This 1880 drawing of Bloors Place on the Lower Rainham Road was made by Miss Walter, possibly a daughter of 'Squire Walter' a local magistrate who farmed the 540 acres of Berengrave Farm and lived at Berengrove House with his four daughters, where they were attended by a staff of six (housekeeper, cook, three housemaids and a coachman). A photograph of Bloors Place taken in the 1990s shows little changed between 1880 and 1990 - a fanlight added over the front door, some alterations to the upstairs windows, and replacement of the 'missing' chimney pots. During the Second World War S.W. Fleming lived in the house and a family from New Zealand lodged in the attic. In 1950 a well known television personality Willoughby Gray bought the property and became a popular customer of the Three Mariners. See page 3.

Editorial A few good frosty mornings are just what is needed to

help the natural world. January so far has fully obliged! In recent decades our weather patterns have rocketed from one extreme to the other but lately we seem to have had far more comparatively warm, frost free winters than is our fair share. We need a good cold snap to kill off the bugs and pests and also to kick start the annual cycle of the fruit trees. To date it has been ideal as far as I am concerned. Very cold minus temperatures overnight, sometimes with a snow white covering on the grass and car, but the sun has risen and sufficiently warmed the car windscreen before I need to leave home so no ice scraping has been required. However driving in sunshine at this time of year has its down side, the sun is so low that my car visors do not block out the rays, a slight bend in the road and you are suddenly driving straight into the sun which virtually blinds you. Extreme care is needed but at least everyone is in the same situation so realises why you are creeping along at five miles an hour. I must admit though I am quite relieved when I have to drive any distance if it is a cloudy day. Recently I set off to drive west along the M2 on a sunny day but thought 'That's OK I am driving with the sun behind me' but what I had not factored into the equation was the sun shining straight into my wing mirrors so they were useless - it made overtaking interesting, I had not realised how much I rely on them. It reminded me of the days when wing mirrors were optional extras when you bought a new car and to save costs we either managed without them or purchased only one for the drivers side, as that was all that we considered necessary. Having recently bought a new car the optional extras now seem rather more sophisticated, sat-nay, a special coating to help with car cleaning or fancy boy racer looking wheels but in thirty years perhaps we will also consider these essentials. The RSPB would like your help with their annual Big Garden Birdwatch. Over the weekend of January 28th & 29th you are asked to spare an hour to count the birds you see in your garden (local park or woodland). It is not the total number but how many of each kind are visible at any one time. It is an interesting exercise but I have a very limited knowledge so I am not sure my recording is too accurate - most little brown birds are marked down as sparrows, although I think maybe the sleeker ones that scurry around on the grass are possibly dunnocks. I also do my watching from the

kitchen window as I wash up, so the hour is certainly not continuous. However having experimented one year it made little difference to the overall count whether I watched continuously or broke up the time into sections. To find out more about the Big Garden Birdwatch and the RSPB see www.rspb.org.uk The days are getting longer – we won't notice much difference for a couple of weeks but by our next issue at the end of February signs of spring should be in the air. In this time of instant communication by phone, text or one of the many social media sites it is difficult to imagine the immensity of the time consuming task a team manager had to assemble his players ninety years ago!

BLOORS PLACE

Bloors Place stands on the Lower Rainham Road, not far from the riverside and Bloors Wharf, which was known in earlier times as Blowers Ouay. The quay. and Bloors Place, take their name from the family of le Bloere or le Blore. The house, one of the oldest in Medway, was originally built between 1470 and 1510. Once a simple Wealden hall house, a stone range was added to the rear in the early 16th century, perhaps at the same time as the very large central octagonal chimney was inserted. These improvements were probably made when Christopher Bloor lived there. According to Hasted, Christopher Bloor, who had bought the Manor of Sileham from Sir Antony St Leger, 'rebuilt his seat in this parish....in which his ancestors had resided for several generations'. The house was surrounded by walls with defensive apertures known as gun loops, and also special niches, bee boles, to hold the straw skeps where the bees were kept.

Like most old houses, Bloors Place has been frequently altered and extended. In 1710 the front was refurbished. The building was damaged by a fire in the eighteenth century and 'A great part of the old mansion was pulled down circa 1798 or earlier to adapt the size of it to that of a farmhouse, though what still remains of it, with the garden walls, offices, and so on show it to have been of large size, well suited to the hospitality of those times, and to the rank which the founder of it, Christopher Bloor, esq., held among the gentry of the county'. [Kent on line - Parish Clerk. The house came indirectly into the ownership of the Tuftons, Earls of Thanet, through Bloor's daughter, Olympia. The Tufton surname is commemorated by monuments to two descendants in St Margaret's Church at Rainham: the chapel at the end of the north aisle (officially St John's Chapel) is often called 'The Tufton Chapel'. An 1851 survey of Sir Richard Tufton's Bloors Place estate describes the house, rooms and all the outbuildings in some detail. It then goes on to make comments on the fields (there were 447 acres of arable, pasture and orchard), and records that the tenant, William Smart, was highly respectable and from the appearance of his farm, stock, etc. a man of substantial property (Holley).

From 1891 a Scotsman named James Stewart had been running the farm, and in 1920 he bought the whole estate for £25,000. It has changed hands several times since then - when last sold the price was nearly thirty

times that sum. According to some recent sale particulars 'The property still boasts a wealth of character features including a heavily timbered interior with feature crown posts and 16th century moulded stone mullion windows to the rear, panelled drawing room and a first floor landing with detail enriched spandrels and moulded stops above the doorway'. The agent at an earlier sale also mentioned 'the delightful wall paintings of fairy tale scenes from the 1950s in one of the bedrooms.'

Since then new owners have partly modernised the interior, putting in another staircase, reordering the kitchen and converting an outbuilding to a utility room for example, but any such alterations to a listed building have to be done following detailed planning consultation. Currently planning permission is being sought for exterior changes such as replacing a flat roof with a pitched roof more in keeping with the original house, and also adding a second dormer window at the front. Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR DECEMBER In December I visited two neighbouring parishes, on the north Kent grazing marshes, between Sittingbourne and Faversham. They were Oare and Luddenham. The two parishes are different in character and I visited them for largely different reasons. I travelled along Watling Street and turned left for Oare just before Ospringe. Oare Creek is home to yachts and other boats, almost all laid up during Winter, and the village thus has a nautical air about it. I motored down Harty Ferry Road and stopped at the car park of Oare Marshes Nature Reserve, which is managed by Kent Wildlife Trust. I climbed onto the embankment overlooking The Swale and the site of the former Harty Ferry. During a visit I made there in the Summer, I ate my sandwiches in the sunshine, watching the clouds and the Thames sailing barge Greta glide silently and slowly by. On the day of my December visit there was a bitterly cold wind blowing and my plan was to take lunch in The Three Mariners at Oare. I came to the reserve in order to have my first sight of the ducks and waders from the Northern Hemisphere and elsewhere that spend their Winter months there.

I set off along the embankment in the direction of Whitstable with the aim of walking round the perimeter of the reserve. The muddy water of The Swale was topped by small white waves which were whipped up by the wind. The reserve consists of grazing marsh, open water "scrapes" and dykes of fresh and brackish water. Konic horses, with their backs to the wind, were feeding there. Their grazing leaves areas of tussocky grass which are ideal sites for ground nesting birds like redshanks and vellow wagtails. At the junction between The Swale and Faversham Creek I headed up the creek. In the distance I could see the tall, thin spire of Faversham Church and the chimney of Shepherd Neame's brewery. In due course I turned inland and came to the main hide overlooking the "scrapes". The birds in view were either in the water and sheltering from the wind behind reed covered islands or, if on land and in the open, standing with their heads facing into the

wind. They included ducks such as pintail, shoveller, tufted duck and widgeon. There were also waders such as dunlin, knot, black tailed godwit and lapwing. I finally arrived back on Harty Ferry Road down which I headed towards the car park. From the road I had another view of the birds on the "scrapes"; separated from the road by a sturdy fence, they feel safe from pedestrians and bird watchers using their cars as hides. Sailing and bird watching bring many people to Oare but visitors would be very much thinner on the ground at my next port of call.

After a hearty lunch I left Oare and drove through Bysing Wood, which is situated on a ridge overlooking Luddenham Marshes. I turned down a steep, hollow lane which leads onto the marshes. Erosion of the banks of the lane had exposed the roots of oak and coppiced sweet chestnut trees growing in the wood above. I, for one, would not want to walk up or down that ancient lane on a dark, windy night. There is no village in the parish of Luddenham, just three hamlets and a few scattered farm houses and cottages. The population is less than 200. The largest hamlet is Luddenham Court, which consists of a manor house, a farm and a church. Ignoring modern barns which house beef cattle in winter, the age of the buildings at the Court range from the mid 12th century to the early 19th century. They overlook almost 900 acres of marshes, the fields on which are of various shapes and sizes. Their boundaries are mostly in the form of natural watercourses or man-made ditches which both drain the marshes and contain livestock. The grazing and arable land was created, from medieval times onwards, from what were once salt marshes and estuary mud, by the building of embankments which kept out the sea.

The Stevens family has farmed this ancient landscape since the late 19th century when Ashley Stevens bought the Court. He was a noted sheep breeder who also grew hops, fruit, wheat and root crops. His granddaughter now runs the farm and rears beef cattle, sheep and pigs along traditional lines. There is a butcher's shop on the farm, a visit to which was the main purpose, on this occasion, of my coming to the Court. I did however take the opportunity of having a walk around the farm. I came across a flock of house

sparrows feeding on the seeds of hav in the cattle barns. I noted a flock of lapwing wheeling over the marshes. They may have been disturbed by a raptor, perhaps a peregrine. A farm employee told me that barn owls continue to nest in a recess in the east gable. The annual Empire Day celebrations in May helped end of the 12th century church. The birds can sometimes be seen in the early mornings, as can a little owl. Regular services are no longer held at the church but it remains consecrated and is in the care of The Churches Conservation Trust. Happily, the primary school, much extended, is still open. It sits, surrounded by fields, in close proximity to The Old School House, The Old Rectory and an old VR redpainted letter box. It was saved by its good reputation and by its close proximity, by car, to Davington and Faversham.

RAINHAM AT WAR in 1917

With a British naval blockade in progress the German retaliated with unrestricted submarine warfare to starve Britain out of the war. Meanwhile, as in the previous two years the war effort in Rainham continued with fund raising and war related activities along with news of casualties from the battle front. The year began with heavy snow as Mrs Perry of Rainham Congregational Church entertained soldiers billeted in Rainham in the church school. Later in February the formation of the Food Production Society took place in an effort to utilize available ground in the parish for food production. George Quinnell from Broad Walk chaired the society that wanted to cultivate every available piece of land. The parish council wanted four acres of land to cultivate and later in the year they purchased a potato sprayer and six cases of chemical spray in preparation for this. Boys of the Church of England School in Station Road enrolled for National Service to assist with digging gardens for widows and wives of servicemen whose husbands were fighting in the war. Mr Wilson who worked as a master at the school gave advice to people about how to plant seeds and potatoes while a lecture given by Mr W A Milliard from the Agricultural Department of Leeds University about planting took place in the Church Hall

The Kent Fortress Royal Engineers stationed in Hartlip organised a whist drive and dance at the Council School to raise money on behalf of St Bart's Hospital while a war savings meeting took place in the

church hall to form a war savings association. This led to other associations being formed in different parts of the parish. Rainham Congregational Church had one of the most successful associations with 26 members. raise nationalistic pride as people assembled in the playground of the Church of England School in Station Road while pupils and teachers paraded in front of them. The Union Jack flew from the church tower. Reverend Tamplin began with prayers, the Union Jack saluted and a verse from the National Anthem sung. Certificates were then distributed to pupils. Mrs Webster presented these to the boys, Miss Walter to the girls and Mrs Wakeley to the infants. After this cheers were given for the empire, the Queen, the Royal Family, soldiers, sailors and airmen. June began with the Food Economy Exhibition at the Council School organised by Mr Mattocks and opened by Lady Callaghan, wife of Admiral Superintendent at the Nore. Money raised from the exhibition was donated to Fort Pitt Hospital in Chatham, Money raising continued in July with a Bandage Day in aid of the War Hospital Supply Guild and the well-attended event raised £4/10/0d.

Throughout the year regular news arrived about fatalities and casualties at the battle front. In January Joseph Drain aged 24 of Layfield Road, Gillingham died in action. He had previously lived in Station Road Rainham where his parents owned a greengrocer's shop and had attended the National School in Station Road. Better news revealed that Sergeant-Major Raynor Swan aged 27 and formerly of Ivy Street had been mentioned in despatches for his brayery. Six years before the war he travelled to Australia and joined the army in 1914. He had fought in Gallipoli and Egypt and had been wounded in the head and poisoned by barbed wire. After Gallipoli he went to France where he became a sergeant-major. Sir Douglas Haig mentioned him in despatches for bravery on the battlefield. David Wood




