We should have known - as soon as an official drought was declared and a hose pipe ban introduced it started to rain! If only we could have had this weather during the winter it would have done so much more good for farmers, gardeners and the morale of the country. Having a warm sunny March was great at the time but that has long been forgotten when the persistent series of damp miserable days that was April followed. Let us hope that the see saw continues MISS HYDE and May arrives with at least some warmth and sunshine to encourage us with preparations for the Jubilee weekend.

I recently came across an Official Programme of the Coronation Celebrations in Rainham in 1953. A committee of well known local people must have worked tirelessly for months beforehand organising an impressive calendar of events. This began on Wednesday 27th May with an evening Carnival of decorated floats and walking entrants starting at 7.00pm from Broadview Avenue via Maidstone Road, the High Street, Ivy Street, Solomon Road. Sunderland Square and Station Road to the Recreation Ground followed by presentation of the prizes and dancing. On Sunday 31st May two special Coronation Services were held, one a United Youth Service at Orchard Street School and another in church in the evening. Coronation Day started with an 8.00am service in church and continued at 2.30pm. Between these times we all squeezed into the homes of the few with television sets to watch the ceremony live from Westminster Abbey before our eyes (if you could manage to get a glimpse of the very small screen in the crush). The planned programme of events then continued with the R.E Cadet Band, Peter Pan Starlets, transmitting and receiving - this would be the club to A London Mime Theatre, Tug of War, Bat and Trap. Sheep Dog Demonstrations, Comic Football Match, Maypole Dancing, The Feuding Dudes (Hill-Billy songs and dances) and Girl Guides marching display. Throughout the early evening Children's Races were planned with cash prizes varying from 2/6d for the 80 yards girls flat race for 5 and 6 year olds to ten shillings for the 15-16 year old boys one mile race. Twelve and a half to fifty pence were good prizes in then. Unfortunately as many will remember June 2nd 1953 was a day much like those we have just had in April - an almost complete wash out and many of the events had to be postponed or cancelled.

I hope the events being planned for this year's Jubilee celebrations do not suffer a similar fate. They include special concerts, craft fairs and fetes, church services. a Mad Hatters Tea Party and Big Lunch gatherings (read on to find out more in our pages this month). The idea of the Big Lunch started last year when we had an extra Royal Wedding Bank Holiday. We all lead such busy lives that few of us know any but our immediate next door neighbours. To encourage a more traditional friendly attitude everyone in a street/close/ area is asked on this day to bring a picnic lunch to a central spot to share and eat together and get to know each other. There is still time to plan something in your road if you have not already done so - be brave knock on your neighbours door and suggest it! However you plan to spend the month do enjoy any good days we happen to have and make the most of the sunshine until we see you again in June.

THAMES ESTUARY AIRPORT

I was extremely disappointed to read Diane Parmenter's letter (AF April 2012) deploring the proposals for a Thames Estuary airport. Her negative views mirror those of Medway Council in not wanting anything to be done to bring life and energy into the falling and failing fortunes of the Medway

and economical strengths of our Medway towns have slowly drained away. Employer after employer have either shut up shop and moved away or closed down forever. Great names from the past spring to mind: Short's Brothers, Winget's, Gyproc, BP, Chatham Dockyard and the Armed Forces from the local garrison. Their loss has meant the decline and fall of our town centre prosperity and the general malaise hanging over our local population in general. The creations of Gillingham Business Park and Rochester City Estate helped to stem the downturn but what all North Kent needs is something big enough to really change matters.

The Thames Estuary airport is just the project that can provide this. In terms of construction then of daily running, many jobs will be created providing lasting employment and prosperity. New infrastructure by way of rail and road links will keep everything moving. Only relatively few people will face disruption and the birds that use the marshes for nesting, etc, will still have plenty of coastline marshes available in the rest of Kent and Essex. At Gatwick it is known that birds can live and breed alongside the runway. There is little or nothing to fear, only the prospect of great benefit to everybody. Even our town centres may come back to life.

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR APRIL

I have written before about the National Nature Reserve at Elmley on the Isle of Sheppey but it deserves a revisit, particularly in the spring when male birds can be seen performing spectacular display flights. The reserve consists of one of the largest and finest examples of grazing marsh remaining in South East England. In April I crossed over The Swale and onto Sheppey via the old lift bridge and turned right upon reaching Straymarsh Farm and Cottages. The track to the RSPB headquarters at Kingshill Farm on the high ground of the Isle of Elmley passes through Chetney and Stray Marshes. I noted a few swallows hawking for flies above the marshland. The birds need open spaces over which they can swoop close to the ground for flies, preferring large ones such as bluebottles and dung flies. Swallows fly with effortless grace and have a delightful, twittering song which is symbolic of summer. Lovers of the countryside hold them in great affection, Later, I came across another group of the birds at Kingshill Farm where they were inspecting potential nest sites under the canopy of the farm's large wooden barn. Searching for worms and grubs in the grassland of the Chetney Marshes was a mixed flock of jackdaws and rooks. The jackdaws would be nesting down chimney pots in nearby Queenborough and the rooks breeding at their rookery in the horse chestnut trees in the graveyard of Holy Trinity Church.

Chetney and Stray Marshes are divided by a network of ditches, many of which are lined with common reed and sea club-rush. Pools of surface water are scattered about the marshes. At the time of my visit the water table was very low and the shallow pools had already dried out. The grassland is managed by the selective grazing of cattle and sheep so as to provide varieties of subtly different habitats. In spring the short, grazed grassland, with scattered tussocks, encourages lapwings, redshanks, yellow wagtails, skylarks and meadow pipits to breed there. I saw all of these species during my visit. I proceeded along the bumpy track, making a number of stops on the way. Birds and mammals beside the track take no notice of visitors

provided that they stay in their cars. I did however come across a lapwing chick running for cover into some long grass. The young bird was an indication that the breeding season of the lapwing was well advanced. The birds' territories are taken up in late February and March in Southern England. It is then that the spectacular display flights of the males are mostly seen. The birds engage in exuberant twisting and tumbling through the air, accompanied by mewing calls. Fortunately, I was not too late in the season to witness a couple of these aerial performances.

Brown hares are very thin on the ground in Kent and have a limited distribution. There are however quite a number of hares on the reserve, although I myself only came across one. The mammals remain crouched on the ground if alarmed and only flee if approached very closely. Hares are distinguished from rabbits by their larger size, a loping gait, long black-tipped ears and long limbs. It goes without saying that I witnessed none of the activities of socalled "mad March hares" during my visit, Skylarks are quite common on the reserve. The bird is the classical aerial singer of wide open spaces. In spring and summer the song of the skylark can be heard over large areas of farmland and is one of the most evocative countryside sounds; it is a wonderful outpouring of fast and varied warbling. I was able to approach a very tame skylark pecking among the gravel track. It may have been a female picking up grit for the shells of its eggs. Meadow pipits can be regularly seen or heard on Elmley and, like skylarks, sing in the air, albeit with a somewhat repetitive "peep" "peep" note. The pipit's song flight consists of a fluttering ascent from the ground or low perch followed by a descent with wings stiffly spread and tail tilted up. As already noted, I also came across redshanks and yellow wagtails. The former are a brown waders with bright orange legs. They are quite nervous birds and their alarm calls can sometimes cause other species within the locality to take fright. They have become known as sentinels of the marshes. The yellow wagtail is a dainty summer visitor, the male sports bright, sulphur yellow under

In due course I arrived at the car park at Kingshill Farm. Disabled visitors can obtain permission to drive to the nearest hide which is a three mile return trip. The furthest hide, at Spitend, involves a return walk of over seven miles. On this occasion I went no further than Kingshill Farm. Sid Gransden and his large family lived and farmed at Kingshill for almost half a century before the lease ran out in the early 1970s. At the time of my visit the air was full of the bitter-sweet smell of the blossom of the hawthorn trees which give some shelter to the farmhouse from the prevailing south westerly winds. From the high ground on which the farm stands I had good views across the marshes towards the ridge on which Minster Church sits and down the course of The Swale in the direction of the Thames Estuary. The reserve has been described as one of the last wildernesses in South East England, a place where one can find solitude under huge skies.

RAINHAM STATION

Rainham's level crossing was the scene of a fatal accident in January 1924, when a child named Francis Cross was killed there. He was with his brothers and sisters just below the gates, which had been closed to allow a train to come through. although it was not in sight. A cyclist was approaching from the opposite side, so Francis ran across to help him by opening the wicket gate. The wickets were normally locked a minute or so after the main gates. The signalman, Ernest Everson, shouted to the cyclist to wait, and asked him to pull the child back. Both he and the cyclist called to the boy, whose sisters too shouted 'Jump!' But 10-year old Francis had been deaf and dumb from birth, and did not hear any of them. As he hesitated, the 8.45 am express from Ramsgate to Victoria came through at 50 mph, with the inevitable result.

At the subsequent inquest the Coroner asked if anything could be done to prevent a similar event. The Stationmaster, Mr Best, said that this was the first fatal accident since the station had opened sixty years previously, and stressed that this was a very busy crossing.

The jury attached no blame to any of those involved. and recommended that a subway or a footbridge should be constructed by the Railway Company. A couple of weeks later, in February, the Parish Council

decided that two or three trees in the Recreation Ground should be cut down to give the signalman a better view of an approaching train, but little else was done. By August 1925 there was still no progress, so the Council sent a reminder to the Southern Railway Company about the proposed footbridge, and its Clerk received a reply in September saying that 'there would be a further communication shortly'.

I have not yet found out exactly when the promised footbridge was erected, but in January 1926 it was in place, for the Parish council was then discussing the acquisition of land for 'the necessary footpath in Station Road leading to the new footbridge over the railway crossing'. The actual erection was apparently effected very quickly, probably overnight. Railwaymen at this period worked fast. In 1918, as a passenger train left Rainham Station btween 6.00 and 7.00 am, two coaches were derailed. No-one was hurt, but both lines were blocked. A breakdown gang from Gillingham cleared one line by 8.00 am, and the other was fully operational some three hours later.




