Rainham Church School at the top of Station Road viewed from the churchyard which Joe Ennis visits in Nature Notes on page 8. The central section was built as the National School with public subscription (£685 7s 3d) in 1846. Two extensions were added: the boys school to the north in 1878 and the infants to the south in 1884. The Headmasters quarters were adapted for the girls and the lower schoolroom became Rainham's first Church Hall. The building was used as the first Rainham Community Centre in the 1960s when the schools moved to the adapted secondary school buildings in Orchard Street (made redundant by the newly constructed Howard and Rainham School for Girls). The old school was demolished in 1977 when the Rainham Precinct construction finally began and the Station Oast building was converted to a new Community Centre. Our front cover picture created some interest last month as trains always do! I am reliably informed that the train has 1st class Pullman carriages. See "PULLMAN" above the windows of the first carriage. The engine would have taken the train to Dover Marine where it was loaded onto a ferry for Calais. Victoria to Calais Nord took 8 hours. This service is not to be confused with the "Golden Arrow" which also left from Victoria but which went to Folkestone for the crossing. We have also received an interesting article from John Tippins (see page 9) who, as a boy, knew the Wakeleys Granary and Oast House building well as he visited it when helping his father with his agricultural supply business. This Rainham landmark still remains and the current leadership of the Community Centre, which now occupies the building, are keen to record its history while it is still possible. The old school at the top of Station Road was much loved and many were sorry to see the demolition of this memorable landmark to make way for the new shopping precinct in 1977. However by that time the building was in a very poor state of repair having been vacated by the school some ten years earlier and co-opted as a stand in Community Centre while fund raising allowed the purchase and conversion of the Station Oast complex. Little had been spent on maintaining this temporary home as it was only expected to be for a couple of years at the most. So it went and was quickly replaced by the large Co-op Supermarket and other shops and offices. The Co-op traded for twenty years before finally conceding to Tescos greater power and the shop then went through a series of traders and substantial periods standing empty until finally opening as Wilkinsons (now known as Wilkos) giving Rainham shopping centre a new lease of life. There are still people around who remember the big old elm tree in the front playground of the old school, the outside iron staircase the boys had to climb to their Stalls now booking for the Hempstead Village Fayre lessons, the allotment gardens the children tended behind the building, the steps down into the cavernous Sunday 21st May, 11.30am - 4.30pm. hall used for Sunday school and Guide and Brownie meetings and the sounds and smell of the adjacent butchers shop particularly on pig slaughter days.

Happy memories for many.

The clocks have sprung forward, the weather is warming up and more spring flowers appear in gardens and woodland every day so now is the time to get out and enjoy this beautiful time of year. Have a good month - we will be with you again in May.

The site is next to the Three Sisters public house, Otterham Quay Lane, and just inside Upchurch parish. Nine months ago the developers, Matthew Homes Ltd., put forward a number of naming suggestions to Upchurch Parish Council. After a series of emails, four names have been chosen. These are Eastwood Meadow, Woods Edge, Butcher's Green and Ouilters Yard.

four names, which I did after some very basic research.

I found, Josephs Edward Butcher came from Frindsbury and owned several sites including at one time. Four Gun Field.

John Woods came from Singlewell, Gravesend and owned brickfields in Lower Halstow. John Francis Eastwood was the driving force in the

area suggesting a merger with himself, Joseph Butcher, Frederick Quilter, Josiah Jackson, Charles Richardson and John Woods as Eastwood's Ltd. Frederick Ouilter came from Belstead, Suffolk, It would appear that no one checked these names for the new development and by the time I made my feelings and research known, I was told it was too late Upchurch Parish Council had agreed with Matthew Homes and the details provided to Swale Borough Council Naming Department, run by Mid Kent. The GIS Operative & Street Naming and Numbering Officer for the Council Naming Department, made it very clear, nothing was going to change. I was told everything had been checked by a historian, which turns out to be someone working for Matthew Homes in Potters Bar, Hertfordshire.

It is a great shame that the new development does not reflect the history of the area. In years to come, the new residents will ask about the names, so I hope someone will keep a copy of Action Forum.



Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR MARCH

In a previous Notes I wrote about spring and summer in St Margaret's churchyard. In this month's Notes I write about autumn and winter. Summer flowers that were still in bloom in autumn included toadflax. autumn hawkbit (like a dandelion with small, bright vellow flowers), herb robert and red clover. A cluster of fleabane flowers were in bloom on the north wall of the churchyard; they are like daisies and are a garden escapee. The flowers of the ivy plant appear in early autumn; they are rich in nectar and pollen. I noted a host of wasps, bees, flies and bugs and a late-flying red admiral butterfly, all of which had been attracted to the sweet feast. There was a good crop of nuts, fruit and berries for the birds in autumn. They included holm oak acorns; small, round, yellow crab apples; rose hips; yew berries and holly berries. Jays could occasionally be seen sneaking into the churchyard for the acorns. Although the seeds of yew berries are poisonous, the fleshy parts are eaten avidly by thrushes, blackbirds and finches, particularly green finches. The latter delicately discard the seeds and eat only the pulp. Thrushes and blackbirds eat the berries whole, but do not digest the seeds, which are excreted. When nobody is about, the wood pigeons pluck up courage to descend onto the holly trees and devour the berries. They can often be seen, flapping about, trying to keep their balance on the extremities of the holly branches. By the onset of winter, the holly berries had been largely eaten but, fortuitously, the ivy berries had by then turned black and were ripe. The "conkers" that fall from the horse chestnut trees are no longer keenly sought by local children. It would appear that anything powered by batteries has a greater attraction.

Nevertheless, grown-ups by the hundreds congregated at the World Conker Championships, in October 2016, at the Shuckborough Arms near Oundle,

Northamptonshire.

The churchyard was not without some colour, even in the winter. Two ornamental cherry trees were in blossom, as was a viburnam bush. A group of stinking iris (or gladdon) plants, under the veteran vew tree. sported strings of brilliant orange seeds. The plant is

widely naturalised in churchyards, having been used, in the past, in winter, as grave-top bouquets and in church flower arrangements. There were a number of lichens growing on the tombs and gravestones, the most common one being of a yellowy orange colour and with a Latin name that is both difficult to pronounce and remember. Lichens are slow growing and, in a churchyard, are usually left undisturbed to grow larger and larger over the centuries. The majority of lichens prefer an unpolluted and sunny habitat. I noted a number of species of small and delicate ferns growing in the churchyard walls. They included maidenhair spleenwort, common polypody and rusty back. By the end of January, the ripe berries had been largely stripped from the growth of ivy in the churchyard and there were few birds feeding there. I did however disturb a blue tit that was feeding on fat in a half coconut suspended from a tree branch overlooking the cremation garden. A very thoughtful gesture by an unknown person! A robin's sweet, whistling notes could sometimes be heard, even on dark winter days. Strong winds had brought down the drey of leaves, built by a grey squirrel on a branch of one of the horse chestnut trees. High on the top of a neighbouring tree, the nest of a carrion crow, built of sticks and reinforced by mud, was intact. I was reminded of the fairy tale of three little pigs. I noticed a long, narrow track in the grass of the church yard, formed by the nightly perambulation by a fox of his territory. The track started near the Millennium Centre and appeared to be a short cut to the enticing smells emanating from the restaurant kitchens of the lower High Street. The first snowdrops and crocuses appeared in February on the grave of the Reverend Clifford, a previous Vicar of St Margaret's and, later, there was a good display of daffodils throughout the churchyard as a whole. As winter drew to an end. birds such as blackbird, hedge sparrow, wren and great tit, began to sing at dawn or dusk, in either the churchyard itself or in adjoining areas. Even the wood pigeons were joining in with their gruff coos. The horse chestnut trees were covered in sticky buds and. under them, the green shoots of lesser celandines were appearing. Spring was on its way. I cannot leave the subject of St Margaret's churchyard without saying

The trunk of the tree has split imported maize when it was available all milled to into four parts, each supporting branches. Two make a cheap low grade poultry and pig food. Rabbits massive branches, growing from the base of the trunk fell to the ground some years ago but remained attached to the trunk and continue to flourish. the tree is over 1,400 years old. That takes it back to about the time that St Augustine landed in Kent, in AD 597, with the aim of converting the country's Anglo Saxons to Christianity. It seems that the yew is not only older than the existing church building, but also older than the earlier Anglo Saxon and Norman Joe Ennis

WAKELEY'S GRANERY AND MILL IN THE OAST HOUSE RAINHAM

I was interested in the letter in March AF appealing for information about the Station Oast House. After WWII my father returned to his second profession as a shopkeeper, having worked through the war as a precision engineer. He had joined Gillingham Co-op as a salesman in the greengrocery and animal feed shop in Balmoral Road and established contacts around the area when he returned to take care of my grandfather. So in the early 1950s he left engineering and began building a business around animal feed, garden supplies and floristry. Animal feed was still on ration and there were problems getting and selling these items. You had to get animal keepers to register with you before you had anything to sell because you had to show their ration books to buy the goods. Floristry and garden supplies were also difficult so establishing a new business was a slow process and there may have been a bit of "black market" in those early days. Soon Dad learnt to drive and we got a van to go to local mills for feed products, Wakeleys sold crushed oats, layers meal and pellets and fertilizer, specifically 'National Growmore'. These items were still rationed and at 13 years old I was unsure how it all worked. Wakeleys were major hop growers with large quantities of hop bines which when composted and supplemented with minerals were sold as a proprietary product 'Wakeley's Hop Manure' a low grade fertilizer but excellent soil improver much prized by the gardeners of the area who had heavy clay soils. In the same way that these simple fertilizers were shared out so the animal feeds on offer were very simple. They were mainly whole grain wheat, barley, oats, locally grown pulses like field beans and a little

and horses survived on crushed oats and barley with a few kibbled field beans (kibbled means crushed or chopped through a rotary sieve). Wakeleys also sold According to Mr Tim Hills of the Ancient Yew Group, miller's offal - Bran and middlings for horses and pigs (middlings was mixed with swill to dry it into a sort of porridge). I think they may also have cut chaff for some of the stables but we never handled that. The mill consisted of several floors and goods were moved between them on a millers hoist, this was a rope with a slip noose at the end which could be put round the neck of a hessian sack or round the body of a paper sack. A pull on another rope operated a clutch to take the rope up, the trap doors beneath the bag were opened, the tension on the control rope was eased and the bag lowered to the next set of doors below. The operator then went down the steps to repeat the procedure until the bag reached the required level. Going up was simpler as the bag was simply pulled up between the trapdoors like valves and was held there until wheeled away with a sack barrow. So cereals could be moved easily to the top of the building and then poured into the hoppers for processing down through the mills or crushers as required. I recall that the granary and oast had its own railway siding but I don't think it was being used by then. It must have been active in earlier days transporting hops to London brewers and horse food for the road traffic of London which relied on equine "horse power" plus possibly bulk movement of fruit and vegetables into the capital as Wakeleys had extensive orchards and potato fields. When the station building closed Wakeleys moved their business to the fruit and potato cold stores they had in Horsham Lane Upchurch. My Father would have known all about Wakeleys being himself on old Rainham boy, he lived in the cottages opposite the bottom of Pump Lane just off the Lower Rainham Road, and he attended the school at the top of Station Road, from around 1913 to 1922 when the family moved to London. The school was approximately on the present Wilko's site. He often recollected scrumping in the local orchards after school. I hope I have given an insight into what the granary was like when it was operating and my personal details are included to put it into context. 


