# Nature Notes

# NATURE NOTES FOR JANUARY AND FEBRUARY

Seasalter is one of those places that I return to time and time again. It is a place of mud flats, shingle beach, sea wall, grazing marshes and wide open sky. Summer memories are of sailing dinghies, picnics on the shingle, ice cream at Walden's shop, the cries of redshanks and oyster catchers, blue skies and yellow horned poppies. Winter memories are of the occasional dog walker, locked-up beach huts, waders in spectacular massed flight, skeins of brent geese and cold easterly winds.

Seasalter is approached through the villages of Goodnestone and Graveney. The road is narrow, twisting and undulating. During winter the hop fields adjoining the villages are of course bare, as are the cherry trees under which sheep graze. After Denley Hill Farm the Graveney Marshes and the distant sea wall come into view. On the landward side of the wall are the old coastguard cottages and one or two other isolated buildings.

My last visit was on a cold January day. In between keeping my eyes on the road ahead and my rear view mirror, I snatched glances either side of the car. On the grazing marshes to my right were hundreds of sheep. On my left flocks of lapwing and golden plovers foraged in a wheat field. As always, it was with a sense of anticipation that I approached the sea wall, since whether the tide is in or out determines the species and amount of birds that I will see.

I parked my car near the Sportsman Inn and climbed the embankment. The tide was in. There would not be many birds about. A small flock of brent geese were riding up and down in the choppy sea, waiting for the tide to go out when they could feed on eel grass. In addition, a few turnstones were running up and down the tide line looking for sand hoppers and small molluscs among the seaweed and flotsam. Turnstones are relatively tame and can often be seen in the vicinity of the Old Neptune pub at Whitstable and at Whitstable Harbour where they rummage among cockle shells that have just been

processed and discarded.

I walked in a westerly direction along the sea wall. Clumps of sea beet were visible on the shingle below me. Stretches of lichen and stonecrop were also in evidence. I disturbed small parties of skylarks and rock pipits feeding on the seeds of long-dead summer flowers.

Between the wall and the fields are wide drainage ditches in which common reed was growing. In the summer the reed beds are the breeding grounds of sedge and reed warblers and reed buntings. In the winter they are relatively lifeless but I did see, in the dykes, a little egret, a little grebe and a stonechat. The little egret is a somewhat exotic newcomer to this country, having spread from southern Europe. It has conspicuous white plumage.

The fields of the Cleve Marshes are currently arable, being used for the growing of winter wheat and forage beef. In one of the large fields I counted 70 mute swans. These birds often congregate on estuaries in the winter where they can make serious inroads into the limited stocks of eel grass. Here on the Cleve Marshes they seem to be making serious inroads into some poor farmer's winter wheat.

Almost opposite the isolated church of Harty on the Isle of Sheppey I came to Castle Coot, an area of salt marsh within a semicircle of shingle. During the summer ringed plovers and little terns nest on the shingle and Kent Wildlife Trust discourages people from straying onto the area. Even so, nesting birds suffer loss of eggs and young to foxes, gulls and carrion crows. During my visit the salt marsh, which is covered mainly with sea purslane, was host to hundreds of feeding redshank and flocks of dunlin were resting on the shingle banks.

By the time that I arrived back at the Sportsman Inn the tide was going out. Birds were flying in from all directions to take advantage of the newly-uncovered sea shore. There were oyster catcher, ringed plover, knot, dunlin, sanderling and curlew. I was only a few yards from them but as long as I remained on the landward side of the sea wall they were unconcerned about my presence. The need to eat as much as possible during the short days of winter no doubt overcame any nervousness they might have had.

# THE SAGA OF 'THE CRICKETERS' CAR PARK

Five years ago, just prior to 1st April 1998, Gillingham joined Rochester upon Medway to form the new Unitary Authority called Medway. Both Councils endeavoured to ensure that their accumulated balances were allocated to projects within their respective Boroughs which is why £300,000 was set aside to complete the extension to the car park behind the Cricketers PH which had been accepted as a provision having additional urgency when the new Millennium Centre was proposed. Successive Vicars had pressed for an extension as those attending weddings and funerals were often inconvenienced and half of the lower car park was lost on market days.

The new Council did not give high priority to such a venture and to be fair there were a number of unexpected legal problems (there always are) and the endeavours of Canon Alan Vousden were of no avail until the beginning of January when part of the area was cleared. Optimistic hopes were quickly thwarted when before the month was out work ceased and the area was fenced off.

Having read of the financial problems of our 'Municipal Masters' I sensed that this might be associated with the termination of activity, fears which were confirmed when I managed to contact an officer who knew where the site was. He explained that much of the money originally allocated (£300,000) had been spent on the preliminary legal negotiations and that further progress would probably have to wait until the new financial year (1st April).

Having ascertained the background I contacted Cllr Rodney Chambers as Leader of Medway Council who was born and bred at Natal Farm now part of Upchurch Golf Course so obviously knows the area well. He explained the problems which, as a previous Chairman of Finance, I could appreciate but promised to see if it is possible to transfer funds from other Capital projects which could not start before the end


