Altogether a very satisfactory achievement. Unfortunately, we returned

to some sadder news, my aunt, Miss F.A. (Anne) Cheeseman, MBE, died, aged 92, in the middle of March. Many Rainham people of my generation will remember her as the superintendent of St Margaret's Sunday School where she encouraged us to collect ship halfpennies and in other fund raising activities to support the British & Foreign Bible Society. Our group had a particular interest in supplying Bibles to Kenya and we were called 'The Good News Ship Swahili'. For many years St Margaret's won the annual national competition as top fund raisers and we proudly brought home the flag ship from the meeting in London to display in the window of the children's corner in church. After moving to Newington and then retiring Miss Cheeseman left Rainham Sunday School but until quite recently continued to teach children at Newington.

It is wonderful to come home and find all the spring flowers making such a magnificent show. Spring certainly seems to be well on the way so do have a good month, enjoy the good weather and we will see you again in May.



SSAFA Forces Help Kent Branch, a charity which helps serving and ex-Service men, women and their families, will provide support to families left behind during the present crisis in the Gulf. It will also look after dependants of TA soldiers and other reservists recently called up for service.

Nearly all the troops normally stationed in Kent have been deployed to the Gulf for OP TELIC. Many families will have been left behind to cope without spouses, fathers or mothers. Most will do so well but some may need an occasional helping hand or support and companionship.

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR MARCH

I wandered lonely as a cloud That floats on high o'er vales and hills. When all at once I saw a crowd.

Like most National Trust properties, Rudyard Kipling's former home in Sussex, Bateman's, opens from the end of March. But at weekends in March the grounds were open for the benefit of those who wanted to see the earliest of the Spring flowers.

Bateman's lies in the Sussex High Weald which consists of numerous steep valleys and small hills. The hills are generally covered in woodland made up of coppiced hornbeam and sweet chestnut inter planted with standard oaks. Between the woods are a patchwork of small fields.

The house, which overlooks the River Dudwell, a tributary of the River Rother, is approached through the village of Burwash. It nestles among fields bounded by tidy hawthorn hedges and massive oak trees. Sheep in the fields complete a typical Sussex

There are three formal gardens at Bateman's, two of which are walled and the largest of which is surrounded by yew hedges. It still being Winter at the time of our visit, most of the plants were dormant but there were clumps of crocuses, daffodils, snowdrops, cillas and hellebores. A quince tree trained against a wall was in bloom. Many of the fruit and other trees in the formal gardens were festooned with lichens which are more noticeable when the trees are bare of leaves. A robin sang from the top of a garden wall and the two blue tits kept in touch with each other as they searched for insects in an overhanging oak tree.

In the wild flower garden beside the River Dudwell were groups of celandines, primroses, snowdrops and daffodils. It is not clear whether Kipling or any of his predecessors had had a hand in introducing any of these species to the wild garden. Sufficient to say that snowdrops were probably brought into Britain from central Europe in medieval times and planted in the grounds of churches and monasteries. They would have been introduced for religious reasons, the pure

white blooms of the flower having long been used by the Roman Catholic church in the celebration of Candlemas on 2nd February. It is, however, possible that some colonies of snowdrops in this country are of native origin, particularly those in south west England and along the Welsh border. There is always a good display of snowdrops in Leeds churchyard A host of golden daffodils. (William Wordsworth) near Maidstone.

According to Richard Mabey, writing in his book 'Flora Britannica', the wild daffodil continued to be one of the most widespread and common Spring flowers in this country until the middle of the nineteenth century. Then, across much of central and eastern England in particular, it seemed to dip into a rapid and mysterious decline. By the 1930s thousands of Londoners were prepared to make a round trip of over 200 miles to Ledbury and the surrounding area, by means of special trains run by the Great Western Railway, to see and pick wild daffodils. The flowers were also picked by local people and dispatched to various parts of the country, especially just prior to Mothering Sunday. Wild daffodils remained one of the seasonal crops of gypsies, particularly in the West Country, up to the mid 1980s.

Today the wild daffodil, once widespread and common, occurs only in certain widely separated parts of the country, such as Devon, the Black Mountains of Wales, the Lake District and the Sussex Weald. Here in Kent there is a colony at Lesnes Abbey, near Erith.

After a visit to the water mill on the River Dudwell, which once again grinds wheat into flour, we headed for the Mulberry Tea Room for our first National Trust tea of the season. On the counter were the labels 'Date and Walnut', 'Fruit Cake', 'Chocolate Sponge', 'Sussex Black' and 'Flapjack'. For me, they are as much a sign of the end of Winter as snowdrops and daffodils.

LAST PRIZE FIGHT TOOK PLACE HERE

In the years which immediately preceded the last war, I was local correspondent for the 'Kent Messenger' here in Rainham and in those days local news was considered more important than now, although in retrospect I believe that I was poorly paid at a penny

per line (old money). The papers worked on the principle that if a person's name was mentioned they had a reader, and if they printed a photograph that readership would last a lifetime. I could regularly rely on the reports of soccer and cricket matches, whist drives, deaths and marriages to fill a fairly long column, including a list of presents if either party of the marriage was well known. I did not like calling upon very close relatives of deceased residents, which is how I developed a knowledge of many local relationships as most of the older Rainham families were then, and still are, inter-related.

Although Rainham was one of the largest villages in Kent, its population was closely knit and interdependent and popular personalities tended to flourish far more than now - one such resident was Mr Henry George Samson known as 'the grand old man of Rainham' who eventually died in 1948 aged 95. He looked the part, being of stocky build with a short white beard and lived in a thatched cottage next to the congregational chapel in Meres Court Road (1924 map) although we still called it Chapel Lane. Incidentally I have a copy of the report of his death and the printed photograph at the time if any of his relatives would be interested. He was always good for drawn vehicles to see the last prize fight to be held in a story, particularly when I took him an ounce of tobacco and now, in my old age, I understand what he meant when he said 'to be able to enjoy your former life, in memory, is to live it twice over'.

At that time Mr Samson was one of the very few persons left who participated in the last bare-knuckle prize fight to be held in England when it was already illegal. Apparently, Mr John and Mr Fred Scott arranged a £400 a side contest between Jimmy Roberts and Alec Hayes to take place at Farthing Corner at 4.00am on a morning in May 1885. Mr Samson was used to providing all the furniture for Spaces on Austrian Tyrol Holiday 2003 the various fetes and sporting events which took place in Rainham at that time, and he was entrusted with the task of providing and making the stalls, tables and benches for the expected spectators who came mainly from London to Chatham on the midnight train. They then completed the journey on horse drawn vehicles, which had been secretly arranged for the occasion. These visitors told those who were inquisitive that they were attending a ball, which must have raised

The fight lasted nearly two hours ending at ten minutes to six when Hayes, the better fighter. unfortunately damaged his fist on a ring post when he missed Roberts. A collection for the loser raised £100 and Mr Samson took him home and cared for him on the following day.

The village constable had become suspicious with the amount of unusual traffic movements and arrived at the scene just before the event was to commence. whereupon he was well entertained to a late supper or an early breakfast with limitless supplies of drink until after the fight. Some of those who attended were later charged at the Court of Sessions, which presumably would have been held at Sittingbourne. where all were found 'not guilty'. This was hardly surprising as it was said that the Chairman had also attended the event.

I wonder how many of those who live nearby realise that they may be walking over the very spot where this historic sporting event was held, and perhaps those who regularly travel to and from London via the service area may reflect upon those who travelled overnight by mail train and horse

In the newspaper reports at the time, the location is mentioned as Fardon's Corner and I wonder if this was a mistake because I haven't seen the name on any plan or map. I should be glad to learn if any reader has information on this point.
