The Bredhurst Bell in the early years of the 20th century. The licensee name above the door is James Monday who according to the information I found on line was listed in the Post Office Directory as landlord in 1913 and 1922. It was during this period that my family history relates that my grandfather and his brothers would walk from Rainham to Bredhurst on Sunday mornings in order to buy a thirst quenching drink. At this time pubs were only permitted to sell alcoholic drinks to travellers on Sunday (a traveller was defined as someone who had walked at least three miles). This was possibly part of DORA (Defence of the Realm Act|) introduced during the First World War to try to limit drunken behaviour and improve productivity. Can you name any of the people pictured? 

Editorial

The Rainham Co-op holds very fond memories amongst many who were associated with it during the 100 years from its establishment in 1896 to final closure in 1997. For the first 70 years very little changed. As we have seen in the recent Mr Selfridge TV programme labour was cheap so a plentiful supply of shop assistants staffed all departments in these early days. Indeed Rainham Co-op mimicked the large London Store with its many departments all strictly ruled by their own manager. This encouraged discipline but also a very good sense of family for the employees and they were fiercely loyal to each other and their bosses.

For the customer shopping was a time consuming experience. Even with two or three assistants serving you often had to patiently wait your turn. Each item required was separately requested and then selected from the proffered goods. Payment also took time the bill was hand written and enclosed in a capsule with your money then zapped along an overhead railway to the central office. Here the accounts personnel checked the arithmetic (Four and a quarter yards of material at three shillings and eleven pence halfpenny a yard was not easy in your head - no calculators in those days) and returned the capsule with your change. Now the goods were wrapped and your purchase was complete. All this personal customer service vanished almost overnight when the supermarket arrived. By the 1960s the old store had been converted to a self service shop, very small and crowded by the standards of today, and the goods arrived pre-packed so the warehouse staff became redundant. In 1979 the grand, new, large Co-op supermarket opened across Station Road in Rainham Shopping Centre and so in less than twenty years the whole transformation was complete. No wonder many remember her customer's name, she would be of our readers reminisce fondly of these bygone days. addressed as "Mrs Umm"! Who remembers receiving Unfortunately last month I wrongly identified one of the gentlemen in our front page photograph of Co-op workers. At the extreme right of the front row is Sid Norris not Bob Chandler, our apologies to his family and friends.

April is a great month, we have moved to summer time so the long light evenings are a bonus and every ray of sunshine helps warm the ground and us - time to get gardening. The blossom is at its best and Kent really looks like 'The Garden of England' for a short while. Do get out and enjoy this season and we will

see you again in May, hopefully at the beginning of a long hot summer!

RAINHAM CO-OP Dear Editor.

I have just received the March edition of Action Forum, sent to me by my sister who lives in Rainham. I also lived there until twenty-seven years ago when I moved to the West Country with my husband. I was delighted to see the photos of the old Rainham Co-op employees and to read Dick Grice's letter. I go back many years and remember so much about that store. My Mother, together with my sister and me, took our ration books during the war years to the Co-op Grocery Store in Station Road. These books were presented to Joy in the little kiosk where she stamped each coupon then gave Mum a slip of paper with all our allowances for the week marked on it. This was taken, first to the dry goods (tea, sugar, flour, etc.) counter where we were served with the requisite goods, then we crossed to the other side of the store to the bacon counter (butter, margarine, eggs, etc.) for the remainder of our allowances. I well remember Mr Grice, in fact I was in the same class at Rainham Senior School, Orchard Street, as his daughter Audrey.

When I later married and was given a council house on Twydall Estate our groceries were delivered by Len Stockey. I think I am right in saying Len's wife Mary also worked for the Co-op in the Bakery Shop. Other Co-op employees I recall were Mr Sampson and Mr Ransley. I certainly remember Percy Major and his son Alan whom I knew at Orchard Street School. Details are a little hazy, which I suppose is understandable given the fact this was all about 70 years ago. But how good to have your memory iogged, for example I recall the ladies in the Co-op Drapery Store next door where Mrs Ovenden was in charge. When you asked an assistant for an item of underwear or stockings she would open a drawer in the fixtures behind her and place it on the counter for you to make a choice. I remember to this day that lovely fresh smell of new material as the drawer was put on the counter. How quaint is that?

One of the ladies was very polite but didn't always a packet of pins in the change when paying, if the cost meant there was to be a farthing in the change? Incidentally, I have just come across a newspaper

cutting reporting on the disaster in Oak Lane in 1944 when a "doodle-bug" landed under the railway bridge just as a train was passing over it.

Having started this I could ramble on but must stop or you may become bored. Good memories!

DETAILS OF BUS SERVICE CHANGES IN THE

Sunday March 30th 2014 will be the last day of operation for the Sunday 327 service as funding from Kent County Council ceases. There will be no changes to the existing Monday to Saturday 327 service which is operated by Chalkwell. However from Sunday 6th April, the Arriva Sunday 132 Service will increase to every 30 minutes. The 132 runs between Hempstead Valley and Chatham, and will now also serve Medway Maritime Hospital on Sundays due to funding from Medway Council.

There are new ticket prices on the ASD 783 service serving Rainham railway station from Parkwood, Rainham, and Wigmore. Day returns and weekly season tickets are now available. The ticket costs £1.50 single, £2.60 day return, and £13 weekly.

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR MARCH

In early March I visited Bredhurst Wood, which has been designated Ancient Semi - Natural Woodland, I parked my car in Hurstwood Road, opposite the Bell Public House. I walked down the road, turned right just before the church and picked up a leaflet on the wood from the notice board erected by Bredhurst Wood Action Group (BWAG). From this point on, Hurstwood Road, which leads to and through the wood, is little more than a cart track. Yet it is shown. quite surprisingly, on John Speed's Map of Kent of 1612. After a short distance, I stopped at a metal swing gate on my left. Ahead of me was Day Valley and, beyond it, a long, high ridge of chalk, upon which sits Bredhust and Monkdown Woods. I walked down Day Valley which, from spring onwards, sports an impressive display of chalk down land flowers. Growing on the steep slope on the left of the path just inside into Bredhurst Wood were yew trees and a mixture of standard and coppiced broad leafed trees. Most of the coppiced trees were those of hornbeam, ash and hazel, In years past, coppiced hornbeam wood was mainly made into charcoal (for drying hops and for heating the blacksmith's forge), that of ash typically made into tool handles and that of hazel woven into wattle fencing. In the 1970s an abandoned, portable, metal kiln, used for making charcoal, could be seen on this spot. On my right, as I walked up the path, I passed the remains of an old boundary in the form of a ditch and bank. A line of massive, coppice beeches, which were probably planted in the 19th century, were growing on the bank.

I soon reached the plateau on the top of the ridge, which is covered in acres of coppiced chestnut trees, with some oak standards. It is thought that the chestnuts were planted from about 1800 onwards. The coppiced wood was used mainly for hop poles and fencing. Hop production peaked in the late 19th century and declined thereafter. Thus, when BWAG took over management of the wood in 2005, most of the coppiced chestnut trees had not been cut for over 40 years and were very overgrown. Since then, parts of the wood have been opened up by contractors and,

more recently, by BWAG volunteers. The result has been that light has been let into these parts of the woods, allowing wild flowers such as bluebells, lesser celandines and wood anemones to prosper. An understorey of plants such as bramble, bracken, honeysuckle, broom and holly has begun to develop in the earlier cleared areas. Dense bramble, in particular, will provide nesting sites for birds like blackcaps, dunnocks, blackbirds, chiff chaffs, wrens and robins. I continued along the footpath to Scragged Oak and, in due course, reached a valley on the opposite side of the wood. It is very steep, with steps down one side and an arduous climb up the other. The valley contains much the same species of coppiced and standard broad leaved trees as those in Day Valley. Worthy of mention, however, are a row of ancient, coppiced beech trees. One of them is particularly massive and impressive. It seems likely that these beeches were planted in the 19th century to serve both as boundary markers and as a source of wood, but became overgrown as a result of a subsequent lack of demand for the wood. Few plants can survive under the dense canopy of beech trees but, growing defiantly under one of them, was a clump of evergreen butcher's broom, a classic indicator of ancient woodland. Photographs of the coppiced beeches can be seen on the BWAG website (www.bwag.org.uk) under "Gallery" followed by "Notable Trees". I decided not to tackle the muddy, slippery slope looming up between me and Scragged Oak. I partly retraced my steps and headed for an ancient boundary consisting of a bank and ditch. (It runs a few yards SW of posts 5, 6 and 7 in the BWAG leaflet). Very old, pollarded hornbeams, acting as boundary markers, grow along the bank; it is very difficult to date them. Standard hornbeams, unlike oaks, for example, are not long lived, but their life can be extended for a considerable time by pollarding. Also growing on the bank are some standard oaks and beeches, apparently planted in the 19th century. The bank marks, in effect, two boundaries that sit one upon the other. Both were settled in Norman times. One is the boundary between Boxley parish and what was later to become Bredhurst parish. The other boundary is between Monkdown Wood (which was awarded, by the Crown, to the
