

Editorial

Only fifty or sixty years ago everyone walked - to work, to school, to the shops and just for the pleasure of enjoying the evening air after a long day at work. Now we have to plan time to walk, jog or run into our busy lives and as our days become more sedentary so our waistlines expand and our mental health deteriorates. It really is good to get out in the fresh air and exercise - it need not be vigorous but the benefits are real, so much so that local walking groups are much in demand and shorter starter walks are offered all over the borough to begin the transformation. MEMORIES OF SOLOMON ROAD SCHOOL Dear Editor.

I am sure Richard Church and myself are not the only two former pupils of Miss Cheeseman who will have been very sad to learn of her passing away. I began in the Spring 1935 term at the Council School and she was also my first teacher. Those early days in our development, though different and simple compared to education today, were very important to 'fix' in our young minds the subject of school, and attending. I remember on our first day how Miss Cheeseman sorted us out so that if possible we sat with someone we knew or who lived near us. I lived at 38 Tufton Road and was sat next to a friend Audrey Wall who lived at 32. Next day I went willingly to school. In the routine of things unless they became famous locally or nationally and came back to visit 'their' school as 'old boys' or 'old girls', the infant teachers in particular after their pupils had 'moved on' would not know how these had fared in the world. In Miss Cheeseman's case, however, she did know about some of them. When it was announced the Council School was to be closed former pupils were invited for a last look and to see a special exhibition of the school history. A large number of us took this chance but the bonus of the event when we got there was Miss Cheeseman, too.

A local newspaper attended and took photographs. In one is the late Brian Cumberworth talking to Miss Cheeseman. She said to me she remembered me as I was 'a quiet boy who just sat there, taking in what she was teaching'. Perhaps I was overawed by this lady telling us how to read and write. In another is Vi Nutting close to Miss Cheeseman as she, quite unnecessarily, is waving her stick at us to keep order. I also remember Miss Hyde with great affection, plus all the other teachers Richard Church lists - Mr Hopkins, Miss Mudge with her hair 'buns' over her ears, Miss Springate (classroom by the clock) and the Eleanor Roosevelt lookalike Miss Babbage (Miss Cabbage) who taught me after Miss Hyde. I still have two of her school reports quite favourable to my attempts to absorb her teaching.

Names come to mind of fellow pupils in those classes Eric Stringer, Peter Baldock, George Cumberworth Elsie Moore, Douglas Kitney, Ron Packer, Peter Bates, Mary Gilman, Peter True, Frank Bartlett. If my memory serves me right Richard Church was also in either Mr Sergeant's or Mr Gleadles class with me at the Senior School. I went on to a sort of literary career (24 - non fiction books published), which included later writing for Bygone Kent in which Miss Cheeseman also wrote vividly of Rainham, its life and the shops she knew. The Council School also produced a much more illustrious world known author, of scientific books and novels, one of which was a best seller. When he was told by his sister of the Council School reunion he phoned from Tokyo University where he was lecturing to say how much he wanted to be with us because he owed so much to the school and its early teaching but it was rather a long way to come but he would be with us in his thoughts that day.

I duplicate Richard Church's comments I am grateful for what Miss Cheeseman did, too. It is said the deceased are not so if they live on in our memories and indeed Miss Cheeseman does so in the memories of her pupils.

Referring to my Memories of Rainham letter in Action Forum July 2014 I received a call from Judy the widow of my school pal Ron Sims to say he had passed away from emphysema in 1995 aged 66. In the first paragraph of the same letter it should have been Pam Mepste:d and her sister Lydia, not Wanstall.

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR SEPTEMBER

September is the peak month to seek out those terns which have finished breeding around our country's coasts and which are migrating to the Southern hemisphere for the duration of our winter. Many can be seen, from view points on the Isle of Thanet, flying down the English Channel. Four species of tern are summer visitors to this country, namely, little, Sandwich, common and Arctic tern. The first three terns fly south to the Atlantic or Indian Ocean coasts of Africa. However, the Arctic tern flies all the way to the seas off the Antarctic pack ice, in time for the Antarctic summer. Arctic terns are so named because many nest in the Arctic, although readers may have seen natural history programmes on television showing colonies of Arctic terns nesting on the Farne Islands, where they attack people who stray too near their nests. On a sunny Sunday in September of last vear I went to Broadstairs on the train, in the hope of spotting migrating terns. The mile upon mile of urban development along the line held no great interest for me but I did keep my eyes open, in particular, for the Seasalter Levels, upon which sheep and cattle were grazing; Whitstable Bay and Shellness on the Isle of Sheppey: and the twin towers of the former church on the coast at Reculver. The towers overlook the broad, shallow river valley which the line runs through and which is the site of the sea channel that once separated the Isle of Thanet from the rest of Kent. There was, however, one urban site that I did not want to miss, namely. Dreamland, It was sad to see the remains of the wooden roller coaster. I have every faith that Wayne Hemingway will turn Dreamland into a major attraction. The people of Margate are behind him and he and they deserve to succeed.

The sight of red roofs on neat looking bungalows and houses, in well tended gardens, served as an announcement that the next stop was Broadstairs. The walk from the station, down the High Street, brought me to Viking Bay and its golden sands. The bay is embraced by a horseshoe of low chalk cliffs and within it is a small harbour. As I stood on The Parade, overlooking the bay, the loud, trumpeting calls of

herring gulls were very evident. They are reminiscent of the seaside and are often used in the sound track of programmes on radio or television to emphasise a coastal setting. Herring gulls are large, robust, raucous and aggressive and many nest on roofs in seaside towns. They are notorious for stealing food from unsuspecting picnickers. Their natural food consists of marine invertebrates such as crabs and molluses such as common whelks which they drop onto hard road surfaces in order to break the shells open. I was pleased also to hear the calls of jackdaws that were flying between the red clay chimney pots of the Georgian houses on The Parade. I am very fond of the jackdaw. He is cocky and has a strutting gait when on the ground. He is a real "Jack-the Lad".

I headed for the harbour where three fishing boats were moored. I met a fisherman who told me that he and his colleagues bring home whelks, lobsters, crabs, bass and herrings. Children were trying to catch shore crabs in the harbour with bait tied to hand held lines. I then walked to the opposite end of the bay where there is a paddling pool which is filled by the incoming tide. Children on the pool wall were fishing with nets. Around the man made pool were naturally occurring rock pools formed by rocks of chalk, among which were stones of flint. The rocks were covered in limpets and at least three species of sea weed. There was a green slimy, grass-like one, bladder wrack and furbelows. The bladder wrack is coloured brown and has fronds with gas filled bladders which enable the plant to float upright once it is covered in water. Furbelows have many long, brown fronds growing from a stem which anchors the plant to a rock. In the pools were shrimps and shoals of tiny, darting fish. The latter were probably either young blemies or young gobbies. I also came across numerous empty common whelk shells, which have a spiral shape. In due course I climbed up to the Jubilee Clock Tower, set on top of the cliffs, where I had a picnic lunch. I noticed that the predominant plants on the chalk cliffs were everlasting pea and red valerian. The latter plant also grows on the outer walls of Rochester Castle and on the chalk face of Chatham Hill. During my lunch I kept an eye open, through my binoculars, for any terns passing down the English

Channel, but I failed to see any. The sea was mostly a the battle of Charleroi on the right of the British light grey colour but silvery where it reflected the sun's rays. Terns, being grey above and white below, could have slipped by without me spotting them. I decided to have a cup of tea and a cake at the cafe on the harbour wall where I could continue to look out for inflicted heavy casualties on the German side but with terns from sea level. I descended down to the sands and was picking my way gingerly between picnic blankets and sand castles when I came across Mr De Witt's Punch and Judy Show, which was in full flow. I After their first conflict the battalion crossed the River could not resist stopping to watch it. At the end of the Marne on September 9th and soon confronted German show it was clear that the children had thoroughly enjoyed it. And so had I. If it transpired that I was not to see any terns during my visit to Broadstairs there was some compensation that I had seen Mr Punch, his Aisne and billeted at Vailly. On September 14th they wife Judy and their baby, a clown, an officious policeman and a very hungry crocodile.

The First Rainham Soldier Killed in World War 1 When war was declared in July 1914 most people believed that it would be a short and glorious affair. In Rainham young men joined up while others who were

already in the forces soon became involved. Originally born in Chatham, Thomas Henry Anderson lived in Chatham, Rainham and Upchurch during the period leading up to 1914, working as a butcher's assistant before joining the 1st Battalion of the Northumberland Fusiliers. His first military experience took place in India which formed part of the British Empire and while serving there he was awarded the Delhi Durbar Medal in 1911 to commemorate King George's coronation celebrations in India.

After completing his posting in India he returned to England where he was stationed at Portsmouth but with the outbreak of war in July 1914 it wasn't long before he found himself sailing to France as part of the British Expeditionary Force made up entirely of professional soldiers under the command of General Sir John French. As a member of the 1st Battalion of the Northumberland Fusiliers he disembarked at Le Havre in France before being transported inland by train to Landrecies.

According to the regimental history of the Northumberland Fusiliers, on 21st August Thomas Anderson's regiment marched towards Mons where the 1st Battalion took a position on the Mons Condé Canal while the French were fighting the Germans at

Expeditionary Force. The British aim was to hold a line along the Mons-Condé Canal for 24 hours to prevent the advancing Germans from threatening the French left flank. When the battle began the British the retreat of the French Fifth Army which exposed the British right flank to numerically superior German forces a retreat was ordered.

infantry in a wooded area at Veuilly. During the course of this they crossed a stream and marched on to the village of Dammard. They then crossed the River moved forward in support of the 4th battalion of the Royal Fusiliers near Rouge Maison and waited. At dawn the Germans attacked and the fusiliers were driven back after engaging their enemy in a wood on the left side. They lost more than 30 soldiers which probably included Thomas Anderson and 84 officers and men wounded or missing.

It isn't clear exactly how he was killed but Thomas, who held the rank of Lance-Corporal, was later awarded the 'Mons Star,' a medal awarded to those who had fought the Germans in France and Belgium between 5th August and 23rd November 1914. He is remembered on the Upchurch and Rainham war memorials and on La Ferte-Sous-Jouarre memorial east of Paris. The Northumberland Fusiliers lost a total of 16,000 men during the war, they raised 52 battalions, they won 67 battle honours and 5 Victoria Crosses.

Thomas Anderson was the first Rainham serviceman to be killed in the conflict and 98 others from the village suffered the same fate in the Great War of 1914-1918.


