Coronation Day Party, June 23rd 1911



To celebrate the Coronation of King George V a party was held for the people of Rainham on the field behind the National School which stood on land now occupied by Rainham Shopping Centre at the top of Station Road. All the village attended, as can be seen, dressed in their Sunday best. Races were held, for entertainment and prizes, and a grand tea provided. At the end of the proceedings each child was presented with a commemorative Coronation Mug. RAINHAM RECREATION GROUND Dear Editor,

Recent articles in Action Forum have reminded me of the various events I have attended on Rainham Recreation Ground. The usual annual flower show, the Coop Fete, school sports were among the regulars but one or two were more special. One in particular was the Peace Party on July 19th 1919 where I won a threading the Needle Race. The most special of all I suppose was they Keg Meg Fete of I think 1948 or 49. The Kent Messenger of those days (and maybe still does) ran a children's club called the Keg Megs. Each week half a sheet of the Messenger was devoted to subjects of interest to children and where they could find their own names and particulars on their birthdays. Until the outbreak of World War II a Keg Meg Fete was held in a different venue each year. This one, probably the first after the war, was to be held in Rainham Rec. It was widely advertised and after years of austerity was eagerly awaited. Although as a family we did not take the KM so our children were not Keg Megs it was apparently a free for all and I promised I would take them to the fete. Unfortunately on the day it was quite impossible to keep my promise and two little girls were very disappointed. My husband worked until midday on Saturday with the prospect of a free afternoon, he came home to find a very sick wife and two unhappy little daughters. He very nobly agreed to take my place and take the girls to the fete. By the time he had eaten his dinner and tidied both himself and the children time was getting on and I feared they were missing most of the fun. My fears were realised as it so happened that they missed all of it. After the long walk to the village they found they could not proceed down Station Road as it was

blocked by the enormous queue of people trying to get WASTE PAPER COLLECTION to the Rec. USED POSTAGE STAMPS

Thank you to the readers who have supplied the following information.

Stamps should be cut/torn from the envelope with a good margin all round (at least half a centimetre), both British and Foreign stamps are acceptable - it is helpful to separate these and clearly mark packets 'foreign stamps only' as they are more valuable. For example, we raise £3.50 per kg for UK stamps and £12.50 per kg for foreign stamps. Please note though - if you're sending small amounts of stamps it will pay to save them up to 2 kilos or more before you send them otherwise it could cost more to post them than we can raise from them. Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR DECEMBER

In December 2010 I joined a group of friends on a train trip around Kent, hauled by two steam engines. Our compartment was bedecked with Christmas decorations and the ticket price included mulled wine, mince pies and coffee. Sitting next to the window gave me an opportunity to keep an eye on the countryside, which was deep in snow.

The train had set out from Victoria and it was not until we had passed Orpington that we left behind the conurbation of Greater London. The sight of beech trees was an indication that we were by then travelling through the North Downs. In due course we entered a long tunnel, emerging at the base of the escarpment of the Downs, on the edge of the valley of the River Darent. Sheep in the water meadows alongside the river were being fed on hay. Under a leaden sky that had blocked out the sun, the dark and forbidding image of the woods on the North Downs above Kemsing contrasted sharply with the white of the snow in the adjoining fields. We subsequently passed through Sevenoaks and the high land of the Ragstone Hills, before descending to the valley of the River Medway at Tonbridge.

The train then entered onto the 25 miles of straight and level track to Ashford, through the Vale of Kent, much of which is drained by the Medway and its main tributaries the Teise and the Beult. The steams and minor rivers that we passed by were lined with alder trees and the water in them was of a muddy brown colour. In the vicinity of Marden, which is at the heart of what remains of the mid Kent hop and fruit belt, I noticed a number of actively managed apple and pear orchards, but only one hop field. Through the carriage window I spotted pheasants, wood pigeons, rooks and carrion crows, some of which had been attracted to supplementary feed left out for horses, cattle or sheep, but no small birds. As for mammals, I had a brief glimpse of a small group of roe deer in a copse and saw a hare, having been disturbed by the train. bounding away from us. Additionally, whilst halted at a signal stop, I spotted the footprints of rabbits and a fox in the snow alongside the railway track.

Having steamed through Ashford, the train followed the course of the East Stour River, which flows below the escarpment of the North Downs. As we approached Folkestone we had our first view, on our right, of the cold, grey waters of the English Channel. Above us, on our left, stood the steep, bare hills of the Downs, looking impressive and quite Alpine under a deep cover of snow. The railway track leading to Dover crosses The Warren, being the remains of an ancient landslide of the chalk face. It is covered in scrub and serves as a landfall for thousands of birds that migrate to this country in the Spring. Emerging from a tunnel under Shakespeare Cliff, we had a view of the Western Docks, the dominating and impressive outline of Dover Castle and the White Cliffs of Dover. It was at this point in our journey that the two steam engines were really needed, as they hauled the thirteen coach train up a steep incline, from sea level to the plateau at the top of the White Cliffs.

Having passed Deal and Sandwich the track runs alongside the River Stour, on both sides of which are fresh water grazing marshes intersected by dykes. These marshes are the habitat of over-wintering waders such as golden plover and ducks such as widgeon and teal. In the air above the marshes was a flock of lapwings with their characteristically slow, floppy flight; they appeared to be heading towards Pegwell Bay. Salmon, trout and perch can be found in the River Stour itself and small numbers of otters have been attracted by these fish. Upon reaching Minster and the high ground of the Isle of Thanet the track follows the course of the Great Stour upstream to Canterbury.

On the approach to the city we passed through a stretch of the Stour Valley that comprises one of the few remaining freshwater wetland areas in Kent. Swans, geese and ducks can normally be seen there but, at the time of our visit, the lakes were frozen over and there was no sign of bird life. I did however see a mixed flock of redwings and fieldfares over the Canterbury suburbs, doubtless on the lookout for berries in parks and gardens.

As the train left Canterbury I had a view of the Great Harry Tower of the cathedral, with the water

meadows outside the city walls in the foreground. The train continued to hug the Great Stour as it cuts through the North Downs towards its meeting with the East Stour at Ashford. Initially, apple and pear trees of the East Kent fruit belt lined the track but, for the most part, the scenery was one of a mixture of arable fields and ancient woodland. From Ashford onwards we were retracing our steps back to Victoria, so I was able to spend less time looking out of the window and be more sociable with my fellow railway enthusiasts.

JUBILEE

Plans for celebrating the 2012 Olympics are well under way, and Gillingham has a new £11 million Sports Park where some of the Olympic teams will practise. But 2012 is also the year of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee - I wonder how this will be commemorated locally?

Gillingham's grand plans for Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee began in February 1887, when the Court Leet finally decided to build a long-delayed bridge over the railway cutting to link the upper and lower parts of New Brompton, a project first mooted in 1880. Unfortunately nothing happened until July 1890, when work was begun, and the new bridge was finally opened on May 18th 1892.

Rainham, meanwhile, had celebrated in style on 21st June 1887, with a procession of about 1000 people, a public free lunch for all residents over 55, and tea for about 900 children. It was estimated that some 2000 people were present in the field at Berengrave where there were music, festivities and fireworks. Gillingham 'gathered all the schoolchildren of the area for a big demonstration on the Lines' rather belatedly in September of Jubilee year, but there is no mention of tea. A year later, in October 1888, Rainham Parish Council also provided a permanent memorial, the 'Jubilee' recreation ground in Wakeley Road, which is still in regular use.

Coronation Celebrations

The coronation of Queen Elizabeth in 1953 was celebrated in Rainham by the erection of the clock above Barclays Bank in the High Street. I was very pleased to see that through the efforts of our local

Councillors it has been restored to full working order in good time for her Jubilee.

King George V was crowned on Friday 23rd June 1911, although celebrations began slightly earlier. In Gillingham there were entertainments and concerts in the park, tea for old folks, a baby show, dancing, fireworks, and a large bonfire. On Coronation Day itself 8000 schoolchildren paraded to the park where they took part in a programme of sports and were afterwards given tea. Children in Twydall received commemorative medals, and 'tea for 80 adults was provided in Mr Chambers' orchard opposite the church in Rainham'.

'Rainham always does things well' the report in the Chatham News continued, 'The whole population of Rainham united for the occasion. There was an 8.00 a.m. salute of 21 guns (rifles) from the church tower, and the vicar Rev John Mainwaring Tamplin sounded the Royal Salute on a bugle. Soon after noon all schoolchildren of 7 years and upwards assembled in Station Road and together with the Friendly Society and the Fire Brigade marched to the Parish Church for Divine Service. A sports afternoon followed in the meadow behind the National Schools. A torchlight procession was made through the principal streets and when the procession reached Bredhurst Lane [now Maidstone Road] a huge bonfire was lit.'


