LOWER RAINHAM Dear Editor,

I was interested to see Stan Randall's articles in back issues of Action Forum showed to me by a relative when we visited London for Christmas this year. My mother was born in Islington, London, but through family circumstances eventually came to live (at the age of 6 or 7 years old in 1911/1912) with William and Emily Randall who became her foster parents. She grew up living at Rose Cottage on the

corner of Sharps Green Lane and Lower Rainham Road. Her step-sister was Gertrude, who later lived in a bungalow, Hazeldene, on Lower Rainham Road opposite Bay Tree Villa, the home of Uncle Edmund Randall who lived there with his spinster daughters Myra and Doris. I spent a lot of my youth at Rose Cottage and helping my grandparents with their fruit farming at Mariners and the Apple Orchard on the corner of Twydall Lane opposite Rose Cottage.

Editorial

I have just realised that this is the four hundredth edition of Action Forum having been started by Hamish Mackay Miller in March 1969. The original idea was to publicise the work of the Rainham Help the Needy Committee. This was a time when printing was undergoing a major revolution and becoming a much quicker and cheaper process. Hamish soon realised that all the effort that was going into collecting advertising, producing and distributing a one-off leaflet could quite easily be harnessed to produce a regular monthly free newsletter - he claims boundaries prompted me to look again at our the original 'free newspaper' so now you know who to blame! The whole area was expanding rapidly with the much discussed western boundary, I ended up new homes being occupied every week. Action Forum seemed an excellent way to welcome newcomers to the area and inform them of local services and activities. The original print run of 10,000 doubled by 1989 to the 20,000 we now distribute each month. The revenue received from advertising pays for the typesetting, paper and printing and for a short while the distribution. This experiment was not entirely satisfactory, however, volunteer distributors, donating the money saved to various charities. The Kajiado District Development Trust, a charity funding water, education and health projects in Kenya, St Margaret's Church, Rainham and St Matthew's Church, Wigmore, have been the principal beneficiaries. The sum donated now exceeds £6,500. Our aim remains the same - to keep residents informed about local matters. To achieve this, of course, we rely on you to feed us the copy. We are not journalists - we do not go out looking for news or writing stories. (Incidentally, at this point may I just mention that we do not print articles that are submitted anonymously, contact details can be withheld from publication, if requested, but we need to know the origin of all material.) We hope to encourage a good community feeling and this is helped enormously by readers' reminiscences of the past. Thank you, everyone who has helped Action Forum in any way during the past 36 years and particularly to Christine Smith who has been compiling our diary since March 1972, issue number 33. Here's to the next 400 editions.

I was interested in a snippet of information given

to me by Freddie Cooper in response to the 'Tree Sales' items we have been including. Apparently the fruit growers of Rainham and Newington had to get their crops to Rainham Station (then called Rainham & Newington) for the 4.00pm train each day in order to reach Newcastle market the next morning. Newcastle often achieved a better price than Covent Garden so was obviously preferred. In the days of horse and cart transport this was difficult for many growers to the east of Rainham and the farmers therefore paid for a station to be built at Newington. Fruit must have been a very valuable crop to be worth such expense.

The sun is shining, the bluebells are magnificent, this is a fantastic time of year so do get outside and enjoy the wonderful Spring days and have a good month until we see you again in June.

The boundary does indeed include Levan Strice Woods, and the nearest boundary stone lay just to the north of Grain Road.

Correspondence

I remember many characters, in particular Alan Fry, the Cuckoo family and many people who lived at Alfred's Place and St John's Place, Charley Finey and his son Maurice and several of the Harrison family who were big farmers in the area.

My grandfather, William Randall, died in November 1949 - he was diabetic which caused him to go blind in his later years. One winter's morning probably in 1947 which was a very hard winter with prolonged heavy snow, I recall - I was taking my grandfather for a walk at Sharps Green when we came across an elderly man lying in the snow clutching a 12-bore shotgun. Although I had never seen a dead person before, I was quite sure that the man was no longer alive. He appeared to have fallen on his shotgun because blood from a cut or wound on his face was still seeping into the snow. There was no one else around and I was quite frightened. I told my grandfather about the man and he asked me to describe the man to him, which I did as best I could. Immediately, my grandfather said he thought the man was 'old Charlie Edwards'. Grandfather said he would wait with the body while I ran up the lane to Lower Rainham to get help. A man on a bicycle came along and he eventually managed to get the police who must have contacted a doctor. It turned out that the man was Charlie Edwards but by the time the doctor came, I had walked my grandfather back to his home at Rose Cottage. I was about 11 years old at the time, I think, and nearly 60 years later I can picture that sad scene as if it had happened yesterday.

Even after 40 years living in Asia I still have a keen interest and fondness for Lower Rainham and I love revisiting Sharps Green, Twydall and Eastcourt, Twydall Primary School and Gillingham Grammar



GENERAL ELECTION

From the Parish Magazine of St Margaret's Church, Rainham, March 1874.

'As a matter of local history, and without entering into any political discussion as to the merits or demerits of the rival candidates, it may be well to put on record that Rainham was a polling place for the first time at the General Election of 1874. The poll was taken at the Infant School on Wednesday, February 11th. There were about 250 voters on the register, in the division, of whom 192 voted - the great majority, probably in favour of Sir Henry Tufton, whose local influence is so considerable. The Liberal head-quarters were at the White Horse, the Conservatives at the Lion.'

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR APRIL

'Oh, to be in England Now that April's there.'

1812-1889.

The grounds of Leeds Castle, near Maidstone, contain a wide variety of habitats - woods, river, lakes, parkland and gardens. They are therefore a good place at which to witness the changes in the seasons. In early April my wife and I visited the grounds of the castle in search of the signs of Spring.

As we approached the car park of the castle grounds we could see a large flock of jackdaws twisting and turning in the air above some ancient oak and sweet chestnut trees. Jackdaws are superb flyers and can often be seen playing spectacular aerial games over buildings, woods or cliffs, especially when air currents can be exploited.

Jackdaws are social birds that roost, nest and feed as part of a group. At places like Leeds Castle, where they get used to people, they can be quite tame, even cocky. The Leeds jackdaws were beginning to nest, at the time of our visit, in trees on the estate and in the walls of the castle. We were told by one of the stewards that grey squirrels attempting to take the eggs or young of jackdaws nesting in the old trees are quickly seen off by the parents and any other birds of the group that are attracted to the inevitable commotion.

Banks of white and light blue anemones were in bloom as we walked through the Wood Garden and alongside the little River Len. These were clearly a garden variety but wild wood anemones were also flowering, as were lesser celandines, primroses, king cups and milkmaids.

Swathes of daffodils could be seen throughout the grounds. There was an impressive display under a group of beech and horse chestnut trees just before we reached the gate house of the castle. The leaves of the horse chestnut trees had burst from their buds by early April.

About thirty mute swans could be seen at Leeds, either on the moat around the castle or on the Great

Water which feeds the moat. Since the 12th century all unmarked mute swans on open water have been owned by the Crown. In practice the Queen, as Seignor of the Swans, claims ownership only of those on certain parts of the Thames and its tributaries, where she shares ownership with two of the ancient 'Home-Thoughts, from Abroad' by Robert Browning, livery companies, the Vintners and the Dyers. The Abbotsbury Swannery in Dorset, the home of the largest colony of mute swans in the world, was granted a royal right to own swans in Tudor times.

The mute swan is Britain's largest native species of bird. Like the jackdaw, the mute swans at Leeds were beginning to nest at the time of our visit. Although the males in a colony coexist fairly happily in Winter. in the breeding season they can become quite aggressive towards each other. A skirmish is inevitable if a male swan swims determinedly in the direction of another male with its neck drawn back and its wings arched above its back.

There were a number of sand martins hawking for insects above the Great Water. The bird is among the earliest of the summer visitors to arrive in this country. It is smaller than the swallow and house martin and is weaker in flight. It typically feeds low over water with frequent tight twists and turns. The sand martin has earthy brown upper feathers with white under parts and nests colonially in holes in sand or gravel banks. The nearest colony to Leeds is probably in the sand pits at Ryarsh and those birds seen over the Great Water would be merely passing

We could hear the songs of a chaffinch and a missel thrush as we headed for the Culpepper Garden. It consists of flower beds on an informal pattern within low box hedges as borders. It is a very English garden. In bloom in early April were tulips, primulas, forget-me-nots and honesty, among other flowers. By contrast, the Lady Baillie Garden has an Italian atmosphere. The brick walls of the garden enclose sun traps in which certain Mediterranean and subtropical plants flourish. The flowers of mahonia. euphorbia and hellebore, among other plants, were out during our visit.

From the Lady Baillie Garden we had a view across the Great Water to the parkland beyond in which lambs were bleating for their mothers. One or

two swallows had joined the sand martins in their search for insects above the water. A bitterly cold wind was ruffling the surface of the lake and I wondered whether there were many insects about for the newly arrived summer migrants. The missel thrush, also known as the storm cock, was still singing in the face of the wind. A black shower cloud hung ominously above Maidstone. Oh, to be in England now that April's here!




