Editorial

I am beginning to have sympathy for my mother who during discussions often used to get her 'wars' muddled up! Having lived through both the first and second World Wars, during her later life they often merged and she had to think very hard to remember which she was describing. To her generation 'The War' meant The Great War 1914-18 the war to end all pictures, but did produce some interesting memories wars. To my contemporaries 'The War' is The Second of the area. So memories of the chapel would be World War 1939 – 45. These were the events fresh in the memory during our youth. To my children, however, and subsequent generations both wars are probably ancient history to be studied in history lessons on a par with The Spanish Armada or the six wives of Henry VIII.

During the last couple of years much has been done to try to keep the horror of the two World Wars alive in the hope that they will never be repeated and as a constant reminder that our life today would be very different if it were not for the sacrifice so many young people made for their country. We have recognised significant anniversaries with national events some, such as the poppies at the Tower of London, will I am sure stay with us forever. Most have been commemorating the progress of our army in the first year of war one hundred years ago. By now in 1915 it was coming home to the general population that far from being a quick triumph the fighting was set to drag on for years to come as stalemate faced the troops in the trenches. This month however we switch to the Second World War. We include Memories of World War II by Richard Church on page 9. Armistice Day 1945 with the recent end of fighting in both Europe and Japan must have been a particularly emotional occasion and The RaTS Revellers are preparing a Concert on November 6th & 7th to celebrate the 70th anniversary. This promises to be 'an evening of nostalgia, comedy and a good old fashioned sing song'. I am sure it will be in the spirit of the moral boosting concerts staged in the 1940s. See page 7 for more details.

Autumn so far has been very kind to us and, whisper it quietly, we are promised a few days of 'Indian Summer'. It certainly is glorious at the moment. Just the weather to get out for a brisk country walk before the paths become too muddy! Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR SEPTEMBER

"Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness" From the poem "To Autumn" by John Keats 1795-1821 Keats had in mind domestic apples, among other fruits, when he penned his well-known poem, because he refers to apples on moss covered trees in cottage gardens. He would also have been aware of the less romantic scene of the increasing varieties of apples being sold off costermongers' barrows in his native London. The poet's life straddled the 18th and 19th centuries which have been described as the golden age of apples. During those centuries desert varieties such as Cox's Orange Pippin, Blenheim Orange and Laxton's Superb (and the cooking apple Bramley Seedling) were first introduced. There is no better local event at which to see the mellow fruitfulness of domestic gardens and allotments than the annual Bredhurst Show. Mrs Ennis and I visited this year's show, in early September. Desert apples and pears, cooking apples, plums and raspberries were on show. Also exhibited were jars of raspberry, black current and gooseberry jam.

A little later in the month, I revisited Bredhurst, as I set off in search of the last signs of summer and the mellow fruitfulness of autumn, in the local countryside. I set off down Bredhurst Road in the direction of Bredhurst Wood. I picked up a leaflet on the wood, published by Bredhurst Wood Action Group, at the Group's notice board. I soon stopped at a metal swing gate. Immediately in front of me was Day Valley and, looming above it, the long line of Bredhurst Wood. The leaves of the field maple, hazel, hornbeam and beech trees would soon be turning vellow. Those of the oak, ash and sweet chestnut trees would remain various shades of green for longer. The valley contains a chalk grassland hay meadow and, among the last flowers of summer in the meadow, were greater knapweed, field scabious, marjoram, birds' foot trefoil and meadow vetchling. I also noted flowers that bloom well into autumn, namely, feltwort (or autumn gentian) and harebell. The latter is one of the most beautiful of all Britain's common wild flowers. Its delicate, paper thin, sky blue bells shake

slightly on their thin stalks. Even though the day of my visit was warm and sunny, I saw no butterflies or other insects on the flowers. I did however come across a red admiral feeding on fallen, over-ripe

I entered Bredhurst Wood, which was relatively quiet now that the breeding season was over; male pheasants and jays were no longer emitting their raucous calls and male great spotted woodpeckers had ceased drumming on tree trunks. Mellow fruitfulness was evident in the form of sweet chestnuts (which were not vet ripe), hazel nuts and acorns. Among other mammals and birds, badgers, grey squirrels and pheasants would be seeking out the mature sweet chestnuts; dormice, bank voles, nuthatches, great spotted woodpeckers and great tits would be in competition for the hazel nuts; and wood mice, wood pigeons and jays would be searching for the fallen

I left the wood at Strawberry Bank, where I came to a row of magnificent beech trees which miraculously survived the great storm of October 1987 and which line a short stretch of the boundary between Bredhurst and Detling parishes. The trees were festooned in beech masts which would be food for chaffinches and bramblings once they had ripened and fallen. I took the footpath to Kemsley Street which leads down Strawberry Bank and across a valley full of millions of the long stalks and seed heads of grasses, bleached by the sun and waving in the breeze. They were reminiscent of the prairies of mid-west America. Just before reaching Kemsley Street I passed a long line of hawthorn bushes laden with red berries which would doubtless attract the attention of redwings and fieldfares later in the year. I cut across two hayfields to the church and thence to my car. During my walk I had come across wild fruits which, in the past, were widely gathered for human consumption, namely, blackberries, elderberries and sloes. Blackberries can be made into pies, jellies, jam, vinegar and syrup; elderberries make excellent, full-bodied wine; and sloes can be added, along with sugar, to gin. So they can. But I doubt whether, these days, many people go to the trouble of picking autumn's mellow fruitfulness. Joe Ennis

MEMORIES OF WORLD WAR II by Richard Church

Orchard Street School was partitioned off to create an Emergency Dressing Station, in effect a mini hospital, staffed by several nurses working 12 hour shifts, overruled by Mrs Armstrong, the Matron. The school Assembly Hall was turned into a hospital ward, with rows of beds. It was not used much until a flying bomb fell onto the Ramsgate train as it crossed the bridge over Oak Lane, in 1944, when suddenly it became very busy indeed, with ambulances arriving with badly injured people every few seconds. During the Battle of Britain, several aircraft, both allied and enemy, crashed in the fields and orchards roundabout. My pals and I immediately got onto our bicycles and pedalled off to see the wreckage, and I remember two in particular:-

The Messerschmitt Me 109 that crashed into the east corner of Hartlip church: Mrs Rainey had its duckegg blue tail fin, with prominent black swastika, hung on the wall behind the counter in her shop which was directly opposite the church's lych gate. (today it is a private house).

Another, which crashed in a cherry orchard in Gore Farm: As the stricken Heinkel 111 careered along between a row of trees, its wings were sheared off and it caught fire. Brass cartridge cases and equipment were scattered around in the grass, and I think the crew were all killed in the crash.

In 1940, the immediate neighbourhood was alive with military traffic and soldiers were everywhere. They did foot drill and marched up and down in the residential streets in Rainham. Although houses in London Road were requisitioned for accommodation by the army, hutted Army Camps mostly equipped with sandbagged anti-aircraft guns and searchlights, were built in the fields and woods. They were not slow Holbrook). My neglected 'Rainham' education was to open fire when German aircraft flew up the river, scattering murderous shards of shrapnel into the streets, roof tiles, and gardens of Rainham. The noise was unbelievable, and their searchlights probed the sky after dark. Rainham's Air Raid Siren was on the roof of a building on the corner of Holding Street, and H.M.Dockyard as an apprentice marine engineer. its wailing notes sent us into our Anderson shelters most nights.

of the war. Our 'lessons' were "Gardening", "Games". made for the fallibility of memory with the passage of "Singing", and listening to read - out stories!

Nearly all the Rainham children were evacuated to Llanharran, in Glamorgan, (South Wales), or elsewhere. When they returned, many had acquired strong Welsh accents!

Then came the Blitz. I well remember looking at a dark blood red glow in the pitch black night sky, and hearing some grown-up say "Cor!! London's really copping it tonight" Incendiary bombs dropped all around, in Century Road, and Roberts Road, and Mr Milburn demonstrated to villagers how to deal with them, using a stirrup pump, shovel, and sand. There was an Air Raid Wardens Post, almost buried in the grass verge by the Main Road, between Roberts Road and Berengrave Lane. It was permanently manned, and its telephone never stopped ringing. We boys cycled out to Detling Aerodrome one afternoon and were delighted to see Hawker Hurricanes parked within touching distance along the lane, but vigilant RAF sentries kept us moving on. Unknown to us they had recently been bombed, with great loss of life. The skies were full of aircraft, often doing battle overhead. You could see bombs falling out of the aircraft, and watch white parachutes opening high up in the blue sky. Overnight, all boys changed their minds: They now wanted to be fighter pilots, dreams of being cowboys vanished. At school all the younger male teachers disappeared

into the armed forces, to be replaced by tired, elderly men recalled from retirement. Then soon after, women teachers appeared, most of them unable to keep order! Everybody's education became sadly lacking, to the

point of non existence.




