

Editorial

Our splendid photograph on the front cover shows the horse drawn Rainham fire pump travelling up the High Street just opposite where the footpath from Scott Avenue joins the main road today. The picture was found in the Maidstone Fire Museum; it had been donated by his family after the death of Mr Holloway a long time Rainham fireman. It illustrates very aptly Freddie Cooper's article, part of which we print this month, entitled 'Rainham A Century Ago'. Luckily Mrs Holloway had the foresight to find a safe place for this and other artefacts that they may be enjoyed by future generations. Today we are much more aware of the interest in bygone times and I hope no one nowadays would just throw out old pictures, newspaper cuttings and treasured memorabilia when clearing a home. Tragically this did happen forty or fifty years ago and so much of our heritage was lost. Rainham was a very different place in which to live at the date of this photograph. Few families had much money for luxuries but as everyone was in the same situation it did not matter so much. Rainham was a village with a real community spirit; the police knew everyone and were quite capable of a quick clip round the ear for any misguided youth that crossed their path. Instant justice or injustice, it kept crime to a minimum and few families would have thought it necessary to lock their door. Childhood ended very early. Unless they were fortunate enough to continue, education finished as soon as a certain standard was attained which could be as young as 11 years old and the youngsters then entered the world of work, boys to an apprenticeship in retail, agriculture or a trade and girls very often into service or shop work. It was expected that older children would help bring up their siblings and the school holidays were arranged around the farming year so that whole families could help with the fruit and hop harvest. Would we want to go back and live as these firemen did a hundred years ago? I think the answer is a resounding NO. Life may have been much simpler but it was hard and only the strong survived.

Back in our cosy twenty-first century we have much to offer you this month. All the usual Christmas events, church services, school fairs, carol concerts and pantomimes, plus, to get your New Year off to a good start a selection of organised walks. A good

brisk outing in the countryside is an excellent way to rid yourself of the festive excesses and winter blues. Do have a very happy Christmas and we will see you again in 2007.

As usual the next editions of Action Forum will be a combined January / February issue published on January 20th, followed by the second one of 2007 on March 3rd.

YESTERDAY'S MEDWAY

Local artist John Austin was born in Rainham, and after leaving Solomon Road School he went to the Boys' Secondary in Orchard Street - some of his memories of school have appeared in AF. In 1950 his artistic talents won him a scholarship to Medway College of Art at Rochester, only yards away from the river. Here as a student he explored the maze of alleys and yards close by, and sketched the passing river traffic and the work going on along the shores of the Medway. Since there were no grants for students then, he earned money during vacations working as Mate for Skipper Tom Dennis (of Station Road) on the motor barges Greta and Ironsides.

National Service in the RASC found John Austin in the Canal Zone, Jordan, Cyprus and Suez, but later he was to find fulfilment teaching art, at first at Southfields School in Gravesend and later at specialist art colleges including Medway College of Art and Design. His talents include calligraphy and model-making, but he is never happier than when out with pen and sketchbook.

The artist's love of boats of all kinds can be traced in the drawings in his book, 'Yesterday's Medway: from Rochester Bridge to Chatham Intra' just published by Rainmore Books, and on sale at Rainham Bookshop, price £5.99. His sketches were made in the early 1980s and the accompanying text tells the story of those businesses and buildings which formerly occupied the banks of the River Medway. Since it was written some twenty-five years ago, there have been further sweeping changes, and readers will be able to see just how much has disappeared in such a short time.

Nature Notes

In May 1732 William Hogarth and four friends had a five day holiday in North Kent, part of which they spent on the Hoo Peninsular. In November I retraced the steps that they took on that part of their journey.

After breakfast at the Crown Inn at Rochester (now demolished) the five men crossed the medieval bridge at Rochester into Strood and then climbed up the hill to Frindsbury Church. They walked down Parsonage Lane and headed for Upnor and Upnor Castle. At the time of my own visit the hedgerows of the lane were covered in travellers' joy or old man's beard. The verges were awash with the green leaves of wild angelica. In summer the pink and white flowers of the angelica blossom into the shape of umbrellas on the top of tall, purplish coloured stalks.

Towards the bottom of Parsonage Lane is Manor Farm which is surrounded by horse chestnut trees. In the grounds of the farm is a barn which is included in Pevsner's 'Buildings of England'. It is described as over 210 feet long, the longest timber aisled barn in England and built no later than the early 14th century. Throughout its life the barn had doubtless afforded shelter and nesting places for barn owls, wrens, robins, house sparrows, blackbirds and swallows. A year or two ago, after the barn had been standing for at least 700 years, an arsonist set fire to it. Today only about two thirds of the original barn remains intact. Hogarth and his chums probably never gave the barn a second thought. But the damage it has recently suffered makes for an absolute tragedy.

From Upnor Castle the five men ascended the escarpment overlooking the Medway and headed for Hoo St Werburg. The woods they went through consist today, as they also presumably did in the 18th century, of oak, sycamore and ash trees with an understorey of hawthorn and privet. From Hoo the party proceeded along the Stoke Road towards the village of Stoke. At the time of my own visit the crops in the fields between Hoo and Stoke were winter wheat, cabbage, broccoli, forage beet and onion. The crops in the area in the first half of the 18th century would most likely to have been wheat, barley, oats, peas, beans and other vegetables and

fruit. Much of this produce would have gone to London via The Thames, the oats and beans for the benefit of horses as well as humans.

Just beyond Stoke the arable landscape comes to an abrupt end. I stopped and climbed to the top of the sea wall. Inland of the wall was a landscape of sheep pasture, reed filled ditches, fresh water fleets and old counter walls. A flock of rooks was feeding among the sheep. Their old nests could be seen in a row of ancient willow trees. Lapwing and wigeon were feeding on the marsh and a flock of brent geese was resting on a stretch of fresh water.

To the seaward side of the wall were the Stoke Saltings. In Hogarth's day the saltings would have been very extensive and would have been grazed by sheep and even cattle. However, a combination of rising sea levels and the digging of mud in the manufacture of cement has reduced the saltings to hundreds of small and isolated islands which the sea is gradually eroding away. Below me, on the seaward side of the wall, I saw a stonechat and a small flock of meadow pipits. On the mud flats were some solitary redshanks and shelducks.

On the move once more, I passed the site of the now partly silted up Yantlet Creek, which once completely separated the Isle of Grain from the rest of the Hoo Peninsular. I drove through the site of the one-time oil refinery and into Grain High Street. Here Hogarth and his friends had a meal at the Chequers Inn. Gooddy Hubbard, the inn keeper, provided salt pork, black bread, butter, buns and good malt liquor.

I continued along the High Street, past the Victorian building of St James' C of E Primary School and the medieval St James' parish church. 'To the Sea Front' proclaimed a sign at the point where the High Street, by now reduced to a country lane. comes to an abrupt end at a grass covered slope. The sea front at Grain consists of nothing more than a concrete sea wall and walkway below which are banks of shingle, which undoubtedly suits those who simply want somewhere peaceful to walk their dog. There was nobody about but a couple of men digging for lugworms and a lone fisherman setting up his tackle in anticipation of catching, so he told me, some codling, bass or whiting.

From my view point on Grain sea front I could see, feeding on the waterline, flocks of knot, dunlin and

sanderling. Every now and again the flocks would rise together and circle around before settling down again. Presumably a raptor, perhaps a peregrine falcon, was disturbing them but I failed to discover the cause of their nervousness.

Hogarth's party sailed across to Sheerness from what is now called Cockleshell Beach. These days it is within the area of the MOD's Yantlet firing range and is out of bounds to the public. Perhaps Hogarth and his friends would have disturbed oyster catchers, ringed plovers and common terns nesting on Cockleshell Beach. Today, birds presumably nest in peace there.

It was time for a meal at the one-time Chequers Inn, now called the Hogarth Inn. Feeling extremely hungry I felt that I needed more than a ploughman's lunch and plumped for the 'Hogarth Platter'. This consisted of bacon, egg, sausages, tomatoes, mushrooms, chips and baked beans. Once Mrs Ennis has finished reading this article she will doubtless give me a good ticking off.

RAINHAM A CENTURY AGO - Part 1

I was recently studying the information upon Rainham in my extract from the 1908 issue of Kelly's Directory and I realised how very useful these books had been to me over the years and yet I know that many residents do not understand that copies for most without stopping. The Recreation Ground was years between 1890 and 1974 are available for inspection at the Gillingham or Chatham reference library. Bagshaws containing similar information go back to 1870 and ceased around 1900. Kelly's were issued annually for neighbouring areas such as Rochester, Chatham and Gillingham. It's worth remembering that information about Rainham will be in the Sittingbourne and Milton District issue before 1929. They show an alphabetical index of all residents and their addresses at the time and also a list of roads showing addresses and the location of residents so it's quite easy to find information about anyone living in the towns at the time. Data about institutions and activities make the issue a fund of local knowledge.

Rainham's population increased after the railway came in 1858, seven years before it had been 1,115 but by 1871 it had become 2,082 living in 425 houses. 50 years later it was only 4,335. In 1908 Berengrave Lane had five houses, Century Road only one (Walter Kimmins in Ethel Villa), Roberts Road (then Robert Street) had two residents - Frederick Charlesworth and John Puxtey. Even Maidstone Road

(then Bredhurst Lane) had no properties south of the area now marked by Herbert Road. None of the roads were numbered in sequence as there were so many empty plots so each block as built was called Terrace, Villas or Cottages and each house was numbered within that block.

Employment was largely agricultural, bricks and cement and the principal crops were fruit (mainly cherries), hops and wheat, there were a large number of market gardens. Lord Hothfield was Lord of the Manor. The Parish, previously known as Renham, has been inhabited from ancient times which has become evident from remains found near to the river and in Otterham Quay Lane. A recorded entry of property transferred in 841 AD was one of the earliest.

The Parish Council was the largest in this part of Kent, being entitled to 13 members who met on the first Wednesday of each month. The Chairman was Dr F.W.H. Penfold and committees comprised Lighting and Watching (including Fire Brigade), Footpaths, Recreation Ground, Library and Reading Room and Finance. Street Lighting was by gas and I remember Mr Holloway cycling round every evening and morning to turn on each light; he carried a stick with hook and was most expert in pulling down or pushing up the short arm just under the light almost presented by Lord Hothfield in 1887 to record the Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Victoria. In 1908 it had a prepared cycle track and cricket pitch with water laid on. It is of interest to note that it was open from 6am every day of the year. Rainham was very proud of its Fire Brigade formed in 1901, a motor engine was purchased in 1921 mainly from public subscription and the 22 volunteers were called out by maroon. The Parish Free Library and reading room was established at the turn of the century in the ground floor of the Temperance Hotel, Station Road. The lending Library was only open from 7 to 9pm on Mondays. Freddie Cooper To be continued.
