I was a pupil at the school until July 1945 and these murals were painted whilst I was there. I understood the artists, a boy and two girls, were past pupils who had gone to Art College on leaving Orchard Street.

The room was used for Art Classes and the teacher at that time was Miss Doris Saywell.

I vaguely remember one of the other murals depicted the hop fields, but I cannot remember if they were completed by the time I left the school. Perhaps they were done to celebrate the end of the war.

RAINHAM SCHOOL FOR GIRLS Dear Editor,

Thank you for including in the August Action Forum the most interesting article about the opening of Rainham School for Girls (boys were the other side!) in 1932 – what a marvellous opportunity in education after 11 years of age the children from Upchurch, Lower Halstow, Hartlip, Bredhurst, Hempstead, Solomon Road and Rainham Church of England Schools had – they came from excellent village schools with dedicated teachers but the children moved forward when Orchard Street School opened.

I think that you may be interested in this photograph of the opening of the school. My father, Francis J.R. Mountain (he was the newly appointed Town Clerk and Clerk of the Education Committee for Gillingham) led the proceedings accompanied by the Mayor, Aldermen, Managers and the Heads of the Schools.

At about the same time Woodlands Road School was opened by the Town Clerk and Councillors.

The Borough of Gillingham needed new Municipal Buildings and in 1933 the new Council Offices were opened by the Town Clerk and Councillors when they moved from the old Council Offices in Gardiner Street, Gillingham (now the Adult Education Centre) to the modern Municipal Buildings by Gillingham Park.

I believe that Rainham was taken from Milton and Swale just before my family moved from Surrey to Rainham in about 1929/30 (not quite sure when) — what a pity!!! — we might still have had the beautiful

village Rainham used to be – certainly some of the old buildings would have been preserved – but Rainham would not have had main drainage!!

On retirement my father was the first lawyer to set up in private practice in Rainham.



THE REGENERATION OF RAINHAM, KENT Dear Editor.

Much has been said, and written, about the overgrown and neglected vacant land immediately to the north of our lovely parish church, 'St Margaret of Antioch', Rainham, Kent.

Plans and schemes abound, the latest seeming to be for a Medical Centre! I personally consider a medical centre on this particular prime site to be totally unnecessary. (Why not enlarge and improve the existing 'Clinic' located in Holding Street?)

I seems to me that there are plenty of doctors surgeries in Rainham's residential areas already.

May I suggest that the citizens of Rainham give very careful thought to the use of this site, almost certainly the ancient location of the original village, and bear in mind that whatever is built there probably an eyesore - will endure for at least 100 years.

The availability of this area is a once only, golden opportunity for Medway Council to purchase the land and create a small town square here (paved over, and possibly with a few ornamental trees) for the benefit and pleasure of all the people of Rainham, in perpetuity.

New shops and other buildings could be built around the perimeter, facing into the square.

This would give the town of Rainham a centre of focus and could be the permanent location for the market on market days, used for public meetings, concerts, carnivals and fetes, and the like.

I seems to me that any small village in France, Germany, or Italy, would have done this generations

How about calling it 'St Margaret's Square' or 'Antioch Square'?

August is a comparatively uneventful month in the countryside. The birds will have generally stopped singing and most species of wild flowers will have already bloomed and faded. The countryside marks time in the heat of summer prior to the changes brought about by the colder temperatures of autumn.

The seaside in August can be as quiet as the countryside generally, with perhaps just the sight and sound of the occasional gull. In order to find out what may be seen and heard at the height of summer, at the English seaside, I recently spent an afternoon at Tankerton.

Tankerton lies to the east of Whitstable. Its development began in Edwardian times and this is reflected in the design of many of its buildings. From a natural history point of view, the interest of the place lies mainly in the grass covered slopes which overlook the shingle beach and Tankerton Bay.

Some areas of grass on the slopes are closely cut by the council and others have had beach huts built upon them. But most of the slopes remain covered in rough grass and isolated bushes. The latter include hawthorn, blackthorn, wild privet and bramble. These bushes have been bent and shaped by harsh north easterly winds.

Growing among the rough grass is hog's fennel or sulphur weed which is a tall perennial plant of the carrot family. Its tiny yellow flowers, in umbrella-like heads, are open from July until September. The plant is found in few other places in Britain and Tankerton slopes have accordingly been granted the status of a Site of Special Scientific Interest. Anyone who goes to Tankerton to see this rare plant should bear in mind that it has long and narrow leaves and should not be confused with the many specimens of alexanders, another umbellifer, which also grows on the slopes and which has leaves with three lobes.

Meadow pipits nest in the grassy tussocks of Tankerton slopes although, by August, their young will have fledged. They are brownish birds with black streaks on their bodies and can sometimes be seen rising into the air above the slopes and then 'parachuting' back down into the grass.

The shingle beach at Tankerton is relatively lifeless, the most prominent plant being sea beet. It is a close relative of certain cultivated beets and, according to Richard Mabey, author of 'Food for Free', has leaves which are tangy and can be cooked as spinach.

Out at sea the only birds likely to be seen in August are black headed and herring gulls, both species accompanied by this year's juveniles and immature birds from previous years. The juveniles have an overall streaky brown plumage whilst the immature birds have varying amounts of brown feathers depending upon their ages. The herring gull is larger than the black-headed and is more raucous and aggressive. Both species can be found feeding at refuse tips and on farmland, particularly at ploughing time. In Tankerton Bay they will be searching for crabs, shrimps, fish and other sea creatures.

I have to say that there is not a lot to see at Tankerton in August, unless you are a botanist keen to see the hog's fennel in bloom. But it is a pleasant place for a stroll long the sea front in one direction and along the top of the slope in the other. For those who prefer to just sit and watch the world go by there is a nice spot on the top of the slopes overlooking 'The Street' which is a natural strip of shingle visible at low tide. It marks the eastern boundary of Whitstable oyster grounds.

The Tower Tea Gardens can be found at the Whitstable end of the slopes and the Sea View Café at the other, just above the Tankerton Bay Sailing Club.




