



RAINHAM SCHOOL FOR BOYS Dear Editor.

Reference the letter from John K. Austin and the teachers at the Rainham Senior School for Boys in your August issue, I was a pupil there in wartime, 1940 to 1943, when it was on a war footing.

Teachers then were, starting with Mr Wilbraham, past retiring age, then Mr Bowden, who we also had specially for music practise i.e. singing, 'Where Ere You Walk' etc. Next was Mr Taylor, who early on was called up into the RAF. Then Mr Sargeant for general lessons; how often he told us about his experiences as a First World War prisoner of war. Occasionally Mrs Drake, youngish and 'admired' by the boys, if another teacher was away. The final class was that of Mr Gleadle, who seemed to have some RAF service role, possibly with AT Cadets as he sometimes arrived in RAF uniform.

Woodwork and metalwork, such as it was due to shortage of materials, was taught by Mr Sneath, who we nicknamed for some mysterious reason Mr Slice. The ARP had part of the school and most windows and doorways were sandbagged. Headmaster was fearsome Mr Smith.

My piece of the garden 'for the war effort' was at the far end opposite the girls' toilets and entrance to the playing field. It only seemed to grow beetroots and brussels sprouts. As the girls frequently ran onto the playing field for games wearing only white vest and navy blue bloomers, the garden did not get a lot of attention by the boys at that end. When I left school in 1943 every boy in my class had a job to go to. I became an apprentice printers typesetter at Mr Godfreys in the High Street.

### Nature Notes

#### NATURE NOTES FOR OCTOBER

Of the dozen or more villages on the Hoo Peninsula. St Mary's Hoo is my favourite. From a distance, the setting of the church, among a clump of trees and roof tops, looks more Norfolk than Kent. Still surrounded by gravestones, the church is now a private house. The school, also now a home, displays a plaque recording its erection in 1868. The plaque includes the names of Henry Pye and the Rev. Robert Gascoyne Burt. Pye was a progressive farmer who had great influence on farming techniques in North Kent. Burt had the living at St Mary's for 59 years during which, it is said, he never wrote a sermon and very rarely gave one.

In early October I revisited the village. The surrounding fields had been harvested and either harrowed or ploughed. The yards of St Mary's Hall and Ross farms held stocks of bales of hav and straw ready for the over-wintering of cattle still feeding on the marshes. Just outside the village I sat down on the edge of the high ground and took in the view. Ahead

Most of the marshes consist of grazing land which is divided into fields by drainage dykes. The fields are important for breeding birds such as redshank. lapwing and snipe and for the relatively rare brown hare. They are dominated by common grasses such as bents, fescues and foxtails. By October the grasses were in seed and the fields themselves had a dry. yellow appearance. The dykes, with their emergent vegetation, support large numbers of waterfowl, the water vole (which is one of Britain's most threatened mammals) and many species of dragonfly and damselfly.

During the month of October birds such as widgeon, pintail and brent geese come back to the Thames Estuary for the winter whilst, on the higher ground, visiting redwings and fieldfares join the resident thrushes in feeding on the autumn berries.

To my left I could see the edge of Northwood Hill, an RSPB bird reserve. Here breed rooks, nightingales and the largest colony of herons in the country. I wondered how many more seasons were destined to

pass before the wood was felled, for herons and low flying airliners do not mix happily together.

As I sat looking down on a possible site of London's fourth airport, I wondered what Henry Pye and Robert Gascoyne Burt would have thought of the Government's proposals. The Rev. Burt seemed to have liked to lead a quiet life and would not have welcomed thousands more souls to his parish. If he is stirring in his grave I would have to tell him that the omens are not good. Not so long ago the Government gave approval to the Medway Ports Authority to create a car import terminal on The Lappel, an extensive area of riverside mud at Sheerness which supported thousands of waders. The new terminal gives welcomed employment to local people. But it also supports the jobs of thousands of car workers in the Far East and those who ferry the cars to Sheerness.

The same scenario may well repeat itself with any airport on the Hoo marshes. Their international importance for bird life may not save them. The peninsula would be covered in concrete, tarmac and brick. The airport would bring employment to the people of the Medway towns but it is likely that far of me were the marshes, the River Thames and Essex. more jobs would be created in the tourist industries in Florida, Spain, Greece and the rest.

> What would Henry Pye have made of all this? He was the man who put right years of neglect of the drainage channels of the marshes. Prior to his work the marshes would have been badly waterlogged good for wildfowl and wildfowlers but not conducive to efficient farming. He was one of the first farmers in Kent to use Aveling and Porter steam engines complete with ploughing equipment and threshing tackle. Finally, he was instrumental in bringing the railway to the Hundred of Hoo so as to better enable farmers to get their produce to market.

#### THE CHANGING FACE OF RAINHAM

It was encouraging to see so many residents at Joe Ennis's slide show depicting 'Old Rainham' and I

was pleased to answer questions afterwards. I wonder if the obvious new interest in the history of our locality is being adequately catered for by present organisations. Many properties have been lost in the High Street and many more are likely to be fundamentally changed or demolished as residential development replaces business premises so I checked with the directory to compare the area depicted in most of the slides around the turn of last century.

The population of Rainham in 1901 was 3,693 (probably around 40,000 for the same area now), employment was mainly in agriculture and brick or cement making, farming was in the doldrums and many residents were very poor as they were not paid for production lost due to inclement weather and most families had many more children than now. It was a make and mend society and few would travel outside of the village for purchases so Rainham shops would have provided every need and there was plenty of competition.

The High Street, going east, started at the Cricketers on one side and The White Horse opposite, all properties to the west were then in London Road and, like many of our roads at that time, neither were numbered so postmen had to quickly learn where everyone lived. The advertisements in Kelly's Directory of 1908 give, perhaps, the best explanation of life just nine years before I was born and emphasise the origin of two of the most influential inventions of our time. That for The White Horse quotes telephone number 10 and shows pictures of both a horse drawn charabanc for outings and a brake to transport residents or to collect commercial travellers from the station by appointment. It obviously took advantage of the new motorised travel as in addition to providing 'Livery and Bait Stabling' it also had a 'Motor Garage and Pit'. The proprietor was Mr Charles Adie whose son Leigh succeeded him and I believe that grandson Ron continued later. Prior to the Adie's Mr Sayer was 'mine host' and it was he who, it is said, planted a chestnut tree in front of the Church to commemorate the birth of each of his children.

The Cricketers had no advert in Kelly's but that in The History of Rainham (Kent) by Edwin Harris published in 1917 was equally interesting. The

proprietor Mr C.W. Shaw had taken over from Mr Harry Charles Taylor and advertised that it was 'Home from Home' and 'the place to spend a pleasant holiday'. This hostelry also had 'Stabling and a Motor Garage'.

Mr Arthur Tucker, two doors down from Pudding Lane, was Watchmaker Jeweller and Optician and he advertised 'table and pocket cutlery', with 'private room specially fitted out with the latest appliances for sight testing'. Freddie Cooper To be continued
