The Co-operative Society Shop at the top of Station Road, Rainham as it would have been in 1924. Kemp Brothers built the shop in the early 1900s for the newly formed Society. The canopy to allow elaborate outside displays of produce was added later but suffered badly in the terrible whirlwind, described by David Wood on page 8, and was subsequently demolished. In the 1960s the store was converted to a small supermarket and closed when the Co-op moved across the road and traded from 1979 - 1997 in their new large store (now Wilko) part of Rainham Shopping Centre. This building still stands converted to Lloyds and a Betting Shop downstairs with flats above.

THE MULBERRYTREE

Dear Editor

I was interested to see the photo of The Mulberrytree on the front cover of the Jan/Feb edition of Action Forum. Readers may be interested in the names of the people shown in the photo. The list was made by a late uncle, so I have no way of confirming the accuracy of any except my great grandfather and his grandson. Left to Right 1 Tom Mannering, 2 Ted Ledger, 3 Jim Morrison, 4 Jim Jackman (Tiger), 5 Jim Brown, 11 James Thorlby - licensee's grandson (the dog on the right?!) A clue to the likely date of the photo is that there Thorlby born in Medway district - at Hoo in 1903. Assuming this refers to the same person, the photo would have been taken rather later than 1905. For the eagle-eyed, a correction to note in my account of Sharps Green Mission: the two references to Mulberrytree Cottages should in fact read Mulberrytree Place cottages. The actual Mulberrytree Cottages, about 20 yards from the pub, were also were only a few houses in the hamlet, but most of them had some family connection!

Reference the interesting article by Richard Church (October Action Forum) Memories of World War II -The verdict at the time on the Messerschmidt 109 in Hartlip churchyard, he refers to, it was not shot down but ran out of fuel so crash landed. This was frequently the case with the Messerschmidt 109 and 110. After arriving from Europe they had about 20 minutes fuel for combat before they had to return the way they had come. It was a big worry for Luftwaffe pilots they would not have enough fuel to cross the Channel and would have to ditch.

My father delivering grocery orders for Rainham Co-ops customers in Hartlip walked through the churchyard next day for a close-up look. A surprise was the plane had only knocked down or damaged two or three headstones. Even more surprising was the tyres on the wheels and the cockpit lighting and bulbs were all made by well known British companies

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR JANUARY / FEBRUARY Seasalter, to the west of Whitstable, is one of those places that I return to time and time again. It is a place of mudflats, shingle beach, sea wall, grazing marshes and wide open sky. Summer memories are of sailing dinghies, picnics on the beach, ice cream at Walden's shop, the cries of redshank and oyster catcher, blue skies and vellow horned poppies. Winter memories are of dog walkers, bait diggers, locked-up beach huts, waders in spectacular massed flight, skeins of brent geese and cold easterly winds. Seasalter is approached via Faversham, Goodnestone and Graveney. After Denley Hill Farm, the Graveney Marshes and the distant sea wall come into view. On the landward side of the wall are the former coast guard cottages and a few other isolated buildings. It was on a cold but sunny January day that I visited Seasalter. I took some steps up the sea wall near Seasalter Sailing Club. On this occasion the tide was in. A small flock of brent geese were riding up and down in the choppy sea, waiting for the tide to go out when they could feed on eel grass. A few turnstones were running up and down the tide line looking for sand hoppers and small molluses among the seaweed and flotsam. Turnstones are relatively tame and can often be seen at Whitstable Harbour where they rummage among cockle shells that have just been processed and discarded. Whitstable is of course synonymous with oysters and oyster catchers are common sight in Whitstable Bay. The large black and white waders have powerful bills. They typically open oysters, as well as cockles, by stabbing the muscle that holds the two shells of the molluscs together.

The landward view from the sea wall is of the marshes of the Sealsalter Levels. They are divided into fields delineated by drainage ditches lined with common reed. I could see a flock of lapwing wheeling above the Levels. Salt was once produced on what were then saltings, by means of evaporation of sea water. However, in the early 14th century, the monks at Christchurch Priory at Canterbury built the first sea walls and reclaimed the saltings for the grazing of livestock. The Levels are still grazed by cattle and

sheep and are a breeding ground for skylark, meadow pipit, reed warbler, yellow wagtail, redshank and lapwing. During the winter months Walden's shop is open for just three hours a day. Through the windows I spotted beach balls and buckets and spades, among other seaside necessities, for which there would be little demand, however, until the summer months. The chalet next to the shop displayed a notice that Poppet's Cafe and Tea Room had had a successful first year and that it would be reopening at the beginning of March 2016. That was good news. I commenced my walk along the sea wall in the direction of Faversham. The Kent Wildlife Trust's South Swale Nature Reserve begins just beyond the beach huts near to The Old Sportsman Public House and Restaurant. There is a long stretch of wellestablished shingle on which grow various species of lichens and stonecrops, as well as larger plants that can withstand the salty atmosphere. I came across clumps of sea beet which is a large straggly perennial and is a close relative of certain cultivated beets. Still in flower were a number of sea mayweeds, which are members of the daisy family. I noted dead yellow horned poppies and carline thistles, the latter of which have vellow bracts in the form of rays and which are used in dead flower arrangements. Blowing about in the wind were the bleached skeletons of sea holly plants. The seeds of dead flowers on the shingle attract snow buntings in the winter but I saw none. I did however disturb a flock of linnets. I try not to disrupt feeding birds, especially in the winter, but they took me by surprise.

In due course I came to Castle Coote, which is an area of salt marsh, on the seaward edge of which is a semicircular cockle bank. Hundreds of redshank and dunlin were huddled down out of the wind, waiting for the tide to go out. Ringed plovers and oyster catchers nest on the shingle in the spring and Kent Wildlife Trust discourages people from straying into the area. Unfortunately, the greatest disturbance comes from predators. Eggs and young birds can be lost to foxes, gulls and carrion crows. In the middle of the Swale were Horse Sands, onto which, in summer, common seals haul themselves. On the opposite bank of the Swale, were Harty Ferry Inn and Harty Parish Church.

Looking inland, over the Graveney Marshes, I spotted injury by taking shelter in a doorway just as chimney two marsh harriers, soaring lazily in the sky. The harriers feed on small mammals and birds and various small reptiles and amphibians. They nest in the reed beds of the watercourses of the marshes. In the distance was the delicate spire of Faversham Parish Church. It was soon time to turn round and head back towards The Old Sportsman, where some patrons were the window when the upper part was blown in and the doubtless enjoying beef or lamb raised on the Seasalter Levels. Hungry as I was, I had to wait until I arrived back at home before I could enjoy my own

the semi darkness of the late afternoon sky. Meanwhile, because of torrential rain people sheltered under the veranda of the Co-Operative Stores at the top end of Station Road. The force of the whirlwind lifted the roof of the building from its supports which caused panic amongst people sheltering underneath

The whirlwind destroyed both chimney stacks on Ramsey House and on Mrs Kitney's house almost opposite Longley Road. Debris loudly crashed onto the road and pavement while bricks were hurled through the air and smashed windows and landed on the roofs of other houses nearby. A house owned by Mrs Kitchingham had its roof lifted and a chimney pot blew off and went through a greenhouse while another house belonging to Mrs Clark also had the chimney stacks destroyed. Mrs Clark's parents who were in the house were left terrified by the violent commotion. As Mr Shepherd of 38 Station Road stood at his front gate he was sucked into the air, hurled across the road and thrown down by the force of the whirlwind. He only suffered a cut wrist but others were not so lucky like Donald Ede who worked for grocer George Ouinnell. While driving a horse and cart packed with groceries down the top end of Station Road the terrifying force of the whirlwind caused the horse to bolt and crash the cart into a lamp post. The cart turned over, the shafts were snapped and groceries were strewn across the road and ruined in the heavy rain while Donald Ede was thrown onto the road and


