Both establishments had moved several times in the Station Road and High Street area as they gradually developed and enlarged, finally settling on this site just outside the centre of the village. The Library looks much the same today, over 50 years later, apart from the 'elegant' concrete flower pots which have finally been removed. However the Police Station, which was extended in the 1960s, became redundant when the central Medway Station opened in 2007 and has now been demolished to make way for a housing project. 

Editorial

What a difference a few sunny, warm days can make. Despite all the dire forecasts we have been treated to an exceptionally fine show of blossom this year. Apparently fruit trees need to lay dormant for several days with temperatures below freezing in order to stimulate the following spring growth. Well I do not remember de-icing or scraping frost off the car at all this winter but somehow the blossom has flourished. Now of course the fears are that a late frost will upset the developing fruit. Over the past couple of years the farm land around us at Meresborough has been transformed. We still have numerous horse paddocks, which was the growth industry of the last decade, but now many fields, which were arable, are being replanted as apple orchards. These are very different orchards from the ones which were grubbed twenty or so years ago. Then they were usually large trees well spaced with sheep typically grazing the grass beneath. A few such cherry orchards do still remain. The disadvantage is the need for tall ladders to pick the crop and in todays health and safety conscious world this is a very expensive way to harvest. So the modern way of cultivating fruit on dwarf trees in closely packed rows, which can be easily picked from ground level, is a much more economic way of producing the vast amounts demanded by the supermarkets. It is good to see that some farmers have faith in the British market.

The anniversary of the beginning of the first World War comes in August and your help is needed to mount an exhibition of any memorabilia you may have at St Margaret's Church, Rainham. A Commemoration and Vigil is planned for Monday August 4th. The organisers appreciate that items will have great sentimental value, if not monetary, and great care will be taken of everything whilst it is on display. Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR APRIL.

"Oh, to be in England, Now that April's there," From the poem "Home Thoughts from Abroad", written by Robert Browning, in Italy, in 1845. In April, prompted by Browning's poem, my wife and I visited the grounds of Leeds Castle, near Maidstone. Described by Lord Conway as the loveliest castle in the world, it sits beside the diminutive River Len and is surrounded by woodland and parkland of the kind that Browning may well have had in mind when he longed to be in England in the April of 1845. As we stepped out of our car at the castle's car park, we could hear the constant "caws" of rooks coming from the rookery in the beech and horse chestnut trees dotted around the car park. The nests have spread. over recent years, from a long established rookery in trees alongside the adjoining A20 Folkestone Road. The rook is one of the most characteristic species of bird to be seen on and over English farmland and it would seem that its numbers are on the increase. The rooks' diet is varied but, during the breeding season, it consists mainly of worms and leatherjackets. At Leeds Castle the birds can be seen searching for these invertebrates on the extensive grassland areas within the castle grounds and, having got used to visitors, they can be surprisingly tame.

Near the ticket box and main shop are some ancient sweet chestnut trees. They have developed exceptionally broad trunks for their height which, with age, have become deeply fissured and covered with bulges. Jackdaws nest in the holes in these trees as well as in holes in the ragstone walls of the castle buildings. Jackdaws are real characters and have a jaunty, confident walk. At Leeds, one can get a close up view of them as they scrounge scraps of food from and around picnic tables and raid rubbish bins. I myself hold jackdaws in great affection. Leaving the ticket box, we walked through a small copse dominated by tall oak trees before emerging by the course of the little River Len, which empties into the Medway at Maidstone. Walking up stream we came across primroses, bluebells, wood anemones, lesser celandines and ladies' smock, among other flowers.

A pair of whooper swans (with wedge shaped yellow beaks) were nesting on an island in the water. Readers may have seen this species of swan, on the BBC TV "Spring Watch" programmes, arriving in this country from their breeding grounds in the Arctic. The pair at Leeds are feral and stay with us all year round. As we walked towards the castle we could hear the characteristic whistling call of a nuthatch, which can walk both up and down a tree trunk in search of grub and spiders. It has a blue-grey back.

Upon reaching the castle, we were delighted to have our first sighting of incoming swallows and martins feeding low over the surface of the moat. The moat and the adjoining Great Water serve as feeding stations for swallows and house and sand martins entering or leaving the country via the Dungeness area. We came across a barnacle goose nesting on a ledge of land below the curtain wall of the castle. There is a resident flock of these geese at Leeds. They are handsome birds with black, white and grey plumage. They can often be seen flying overhead, giving out yapping calls like a pack of small dogs. In the wild, barnacle geese nest in the Arctic and spend their winters in Scotland, among other countries. Those who watched David Attenborough's film of some time ago, on the wildlife of the Arctic, may remember the scene of a white furred Arctic fox seeking to steal the eggs or young of ground nesting barnacle geese. Here at Leeds, the sitting mother is protected from our own red foxes by the moat and, at night, by a locked gatehouse door.

We went via the walled Culpepper Garden, a typical English cottage garden, on our way for a cup of tea and a cake in the Fairfax Hall Restaurant. We noted, in the cottage garden, flowers of the spring such as euphorbia (yellowish-green bracts), pulmonaria (pink petals turning blue) and honesty (lilac petals). Just as we were leaving the garden we heard the unmistakable song of a chaffinch, a string of notes that gets faster and faster and ends with a rollicking finale. Had he been here, Robert Browning would have been delighted, for two of the lines in his poem "Home Thoughts from Abroad" are:

"While the chaffinch sings on the orchard bough, In England - now!" Joe Ennis

RAINHAM LIBRARY

In 1869 Mrs Pearman, the Vicar's wife, opened a lending library in the Infants School room of the Church School at the top of Station Road. The Library the junction of Station Road and the High Street. This was open on one afternoon a week. The 221 books were largely donated by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge which gives a clue to the type of nip crime in the bud by an early warning to an book on offer. 'Conversion of St Paul', 'Outlines of English History', 'Christian Missions' and 'Life of God in the Soul' stood alongside titles such as 'Pennywise and Pound Foolish',' Motherless Lads' and 'Travels in Asia'. Rule 1 in 1869 decreed that subscribers Street were then used until completion of the building belonging to the working class should pay 1d per month or one shilling a year (no reduction for payment extension was added to the east side and as Rainham in advance in those days) while tradesmen and others had good police cells the station became the main should pay 2s 6d a year - this entitled borrowing of one volume a week.

By 1898 progress had been made, the 1908 edition of headquarters for Medway in Lower Gillingham. After Kelly's Directory states 'The Parish Free Library and standing for several years in a state of disrepair the Reading Room was established about ten years ago, and is situated on the ground floor of the Temperance according to their website, the building of 22 flats by Hotel 80 Station Road (next to the Social Club) Rainham. The Reading Room is open daily, and is supplied with the principal daily papers and weekly journals. The Library is replete with nearly 2,000 modern volumes, comprising all classes of literature. There is also a Reference Library with all kinds of postal, county and commercial directories, encyclopedias etc. The Lending Library is open from 7.00pm to 9.00pm on Mondays.'


