A picture, taken in 1905, of The Mulberry Tree Inn on the Lower Rainham Road just before the Yokosuka Way roundabout. According to the Kent History Forum The Mulberry Tree beer house opened before 1872, and got its name from a Mulberry Tree that grew in the garden. It was probably opened to serve men building forts in the area. Before the sea wall was built on the nearby river bank the pub often flooded at spring tides. When it closed in 1973 it was the last beer house in the area. The Mulberry Tree was never licensed to sell spirits it was an ale house only. See the letter on page 2 'Sharps Green Mission'.

Having just spent a few days in Cheshire I begin to realise how fortunate we are living in the south of England. It was dark by 4.15pm and sunrise was not until 8.38am and that at a location a mere three hour train journey north. The years roll by so quickly it does not seem possible it is 2016 already - it only seems yesterday we were all celebrating the turn of the century and the fact we had not all been wiped out by the 'millennium bug'. But here we are and commemorating the hundred years since that terrible year 1916. A war that had begun eighteen months before with such optimism and certainty that it would be short lived was bogged down sticks in the memory, and that I just had to examine in awful trench warfare on the battlefields of France. SHARPS GREEN MISSION

Dear Editor

My father was born in Mulberrytree Cottages, and my family lived in Grange Road near Ladds Corner, so we know the area well, but typically, have no photos. All I can offer is a few memories, as my two sisters and I attended Sunday School at the Sharps Green Mission in the early 1950's, as did quite a few children from the vicinity of Ladds Corner - the Hewlett boys and Bowman girls among them. At that time classes were taken by Miss Lewis, a grey haired lady who was a teacher at Woodlands Secondary School. We would each be given a sticker with a picture and Bible verse referring to the subject of the morning's lesson. My sister recalls that children's lessons were held in the side room of the building, and that we went into the chapel part for special events - on Mother's Day we would receive a daffodil to take home. The chapel had a carpet down the middle and an altar cloth embroidered by Joan Stedman, the owner of Grange Farm, who had connections with St Mary's Gillingham, the mother church for the mission. My sister also remembers going to a weekday club there, run by Marie Perry. On one occasion, nobody arrived with a key to unlock the building, so one of the boys, probably Eric Hewlett, ran all the way to an address near Plantation Road for the key, ran back, then had to recover - flaked out from the effort. My sisters and I walked home from Sunday School, along the Lower Rainham Road then up Lower Eastcourt Lane by Mudge's Farm, with its cows in the barns around the farmyard, now converted into residences. At the entrance to the vard was a very large (to my young eyes) smooth stone with bowl shaped hollows worn into it - the sort of object that each time we passed it.

and were frightened to see what to us was a rampaging bull in the road - and my eldest sister was wearing a red coat! Until it was ushered away, we took refuge in the front garden of the nearest house, which would have afforded little protection, as the garden wall was barely more than a foot high!

Cottages) went to whist drives there, along with others from the Grange/Ladds Corner/Lower Twydall area. In those days, Grange was a country hamlet between the towns of Gillingham and Rainham. Many of the residents were longstanding, and related to each other by birth or marriage. The older folk regarded themselves as living in Grange, aware of its links to the river (it was once a Cinque Port), and felt quite separate from the towns. The population was quite small, so it was commendable that Twydall Mission provided a service to the locality at a time when the only other amenities were probably the Mulberrytree and Hastings Arms at one end, and the Three Mariners at the other.

After the destruction of the building the only remains for some years was the low wall along the site beside the lane to Sharps Green. The gap through which we entered still had a metal arch over it, with a light fitting at the apex. There is now no sign of the wall or the arch beneath the undergrowth.

THE FINAL FAREWELL - WWII EVACUEES Dear Editor.

On 11th November the WWII Medway Evacuees club held its last meeting in the St Margaret's Millennium Centre, attended by special guest Councillor Barry Kemp, the Mayor of Medway. Catering was provided by Sunflower Catering and the entertainment by that very excellent local vocalist Trevor Styles. The club "Families and Associates of Medway Evacuees (FAME)" was first formed in 2011, some three months after its forerunner, "Medway Evacuees Reunion Group (MERG)", closed its doors. The latter was established in 1999 and had a very successful run of 11 years, thanks to a hard working committee, but eventually a lack of volunteer committee members made it impossible to continue. FAME established itself with about 120 of the original members, under a new name and with a new committee.

It was always considered that the age of members would be a stumbling block in coming years. Hence, it was hoped that widening the scope of membership, by opening it up to family members and those people interested in evacuation, would extend its life. For a couple of years, partly thanks to Action Forum for publishing a letter in May 2013 this happened.

However the age of the evacuee members has caught

up with us and, with a dwindling membership, it was considered by the committee to 'go out with a flourish rather than simply fade away with a whimper'. So, to all those who supported FAME, to those 'leading lights' who established the first club in 1999 and to the members of the committee, a big Thank You. The motto of FAME was "Renewing old friendships and building new ones, which is exactly what happened during the past 16 years or so. That said, the members bid you all a final farewell. **Bob Davis**

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR DECEMBER

It was just before Christmas Eve of last year that I visited the Isle of Harty, which is part of the larger Isle of Sheppey. I took the flyover bridge across The Swale and headed for Leysdown-on-Sea, but then turned right at the sign for Harty Ferry Inn. I paused on the high ground near Capel Hill farm. From my elevated position I could see most of the Isle of Harty, a short stretch of The Swale and, on the horizon, the low, grey line of the North Downs. Wheat and oil seed rape are grown on the higher ground of Harty, whilst beef cattle and sheep are grazed on the low lying marshes. Below me was Capel Fleet which separates the Isle of Harty from the rest of Sheppey. It is one of the best places in the country at which to see over-wintering birds of prey. At dusk, the Fleet offers the spectacle of marsh and hen harriers gathering for their large, communal winter roost in reed beds, which they often share with merlins. To see so many raptors in one place, at the same time, is one of the country's great natural winter marvels. I recommenced my journey downhill towards Capel Fleet and along the narrow road towards Harty Ferry. I stopped again at Pump Hill where there is a specially constructed viewing mound, overlooking the reed beds where the raptors roost, I would be returning to Pump Hill at dusk. There were a couple of seasoned bird watchers on the mound, both well wrapped up and each standing behind a telescope on a tripod. Upon enquiring what was to be seen, I was directed towards a merlin on top of a hawthorn bush, a group of seven cranes feeding on the edge of a field and a rough legged buzzard sitting on a post. The latter bird would be spending its winter in this country and would have bred above the Arctic Circle, where it would have been strongly dependant on lemmings. Here, it would be feeding mobbed by a resident common buzzard and driven off. headed for the parish church of St Thomas, Harty. One 8pm. "Always a Popular Service" the poster noted. The church was decorated with holly and ivy and

would be lit, during the service, by oil lamps and candles. From the high ground of the graveyard there are views down the coast, past Whitstable and Herne Bay and as far as the twin towers of the former Reculver Church. As I left, a robin sang a melancholy song from its perch on the much eroded gravestone of Sarah, the wife of Odadiah White. I drove the short distance to The Harty Ferry Inn. Before calling in for refreshment, I strolled down to the edge of the causeway from which the ferry boat used to ply across The Swale. The tide was in and there were hundreds of lapwing, curlew, godwits and other waders huddled among clumps of sea purslane, on the saltings, attempting to escape the winds. It was only when I was returning to the Ferry Inn that I noticed thousands of wood pigeons perching in hawthorn bushes on the steep cliff of London Clay that rises above the saltings along The Swale. All the birds were facing towards the sun and into the wind. It seems likely that many of these wood pigeons were visitors from mainland Europe. The species is, along with the rabbit, the main enemy of arable farmers. Both have an enormous appetite for the leaves of emerging oil seed rape plants, acres of which were growing on the island. The raptors I had come to see begin to congregate above Capel Fleet from about an hour before sunset and it was time for me to leave the warmth and comfort of the Ferry Inn and face the bitterly cold wind blowing across the top of the viewing platform. By the time I arrived, the mound sported a forest of tripods and thick, woolly hats. The harriers soon began to fly in, from various directions, criss-crossing each other's flight paths over the communal roost site in the reed beds of Capel Fleet. We also watched a mixed flock of lapwing and golden plover flying in to roost on nearby Harty grazing marshes. Ground roosting birds come together so as to warn each other about the presence of predators such as foxes. By the time that the sun had set behind the North Downs and left a pale, red glow in the sky, the spectacular was almost over. The prevailing opinion on the mound was that fifteen marsh harriers and one lone hen harrier had moved into the roosting place or were on the verge of doing so. The last of the customers for lunch at the Ferry Inn were driving past us, heading for home, some doubtless bemused by the sight of so many people muffled up as if for the South Pole. Having




