

Rainham Cricket Club Married and Singles Match 1948. The club was formed in July 1856 by two wealthy local farmers Thomas Dodd and Richard Mansfield Wakeley. James Miles another wealthy farmer allowed the club to play on a meadow at Siloam Farm. By 1890 the club were playing on Rainham Recreation Ground in Station Road although they did return to Siloam later for a few seasons. In 1923 Colonel H.E. Day gave permission to use Berengrove Park as their home ground. In 1957 G.H. Ward, a local builder, gave the park to the people of Rainham but allowed the Cricket Club to continue playing on a lease. This continues to this day - see the article on page 9. 

THE EMPRESS OF CANADA

Dear Editor.

I was most interested to read the article about Frank Cheal published in the last edition. My father, Charles Roberts who lived in Roberts Road, knew him when they were both in the Royal Navy and was on "The Empress of Canada" when it was torpedoed on March 13th 1943. My father and Frank Cheal used to meet each other for a drink on that date every year whenever they could until my father died in 1989. Unlike Frank, Dad did tell us about his experiences on that night and we finally persuaded him to write them down. It is a vivid account of the event and the three days adrift in open boats 1000 miles from land on the equator before being rescued. As a 33 year-old Chief Petty Officer, Dad was in charge of one the life boats. There were 75 in his boat, built for 50, including 45 Polish soldiers, one of whom spoke English, 18 Polish women (one with a broken leg because she jumped in at the last minute as it was leaving). He also had on board a drunken civil servant who'd managed to consume a bottle of whisky after the explosion, and a Naval Leading Seaman of 18 for whom it was the 4th time he'd been shipwrecked since the beginning of the war! Having made an area of privacy at one end of the boat for the women, Dad said they were calm. polite and helpful. Dad's main task was to allocate the water rations and thanks to the Polish officer he managed to persuade the company to let him limit the supply. The accounts describe many small acts of courage, kindness and heroism. One of his colleagues risked his own life in going to unlock the doors in the escape. It is not without humour. Although he was only 33, Dad was bald and during the day in the blinding heat, his head began to blister and he felt ill, a Polish lady noticed his distress and tore her petticoat into squares to make him a hat, knotting the corners. He remembered it being white with red polka dots! He found that most amusing! One Polish soldier became crazy in the heat of the sun, and dived overboard and swam round the boat for several minutes. Amazingly, the barracuda and sharks didn't get him. Nobody else

After three days they were spotted by a Catalina Flying boat which was searching for them. They knew that help was near so Dad said he gave them all a full cup of water to celebrate. They were picked up by HMS Petunia and then home on the "Mauritania". By the end of the month, he was home on leave and I remember walking up Roberts Road with my

mother to be told by a smiling baker that there was a nice surprise waiting for us! Dad had climbed up the drainpipe and let himself in through the bathroom

Although we have these vivid and precious memories of my Father's wartime experiences, he needed to share them with shipmates who understood what it was really like. Perhaps Frank Cheal was able to talk with him about these experiences that he didn't want to share with others. Certainly, they both held March 13th as a special day and were grateful they had survived when so many friends and colleagues had been lost.

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR MARCH

In March I visited the Sevenoaks Wildlife Reserve, which is managed by Kent Wildlife Trust, in order to witness some of the first signs of spring. The reserve is on the north side of the A25 between Bat & Ball and Riverhead. It was once a sand and gravel pit and is now a mixture of lakes and woodland. There is good access, for wheelchairs and buggies, to most of the reserve. Not having been before to what is a large reserve, I chose to join one of the regular walks led by a warden.

We headed first to the hide overlooking the East Lake. from where we could see, standing on low lying islands, lapwing and two species of duck - gadwall and shoveller. It appeared that these were the only birds to be seen, until the warden directed our attention to a line of vegetation in the shallow water in which a group of snipe were resting. The bird is a stockily built wader with boldly striped plumage and a very long bill. The warden explained that snipe can be relatively tame when unmolested and that these particular birds would soon be departing to breed on the moors of northern England. Before we left the hide, the warden pointed out to us a peacock butterfly hibernating in a corner of the roof. He explained that there are four stages in the life cycle of a butterfly egg, caterpillar, chrysalis and adult. The peacock and the brimstone, for example, hibernate as adults, whereas the orange tip and holly, among others, spend the winter as a chrysalis.

The woodland at the reserve consists mainly of alder, silver birch and two species of willow - grey and goat willow - which are known collectively as pussy willows. We saw our first sign of spring, a bumble bee, feeding on the pollen of pussy willow flowers. Almost immediately afterwards, we spotted our first butterfly of the new year, a brimstone, which may have recently come out of hibernation. This species is seen in almost every month of the year, but has a peak appearance in the first warm days of spring. Only the male sports the familiar lemon colour. The warden then led us, through some undergrowth, along a path which had been recently created by the passing of

many feet. At the end of it was a spectacular display of a bright red fungus growing on the moss covered, fallen trunk of a willow tree. The warden explained that it was a scarlet elf cap, which was rare nationally, but fairly common within the reserve. The sight of the fungus reminded me that I would not have been able to benefit from the knowledge that the warden had of the flora and fauna of the reserve, had I chosen to walk around the reserve on my own.

On the way to the North Lake, we came across a large flock of long tailed tits flitting across the ride down which we were walking. Like flying teaspoons, the tits were easily observed by all of the party and, for their part, they did not seem to be at all concerned by our presence. Less conspicuous was a tree creeper on the trunk of an oak tree and two goldfinches in a Scots pine, which were drawn to our attention by the warden. At the North Lake we settled down in a hide. Overhanging the edges of the lake were branches which serve as ideal perches for kingfishers. Despite its blue and chestnut plumage, the kingfisher is often inconspicuous when perching and is noted only once is flies away. The bird has a characteristically low, rapid and direct flight, during which it emits a shrill, piping call. We did not, I am afraid, either see or hear a kingfisher during our stay at the hide - only coot, water hen and mallard. It was of some compensation, nevertheless, that we heard one of the most welcomed sounds of spring, the call of a newly arrived summer migrant, a chiff chaff.

We headed back to the Visitor Centre along the edge of the West Lake, on which we observed the courtship display of a pair of great crested grebes, facing each other and shaking their heads. The grebe became almost extinct during Victorian times as a result of the fashion of decorating ladies' hats with the plumes of the bird. The fight to protect the great crested grebe led, in due course, to the creation of the RSPB. Ironically, it was the extraction of gravel for the building of the motorways that created many of the habitats, such as the Sevenoaks Reserve, in which they now thrive. In our walk around the edge of the West lake we passed, in sunny spots, clumps of the bright yellow flowers of the lesser celandine, another sign of spring. One of the birds that is resident, all the year

round on the reserve, is the bullfinch. The male is a handsome bird with a black head and a pink breast. However, the most common view of the bird is of its conspicuous white rump as it retreats into the nearest cover. Given the size of the group of people I walked around with, and the shyness of the bullfinch, it was not surprising that we did not see even a disappearing white rump. Nevertheless, I thoroughly enjoyed my visit and it was good to witness the growing interest among families in visiting nature reserves.

An ambitious and exciting plan but we will have to raise the bar in order to survive and provide a pavilion that is a centre of cricketing excellence and a venue for the use of the community.

The members aim is to provide lasting facilities for future generations. Funding activities continue with some £20,000 (c) raised to date. Applications to funding organisation commence in 2013. The outcome of this will dictate when we can start construction, we hope for the end of 2013! £300,000 is the total target and to achieve this we will need help from all parts of the community.
