Congratulations to Bredhurst Village who are celebrating the 150th anniversary of their school with a spectacular Village May Day experience. All past May Kings and Queens are invited to join in the festivities on May 20th. As usual the street will be closed while the procession takes place. The children of 1867, when the school was founded, would probably have been dressed in a very similar way to those of 1897 who appear on our front cover this month. I suspect many of the surnames would have been familiar to the villagers of 1867 as they are to todays residents. Things changed very little during those thirty years - it was only after the 1914-18 war that the gigantic strides forward in dress, life style, transport and farming began. Judging from the expressions on the childrens faces, either they did not enjoy dressing up in their best for a May Day group photograph or the days of 'smile for the birdie' or 'say TRAIN at RAINHAM STATION cheese' were yet to come – several have particularly rebellious grimaces.

I have recently come across an advert for a group entitled 'Love Walking'. It accurately sums up the advantages although I do not think you need to 'love' the exercise to benefit from it.

Apparently 'Walking can: Reduce blood pressure: Reduce cholesterol and fat; Reduce stress and help you sleep better; Improve muscle strength; Help to manage your weight; Make you feel good and so much more'. It concludes with the sentiment that 'You was run by the Southern Region of British Railways can do it anytime, anywhere and it is a great opportunity to make new friends' and the slogan 'Its Free, Fun, Fitness and makes you look Fab.' How could anyone resist such tempting achievements? Actually despite the hyperbole they are pretty much on origins in the 'Thanet Pullman Limited' introduced by the money. Walking really is a magical, miracle cure. When Bredhurst School was built it was common practise for the men of Rainham to walk to Bredhurst after church on Sunday morning passing the parishioners of Bredhurst walking to Rainham. Why this sudden desire to visit a neighbouring parish? Well only a year, but the 'Thanet Belle' name was retained. the licencing laws of the time only allowed pubs to serve 'travellers' on Sunday, ie those who had walked because of the impending completion of the first phase at least three miles and so needed a refreshing drink. A of Kent Coast Electrification beyond Gillingham in round trip of six miles just to buy a drink was nothing to these villagers who regularly walked far longer distances. Modern life has made us all so busy we believe we do not have time to walk, instead we jump in the car, but we would probably be much healthier

and take far fewer pills if we made the time to walk. There are many ways nowadays to help you get back into the way of walking, you can join one of the organised groups or simply put on your boots and step out along the many footpaths we have in our area. They are at their prettiest at this time of year, through orchards of blossom, woodland seas of wood anemone and bluebells or open downland covered in carpets of wild flowers - you may even spot some orchids. Whatever you do have a very good month and we will be back in June.

Dear Editor.

I was interested to read your editorial containing information relating to the train photo taken at Rainham Station shown on the front cover of the March issue 529 of Action Forum. Unfortunately the train you describe using the Dover-Calais train ferry was the 'Night Ferry' which used continental sleeping cars especially constructed to fit the smaller British loading gauge. The BR Standard Class 5-hauled train in the photo was probably the 'Thanet Belle', which from 1948 until it was withdrawn in 1958 due to the impending electrification of the route. It ran from Victoria to Margate, Broadstairs and Ramsgate.

This train, composed of British Pullman stock, had its the South eastern and Chatham Railway in July 1921 but withdrawn in 1928. Reintroduced as the 'Thanet Belle' in 1948, from 1951 three coaches were detached at Faversham and ran separately through to Canterbury East. This Canterbury service ceased after The 'Belle' was withdrawn after 1958, allegedly 1959. However, the real reason was probably poor patronage of the service. The greater number of passengers using the 'Golden Arrow' boat train that you mentioned ensured that the latter survived well into the electrification era.

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR APRIL

This month's notes are about Bredhurst Wood and, in particular, about adders, bluebells, woodmanship and cream teas. Adders emerge from hibernation in the spring. Like all reptiles, they are cold blooded and so need to warm themselves in the sun before they can become active. Adders can be recognised by the zigzag pattern along their backs. In general, the colour of the male is greyish and the female brownish. They kill their prey with a venomous bite and feed chiefly on lizards but also take small mammals such as mice. voles and shrews, among other prey. Young adders, which are born fully formed in the late summer, will initially feed on insects but, as juveniles, will eat young lizards. Adders hibernate communally, in the autumn, in a hollow under heaps of brushwood, for example. Last April I joined other members of the Bredhurst Wood Action Group (BWAG) for a visit to Day Valley, which is adjacent to Bredhurst Wood, in search of adders basking in the spring sunshine. We were led by Dr Lee Brady of the Kent Reptile and Amphibian Group. Lee explained that the freedraining soils of the North Downs and the Greensand Ridge, both of which run across Kent, are good places to find adders. An ideal adder habitat is one with a complex vegetation structure. Day Valley consists of a hay meadow which is surrounded mostly by woodland but, in part, a thick blackthorn hedge. We walked slowly round the woodland edge, being careful where we placed our shadows. Very soon a male adder was spotted sunbathing and some time was spent observing and photographing it. Just as we were about to move on, a second male appeared and the two of them reared up and began to wind themselves about each other in a bid to obtain a dominant hold. This was an event in nature that almost all of us had never before witnessed. Later we spotted an almost black adder, curled up, in the sunshine, under a stretch of bramble. This sighting was of some delight to us all, for it was in an area that had been thoughtlessly cleared, some time ago, with a mechanical flaying machine, by a contractor for National Grid, at the wrong time of the year and, in doing so, had chopped an adder into

pieces. It was good to see that at least one adder had reoccupied the re-growing vegetation of the area. In April of each year the Action Group (www.bwag.org.uk) organises walks around Bredhurst Wood, on a given weekend, to see the bluebells. The flowers are shown off to good effect in the dappled sunlight of the sweet chestnut coppicing in the wood. Other flowers that may be seen include primrose, cowslip, milkmaid or lady's smock, ramson (wild garlic), greater stitchwort, wood anemone and lesser celandine. The songs of blackbird, song thrush, chaffinch, blackcap and chiff chaff can usually be heard. I went on one of the bluebell walks last April. During the tour through the bluebells, we visitors stopped to see coppicing work being carried out by volunteers under the direction of Steve Wright, woodsman and, at the time of our visit, a trustee of BWAG. The vast majority of coppiced trees in the wood are sweet chestnut, originally planted from about 1800 onwards and subsequently coppiced, mainly for hop poles and fencing. Hop production peeked in the late 19th century and declined thereafter. Thus, when BWAG took over management of the wood in 2005, most of the coppiced sweet chestnut trees had not been cut for over 40 years and were very overgrown. Since then, parts of the wood have been opened up by contractors and, more recently, by the volunteers. The result is that light has been let into these parts of the wood, allowing wild flowers such as bluebell, wood anemone and lesser celandine to reappear and prosper. Mr Wright showed the visitors samples of the items that had been made from the cut down sweet chestnut poles. They included post and rail fencing, a gate, handles for birch besoms, a hay rake, roof shingles, hedge laying stakes, tent pegs, bean poles, pea sticks and a faggot (bundle of sticks) of the size used by the Environment Agency for the repair of river banks. Mr Wright explained that sweet chestnut wood splits easily and neatly along the grain and also contains tannins which enable it to remain rot -free for very much longer than Scandinavian soft wood. When I heard Mr Wright talking about faggots it occurred to me that a small aspect of woodmanship has not changed for over 700 years. Boxley Abbey records show that, in certain years of the 14th century.

almost one hundred cart loads of poles and faggots from Monkdown Wood (which adjoins Bredhurst Wood) were used in the reinforcement of sea walls around the Abbey's grazing marshes on the Medway. Unfortunately, BWAG does produce enough faggots to act as a supplier to the Environment Agency. However, John Leigh Pemberton of Torry Hill Estate, Caroline Bleeze became a long serving postmistress at near Sittingbourne, once told me that he supplies bundles of what he called sweet chestnut "tops" for the reinforcement of the banks of rivers and salt marshes. It is quite amazing that a technique employed on the site of the present day shopping centre in 1847. by monks in the 14th century is still carried out in the 21st century. In due course, we bluebell lovers headed for a delicious cream tea at Arran Bank Farm.

RAINHAM IN THE 1850s

Still a relatively small village located on the edge of the borough of Sittingbourne and Milton, Rainham had a population of 1,155 in 1851 compared with 722 in 1801, therefore, the population more than doubled in just fifty years.

Village residents mainly inhabited the High Street with a small number of houses in White Horse Lane (later Station Road). Although there were some businesses agriculture remained the main source of employment in an area renowned for its wheat growing soil. Cherry orchards existed just off the High four-day EuroDisney holiday for very sick children Street and hops were grown at Moor Street and Siloam from Demelza and Ellenor Hospices to experience Farm in Chapel Lane (now Mierscourt Road) but much of the farmland was arable.

The Earl of Thanet, St Katherine's Hospital and John Wingfield-Stratford were principal landowners while well-known local farmers included Thomas Dodd in central Rainham, James Miles at Siloam Farm and Richard Wakeley at Moor Street Farm. Smaller farmers included Tom Gilbert, Daniel Green, William Packman, James Mansfield, Walter Prentis, William Smart, Charles Rich, James Wilkins and Robert Watson.

Berengrove Park and farmland which included picturesque woodland with ponds stretching to the present day railway station and this served as a popular venue for residents to relax at weekends. St Margaret's Church dominated the High Street where Reverend John Poore served as vicar. Shops included butcher Robert Maddocks, grocer and draper William Moss, blacksmith George Pope and

shopkeeper George Turner. Tom Wyles served as a beer retailer, William Burley as a tailor, James Atkins a malster and James Taylor a plumber and glazier. Further along the High Street at the bottom of Chapel Lane George Longley owned Mardale Nursery. Henry Penfold worked as the village doctor while the post office and also ran a bakery. Thomas Hutchinson and his wife Dorothy ran the National School, constructed and opened in White Horse Lane David Wood




