

A replica of the Cross of Iona on the island of Iona off the west coast of Scotland was chosen for the War Memorial in Rainham High Street. The eighteen and a half foot tall cross was unveiled and dedicated on December 12th 1920 in front of a large crowd who filled the surrounding roads. It was the last service conducted by the vicar the Rev John Mainwaring Tamplin, who struggled from his sickbed determined to take the service and died shortly after. Two of the Horse Chestnut trees planted by the landlord of the White Horse, Mr Adie, had to be removed to make way for the memorial and the railings were sacrificed to the Second World War metal appeal and have never been replaced.

Editorial

Whoever had the idea for the haunting artistic display entitled 'Blood Swept Lands and Seas of Red' a mass of poppies surrounding the Tower of London as a tribute to those who gave their lives fighting in the First World War is to be congratulated. A blood red flower for each life lost really brings home the folly of World War 1, he was not Rainham's first Great the whole disaster. It is such a simple but evocative sight, well worth a visit if you find yourself in London. The whole concept is very well thought out, the ceramic poppies have gradually been 'planted' since August 5th, the first full day of conflict, encapsulating the four years of misery into a few short. Abb's Head, HMS Pathfinder was sunk by U-21, thus weeks, as the river crept around the moat. They will remain there until after the November 11th Remembrance Services and will then gradually be removed and posted to those who have purchased them as a permanent memorial. If all the 888,246 poppies are sold many millions of pounds net profit will be raised and divided amongst six military charities including the British Legion. The flowers were created by ceramic artist Paul Cummins, with setting by stage designer Tom Piper. A really moving tribute but already the authorities at the Tower are wondering how to top this to celebrate the armistice in four years time. All I can think is a miniature national flag to represent each life lost but it would not have the same impact as the 'river of blood'.

We are indebted to David Wood for contributing a series of articles containing fascinating information about people from Rainham who were caught up in the conflict. The suffering becomes real when local names and homes are identified. Jonathan Saunders is also keenly interested in that period and anxious to trace the heritage of the one unknown name, W.G. Lockyer, from our War Memorial. If you have any information to help please do get in touch.

As usual at this time of year our diary is filled with dates for Christmas Fayres and Sales, Churches, schools and social groups all work hard throughout the year preparing treats to be sold in aid of their particular good cause. Correspondence WWI in RAINHAM

Dear Editor,

Thank you to David Wood for his interesting article on Rainham in the opening months of WW1. David mentions Special Constables and the search for German spies. One such victim of the constabulary was Heinrich Sohlar, a pottery worker at Wakeley Brothers. He was arrested in October 1914 and sent to an internment camp. His crime, other than being German, was that when he arrived in Rainham two years earlier, he had briefly worked as a mechanic at Otterham Quay. Whilst it is correct for David to say Tom Anderson was the first Rainham soldier killed in

War "killed in action". The first known casualty was Chief Stoker John Wood (I assume no relation to David) of HMS Pathfinder, who lived with his wife and 5 year old son at 99 Station Road. Just before 4 o'clock in the afternoon of 5th September 1914, off St. becoming the first victim of modern submarine warfare. The widow of John Wood, Caroline. remarried and left Rainham for Grove Park, which may explain why his name like several other Rainham -folk who made the ultimate sacrifice, is not listed on Rainham's War Memorial.

Interesting to note that following their move from Luton (Chatham), the Anderson family were very much part of Rainham, however Tom himself most likely never lived in Rainham, having left employment in Chatham to enlist in 1905.

Moving forward to July 1915, stories of German atrocities in Belgium had been reported in the British press. Three boys from Rainham were summoned before the Children's Court at Sittingbourne for having punched and kicked another boy so hard he had been off school for a fortnight. Their defence that they had been playing at being German's was accepted by the Magistrate and the case was dismissed!

If any readers have knowledge of W.G. Lockyer, who appears on Rainham's War Memorial and the British Standard Cement Memorial at Riverside Country Park, I would be interested to hear from them. He remains the one name that has not been positively identified on Rainham's War Memorial.

Rainham Soldiers World War 1 Experiences in 1914-1915

Of the soldiers from Rainham who joined up to fight Wednesday 19th November, 10.00am - 12 noon for King and country some wrote letters home describing their experiences or were reported in local Refreshments, All Welcome, No Entrance fee newspapers. With the war in full swing by the end of CHRISTMAS FETE 1914, a December edition of the East Kent Gazette reported that Private Arthur Gore of the Royal West Surrey Regiment had returned home to 45 Ivy Street to recover from wounds sustained at the Battle of Ypres. The 21 year old had fought in trenches only fifteen yards from German positions and got shot in Visit our wonderful cats. Carol 07973 677390 the head during heavy fighting. As he fell back another bullet struck him in the eye and he lay unconscious for five hours until he came around and managed to walk to a village about half a mile away where he received treatment. He was then sent to hospital in Le Havre where his damaged eye was removed then to the Royal Eye Hospital in Manchester for another operation before going home to Ivv Street to recover.

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR OCTOBER

This month's Notes are about two bird watching trips took recently on the motor vessel Julie Sue around the islands of marshland of the Medway Estuary to the north of Upchurch and Lower Halstow. The first was in late September, sailing from Otterham Quay. The trip had to take place at high tide and, consequently, the mud flats of the estuary were covered in water and the waders and other birds that feed there were resting on dry land and out of the cold North wind that was blowing. The birds were mainly at rest in the shelter of both man - made sea walls and the naturally occurring mud banks of the islands of marshland. Fortunately for us, the resting waders were easily viewed; they were lined up for us and were not scared off by a slow moving boat that kept its distance. We saw good numbers of waders, including, redshank, lapwing, curlew, ringed plover, grey plover, both species of godwit and dunlin. We also noted other, more hardy birds that were sitting out the high tide, in the sunshine, in the open and facing into the wind. There were hundreds of avocets on a long, narrow mud bar and a number of cormorants and turnstones perched on abandoned barges. Turnstones can be seen scavenging for sand hoppers along the tide line at Seasalter and also on the guayside at Whitstable looking for any discarded remains of sea food.

Once we were out of the shelter of Otterham Creek and into the main channel of the Medway the wind would occasionally blow a spray of sea water into the open boat. We spotted the ochre coloured sails of the Thames sailing barge Cambria, which was launched at Greenhithe in 1906. It was tacking across Long Reach as it attempted to make headway against the North wind. As we sailed by the islands of marshland we could see the sea walls that were breached by high tides a little over a hundred years ago; these breaches brought to an end hundreds of years of agriculture on fresh water marshland that has since reverted to salt marshes. They have now been left to the birdwatchers and the wildfowlers. As usual, at lunch time, Ray Wade, the owner and skipper of the Julie Sue. provided hot tea and, as a supplement to our

sandwiches, a generous helping of hot bread pudding. The latter is just the food to satisfy an appetite brought on by the sea air and the cold wind. Ray is ex Royal Navy, lives in Rainham and also takes out anglers. He can be contacted, after 7pm in the evening, on 233957. On the way back to Otterham Quay we came across a number of low flying swallows. I am always delighted at the sight of these birds, but when they are migrating, that elation is tinged with some sadness. Our trip in early October was from Gillingham Pier. We were lucky to have another sunny day but no wind, just a gentle breeze. By the time we reached the island of marshland to the north of Upchurch and Lower Halstow, the tide had dropped and areas of mudflat were exposed. The mud is a rich source of food for waders and other birds, which feed on lugworms and rag worms; molluses such as cockles and marine snails; and crustaceans such as shrimps and crabs. We saw much the same species of waders as on our previous trip, but in greater numbers, as a result of the better weather and the low tide. Large number of waders and other birds attract raptors and we witnessed two scenes showing nature red in tooth and claw. We spotted a peregrine falcon carrying a teal, a small duck, as it alighted on the derelict Bess Ness Jetty. Peregrines are often seen on natural history television programmes, nesting on urban buildings and feeding largely on pigeons. The second scene featured a storm petrel which is a tiny, sooty-black seabird. This particular bird had presumably spent the breeding season on the west coast of Britain or around the coast of Ireland and was intending to migrate to seas off western or southern Africa. It had clearly lost its way and was exhausted. As we left the spot, a marsh harrier (which normally preys on rabbits and other small mammals) was circling around the storm petrel which was, I am afraid, doomed. The River Medway supports a wide range of fish species such as herring, bass, grey mullet and flounder. The estuary also provides a habitat in which

small fish like gobies and young fish of herring, for example, find shelter and food. We saw much evidence, during our trip, of the bounty of the river. Black headed gulls were feeding on small fish forced to the surface by schools of bass which were pursuing

them. Little egrets were picking off small fish which the incoming tide was bringing into the shallows. Great crested grebes and little grebes (dabchicks) were generator to drive it. For the last 3 years, MEMS have diving for fish large and small. Hundreds of well fed cormorants were resting and drying their wings on Bess Ness Jetty. Finally, we came across twelve rotund grey seals hauled out of the water onto the high sponsorship from local businesses and suppliers. In mud banks lining Damhead Creek, which leads to Kingsnorth Power Station. From their vantage point the seals could see humans approaching but they were of banners on site, over the PA system during the fairly relaxed about a passing boat. They would have been feeding, in the creek, on grey mullet. Because of the state of the tide, we arrived back at Gillingham Pier somewhat late in the day, just after a glorious sunset above Chatham Dockyard. Flocks of curlew and Brent geese, among other birds that had been feeding on the estuary, were flying low over the water details of our operation. towards their roosts on Nor Marsh. The weather was bad in 2008 when we or the Hoo Peninsula were flying higher in the sky. many in V formation. It was the end of another enjoyable trip on the Julie Sue.

UPCHURCH FAMILY FIREWORKS

The Upchurch Fireworks has a history of raising money for local clubs and charities for over 30 years and Upchurch Scouts took over its organisation in 1996 when the previous village committee stepped down. Since then, its aim has been to raise funds for the Scout Group.

For many years it was held in The Paddock in the centre of the village but a requirement for a larger safety zone ruled this out in 2005, when we moved to the present site at Westmoor Farm, Rainham. As this site is on the main A2, it is highly visible with good on -site parking facilities and it has raised our profile and attendance considerably. We now expect an attendance of about 4,000 people for this event but are always aiming for more. We estimate our present capacity to be about 6,000 under our current layout but re-organisation could raise that.

Safety is of major importance at an event like this and we use a professional company for the supply and firing of the Category 4 fireworks. Also, with so many people on a site of this size at night, the provision of power and lighting is clearly paramount. We use some small generators around the site for more remote lighting requirements but we also need a sizeable

supply for the main viewing and stalls area. We have power distribution for the main site but need a been kind enough to provide one FOC, with a 125A socket outlet. We simply plug our system into that. fired for about 250 people and made a major loss. In 2011, again the forecast was poor but we managed to cancel the event in sufficient time to control most of our losses. Nevertheless, when conditions are right. the benefits outweigh the occasional loss. The display supports the running of Upchurch Scout

We have a good brick-built hall which replaced a 30+ year old rotten timber hut in the 1990's and the Fireworks have been an integral part of the funding for both its construction and maintenance. In the last year, we had to replace the hall gas heater at short notice when it failed in the middle of the winter. This year, we spent about £1,500 on tents and a gas urn for camps, and the financial ability to readily replace the fridge-freezer when it failed was reassuring. We also ensure we have a direct effect on the children by supporting various camps and outings. Plans for the future include the refurbishment of the kitchen and improved storage facilities.

In essence, the money raised by Fireworks Night enables the Group to continue to operate in a planned and stable manner, to the benefit of the many children who attend the various sections.
