

Editorial

As you can see from our front cover this is the five hundredth edition of Action Forum. In March 1969 Hamish was involved with 'Help the Needy' in Rainham and wanted a medium to advertise a particular event they were organising. He claims to have had the original idea of a free delivery newsletter paid for by local advertising - so you have him to blame for much of the clutter we get through our letterboxes 45 years later! Having organised the printing and delivery for one issue it seemed a waste not to continue and thus Action Forum was born. Having a family background in printing obviously helped and for the first few years W & J Mackay printed the copies, rather a change from their normal work of high class letterpress books. This was the era of rapid change in the printing industry and litho was the new kid on the block providing opportunities never before possible. After six months Hamish appealed for help and a small committee continued producing Action Forum whilst he went off for a year to do a post graduate course followed by a period with a printer in Oxford. The volunteers decided to do the whole process themselves and acquired a small printer. However it was a mammoth task, writing, editing, typesetting, printing, folding and delivering even if it was only 10,000 copies needed to cover the whole of Rainham, Wigmore and Parkwood at the time. Inevitably the task began to prove too difficult and Hamish again became involved on his return. This was my introduction, first he recruited me to join the editorial team in November 1971 and then to help with the first Rainham Spectacular in May 1972 - we were married in December! AF gradually grew to 16 pages and a print run of 20,000 copies as the many new housing estates were completed. The advertising paid for printing and, for a short period, the distribution but all the editorial work was then as it is now undertaken by volunteers. Many hundreds of people have been involved, some for a few months some for years and years! Without these helpers AF would not continue, some of the original committee continued to assist for a long time and many door to door distributors have loyally delivered their copies whatever the weather for many years. Of course although we rely on you to contribute copy each month and our policy has always been to include items of local interest we need regular contributors to help fill the pages. Our particular thanks go to Joe Ennis who has written articles for

almost 400 editions of Action Forum, quite a record I am sure you will agree.

For the last 14 years since we reverted to voluntary distribution we have also been able to donate the profit from our advertising revenue to charity. To date an amount in excess of £32,550 has been distributed to St Margaret's Church, Rainham, the Parish of South Gillingham and the Kajiado Project in Kenya, with a few gifts to other charities. With your continued help we now embark on our next 500 copies - producing our normal 11 issues a year that should take us to December 2059 I think - I rather doubt I shall see it! Incidentally I was asked recently if I had worked out the answer to the maths problem I mentioned in the April editorial (Four and a quarter yards of material at three shillings and eleven pence halfpenny a yard). I hadn't but I think it is 16 shillings and 10d plus a packet of hairpins in the change possibly, unless you know differently! Have a good month we will be here again as usual in August

MISS CHEESEMAN (Helena Thomas) Dear Editor

I was saddened to learn of the passing of my former schoolteacher, "Miss Cheeseman" as I knew her. Miss Cheeseman was my very first teacher, when I started in the "Infants" at the Council School in Solomon Road, in April 1935.

I seem to remember that her mother ran a small shoe shop with a tiny window in the front room of their house, which stood exactly where Hidsons now display their secondhand Citroen cars, in Rainham High Street.

As a five year old boy, I absolutely adored "Miss Cheeseman", by far the youngest teacher at the school, with her very fashionable bobbed 1930s hairstyle. "Miss Cheeseman" taught me to read. There was a waist- high dado rail running around the classroom wall, onto which was pinned a set of printed alphabet cards, each carrying upper and lower case letter and a picture. Every morning, "Miss C" went round the room, pointing to each letter / picture in turn, as the children chanted ..."AH is for Apple., Buh is for Bat ..and Caa is for Cat." All the children could read by the time we "Went Up" into Miss Hyde's class. We then moved on to Miss Madge, before going into the dreaded Miss Babbage's class!

Mr Hockey lived in Solomon Road, and he had the first Television (pre - war) in Rainham with a very tall bamboo mast in his front garden. Miss Bassadona was the next class teacher, before going into the "Top Class", taught by Mr Burrows. The Headmaster was Mr Pitcher. By then it was 1939, and World War II began in September. I was privately evacuated to Sussex, and the world changed forever.

I have now had a long and varied career over many years, and I had all but forgotten Miss Cheeseman in the interim, until the Editorial in Action Forum No.

499 (June 2014) revived long forgotten memories. I am forever in her debt for starting me off so well in life, and I hope she rests in peace after living for 105 years.

MEMORIES OF RAINHAM

Dear Editor

I recently received the March, April and May issues of Action Forum from my sister-in-law Celia Henthorn, Orchard Street, and was very interested in the letters from Dick Grice and Pam Wanstall which jogged dormant memories. A pleasant surprise, too, to be remembered by Pam Wanstall after so many years. I remember her very well and her sister Lydia as they lived in Solomon Road near another friend Vic Nutting.

I remember the warehouse Dick Grice refers to beyond which in the Co-op yard was the Co-op dairy, Perc Payne being one of the Co-op milkmen. It may be a surprise that opposite the dairy and behind Mr Sampson's men's outfitting was a bakery that made bread and cakes for the High Street shop and rounds. The baker being a Mr Shilling who lived next door to the Co-op butchers in Station Road. Another of dad's colleagues in the Co-op football team was Harold Steadman a bread roundsman, who lived at Broad Walk.

When I left Senior School in 1943 two of my best mates who left with me were Ronald Golding and Ron Sims. Ron Golding became a delivery 'boy' and Ron Sims a 'warehouse boy' both at Rainham Co-op. Sadly Ron Golding the grandson of Sam Golding, Co-op coalyard weighman, died soon afterwards. Ron Sims, who lived in High Dewar Road, eventually lost contact when I was called up in 1950.

I don't recall my father being in the Co-op bowls team as well as football and snooker-billiards, but it is very probable as the staff and the Co-op children used to go to Belmont on Sunday afternoons where there was a bowling green and tennis courts. Syd Mattocks, Co-op secretary, was a very good tennis player.

Another memory is of the Co-op outings for staff end members on Wednesday afternoons (early closing) and sometimes Sundays. One was to an air show at Star Hill, Darland, where I understand the army camp was later built. The show included static aircraft and flights over the Medway Towns. Another outing was to the sunken gardens between Westgate and Margate, then a popular attraction and surprisingly very little changed today. I have photos of one visit with my parents and Joy Waters parents George and Dolly Howland and her sister Chrissie. I also have the same photograph as used on the March Action Forum. I never did know why those five men were photographed together and assumed it must have been on a Co-op event somewhere. Thank you Dick Grice for solving the mystery.

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR JUNE

According to the Environment Agency, there are 161 chalk rivers and streams across England, more than any other country. With their clear, cool water fed from underground chalk aquifers and their unique array of animal and plant life, they are like no other natural habitat. Great drifts of water crowfoot, whose white flowers float on the surface of the water, are a characteristic sign of chalk rivers and streams. Fish such as trout, grayling and salmon spawn in the beds of pebbles and gravel of these chalk water courses. Nymphs of mayflies, among other flies, grow fat under the same pebbles, prior to their brief nuptial flight. In late spring or early summer the fully grown nymphs float top the surface of the water, where they are taken by trout and other species of fish. Those that escape the jaws of a predator moult, in due course, to become glistening, long-tailed, adult mayflies. As adults, they live only for a few days, during which time they mate, in swarms, over the water, usually in the afternoon or early evening. After sunset the female lays her eggs in the river bed. The most famous of England's chalk rivers, where fly fishing rights cost a fortune, are the Avon, the Test and the Itchen in Hampshire, all of which empty into the Solent. Kent's chalk rivers and streams include the Nailbourne and stretches of the Great Stour.

In May, a couple of years ago, I walked the Great Stour Way between Chartham and Canterbury. Chartham is dominated by the large buildings of a paper mill. The village has an impressive 13th century parish church and an 1888 South Eastern Railway signal box from which the signalman emerges to close, by hand, the level crossing gates on the Ashford to Canterbury railway line. The 19th century gates sit somewhat incongruously with the 21st century High Speed Train which dashes through the station on its way to St Pancras. During the first half of my journey the Great Stour was lined with a string of flooded gravel pits surrounded by bulrushes, among other aquatic plants. Herons, cormorants, great crested grebes, mute swans and coots could be seen on the lakes. Overlooking the Great Stour from the west was

the high ground around Chartham Hatch, topped with woodland. Apple and pear trees were growing on the sunny slopes leading down to the river which is lined with water - loving trees such as alder, grey poplar, crack willow and white willow. The leaves of the latter flash silver in the wind and the sunshine. Sheep graze in a number of the fields alongside the river. A little over half way to Canterbury I passed by the parish church of Thanington Without. The parish's somewhat strange name refers to the fact that it is without the old city walls of Canterbury, as distinct from being within. It was at that point in my journey that I spotted a large shoal of brown trout facing upstream and keeping their positions in the water above a stretch of flinty gravel on the river bottom. It was heartening to see that the water was very clear. Anchored on the bed of the river and wafting in the flow of the water were drifts of water crowfoot, lesser spearwort and floating sweet grass. Purple loosestrife, meadow sweet, yellow flag and hemlock were growing on the river bank. Throughout my journey I came across mallard and their ducklings and water hens and their chicks feeding among the plants in the river. I caught sight of the flashing blue shape of a king fisher. Chalk rivers are a favourite haunt of otters. According to the Environment Agency, Kent's rivers contain good quality water and high levels of fish but the county's extensive networks of busy roads and railways are obstacles for otters attempting to spread from the west.

Having passed under the A2 bypass of Canterbury, I emerged onto Hambrooke Marshes which are periodically flooded or water logged by fresh water. Under the Stour Valley Project the marshes are being fenced to enable them to be grazed by cattle, as they were in the past. The hope is that snipe will be encouraged to nest there. During my visit ragged robin, red clover and common fleablane (yellow, button-like flowers) were in bloom on the marshes. From the latter I had a view of the Bell Harry Tower of Canterbury Cathedral. A number of paintings exist of the same view in Victorian times, including one by Thomas Sidney Cooper RA, who was born in Canterbury. This painting is not as well known as the famous view of Salisbury Cathedral from Harnham

water meadows by John Constable! In due course I crossed the boundary line of the old city wall and entered into Westgate Gardens, the path through which has the Great Stour on one side and colourful flower beds on the other. I finished my journey at Westgate Tower, the sole survivor of the city's mediaeval gates of the 14th century. My walk had been one of complete contrasts, from sheep grazing silently in water meadows to excitable French school children let loose in the centre of Canterbury.
