow Wood, I have recently received a letter from the Legal Department of Medway Council, announcing that at long last Foxburrow Wood has been declared a Local Nature Reserve in recognition of the significant nature conservation interests within its boundaries.

Foxburrow Wood has records and maps going as far back as the early 17th century and has many ancient woodland indicators such as Herb Paris and Bluebells. Foxburrow is a remnant of a large ancient woodland stretching from the River Medway to Queen's Down Warren on the North Downs. It was virtually devastated in October 1987 when Hurricane Herbert hit the south east of England. The Foxburrow Wood Restoration Group was formed by myself and other local residents to replant and restore the woodland to its former glory. The collaboration between Gillingham Borough Council and the Group was thought to be the first of its kind in the country.

As many of you will know the Group assisted in planting 12,000 young trees involving local school children and 140 residents. Over the past 10 to 14 years we have had the pleasure of seeing the woodland blossom into the woodland we see today. with the return of much of the flora and fauna that were present before the devastation. Unfortunately many of the residents who formed the restoration group have moved away and the few remaining have only been able to 'keep an eye' on the woodland and record the birds, plants, mammals, butterflies and insects as they have returned to the wood.

In their letter, the Council asks us to enjoy and respect this small 'reservoir' of wildlife, ensuring all garden waste is either composted or taken to the tip and all dog mess is removed from the site. On Tuesday 11th June Peter Crawford (Medway Countryside Development Officer), Simon Bellinger (Ranger) and a small group of local residents walked around Foxburrow Wood noting the special fauna and flora within the wood and also formulating a management plan for the wood. It is the intention that a Woodland Management Committee will be introduced later in the year to include all the

## Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR JUNE

Many readers will have watched the natural history programme, 'Bill Oddie goes Wild', on BBC2. One place that Bill visited was the village of Urchfont in Wiltshire on the end of Salisbury Plain. It is an attractive and prosperous-looking village surrounded by arable and pastoral land. The programme showed a wide variety of the wildlife of Urchfont and its surroundings but it was three species of birds which caught my own particular interest. They were house martins nesting under the eaves of a rather grand house, a spotted flycatcher at her nest in a hole in a brick wall and swallows nesting in a tractor shed.

Rainham's neighbouring village of Hartlip could also be described as attractive and prosperouslooking. It is surrounded by orchards, fields of Christmas trees, arable fields and grassland. I took a cycle ride there in early June to have a look at its wildlife and, in particular, to keep an eye open for any house martins, spotted flycatchers or swallows.

At the top of South Bush Lane I came across a group of swallows skimming above the broad beans of Woodside Farm. It was a good start to my hunt. On the edge of Hartlip I spotted a couple of red legged partridges in a field of young maize plants opposite Hartlip Place. The red legged partridge is heavier than the native grey and is boldly patterned on the

I paused at the village pond opposite the Methodist church. It is tiny compared with the pond at Urchfont and too small to support any wildfowl. But it provides WATTS THE CHEMIST drinking and bathing facilities for local greenfinches, blackbirds, chaffinches and dunnocks. The flowers of yellow flag were in bloom on the edge of the pond which is overshadowed by an impressive lime tree.

Hartlip is ideal for spotted flycatchers having many old walls and outhouses which can serve as nesting sites and many large gardens and lawns which harbour insects. Even so, I was not banking on seeing a spotted flycatcher. But I did, It was flitting between the gardens of Yew Tree Cottage and neighbouring Craiglea which are just above the entrance to Hartlip Village Hall. The spotted flycatcher is a delightful

Summer visitor with soft, grey-brown plumage above and whitish under parts. It sits in a characteristic upright position on a vantage point before darting after passing insects.

At the end of The Street I turned right into Munns Lane and then right again into Lower Hartlip Road. Under the eaves of the front and side of Paradise Cottage were many house martins nests. There were no martins about but the householder, who was in his garden, assured me that they were back in Hartlip. So I treated the score as two species down and one to go.

I passed the Rose and Crown pub and paused at the gate to a large field belonging to Sweepstake Farm. It was dotted with ash, sycamore, horse chestnut and other large trees. Three horses grazed the grass growing between the buttercups. Also feeding there were another pair of red legged partridges, a pheasant, a mistle thrush, a flock of wood pigeons and a number of rabbits. But no swallows.

I cycled up Mount Lane and completed my circular tour of Hartlip. The score was apparently stuck on two out of three. On my way home, at the top of Spade Lane, I came across a skylark singing above a field of wheat interspersed with wild chamomile or scented mayweed which is a member of the daisy family. A number of swallows, perhaps the same ones that I had met earlier, were hawking for insects above the white flowers of the mayweed. Since they were in the parish of Hartlip I decided to include them in my count. Three out of three plus a skylark. Hartlip could be treated as being on a par with Urchfont.

Among the archives of Watts the Rainham Chemist, whose name can still be read above the boarded-up shop in Rainham High Street, are several books dating back to the mid-nineteenth century. Two contain the notes made by different members of the family as they studied for their pharmacy qualifications. These books both begin with lectures on botany and elementary chemistry, the first page in one case being headed 'Special Short Notes on Pharmacy. Minor Lecture No. 1'. The lectures, ending with No. 59, are recorded in a soft-back school notebook, but the student's attention was not

always wholly engaged. Beneath the page entitled 'Lecture 7', on practical dispensing, is written 'A lecture far too long, of facts (too) well-known to write'. And inside the back cover the owner has practised the signature 'R. Watts' many times. A second, hardback, notebook which is un-named has similar notes on the same course of lectures, dated 1885, and also includes 'Practical Notes on Photography'.

Robert Watts was the nephew of Henry Watts, a widower, who had been in business as Chemist and Druggist in Chatham High Street from the midnineteenth century. In 1881 Henry had two apprentices, Robert, aged 17, and Frank Dixon, who was 16. Robert stayed with his uncle at the shop near the bottom of Hamond Hill for at least ten years, but by 1899 he had taken over the premises of George Andrew, Chemist and Druggist. They were at No. 126 High Street, Rainham, next to the 'Waterman's Arms', and opposite Ivy Street. For many years a gas lamp standard, with 'Watts Chemist' painted on the glass enclosing the light, stood outside. During the early part of the twentieth century Watts also acted as an insurance agent. The heading of a partly-used duplicate book makes it clear that he was now fully qualified: 'Robert Watts, Dispensing Chemist (by examination)'.

Of more general interest are two volumes in which have been collected recipes for the wide variety of products sold by a Victorian chemist - not just medicines, but ink, fly glue, hair pomades and tonics. ginger beer and lemonade, label varnish, curry powder, Nubian blacking and lavender water. Many of these have been cut from papers and stuck in, others are hand-written. Some have been crossed through, perhaps because a more effective 'chilblain specific' or 'remedy for warts' has emerged. Medicines for sick dogs, sheep, cows and horses play a significant part.

The earliest note dates from 1842, but other hands have continued the collection beyond 1880. This 'Cure for the Ague' is never known to fail if taken regularly:

Treacle sufficient to form an electuary. This was to be taken every four hours 'when the fit is off'. The compiler remarks that for 'weakly women and children' the snake root should be omitted.

Also preserved is a counter prescription book. which opens in August 1900, from the Rainham shop. At the front is an index of account customers, with details of the medicines which were frequently required by them. Then begins the record of what was dispensed each day, occasionally with marginal notes - 'heart shaky'; 'tuberculous glands'; 'slight sunstroke'. By 1912 prices are sometimes added: 1/was standard. After this date the book has been used only intermittently; in 1919, in 1922 for a while, then in 1936. About ten prescriptions were dispensed daily, each transaction carefully numbered.

After the 1950s fewer and fewer medicines were mixed on the premises, and the prescriptions read 'tabs' of branded products, such as 'Dequadin loz(enges)'. From 1960 the inclusion of the name of the doctor becomes more frequent, and when the record ends in the early seventies, by which time perhaps 50% of all prescriptions are for 'the pill', it is

According to a street directory of 1954/5 there were by then two other Chemists in Rainham, Fenwick's at 31 London Road and Hickmott's at 85 London Road, while Watts remained at the original site. The section of the A2 known as London Road at that time extended as far as 'The Cricketers'. Watts the Chemist finally closed about twenty years ago, as the trading centre of Rainham moved west and other pharmacies, closer to doctors' surgeries, flourished.
