# **Editorial**

Congratulations to the volunteers at Rainham Community Apple Orchard who have recently donated I would like to invite your readers to the 10th biennial a further £2000 to Kent Wildlife Trust. This latest contribution is from the sale of apple juice which was processed last autumn from the surplus crop of Cox and Russet apples in the 2016 harvest. Russet juice is still available, at £3 a bottle, from Berengrave Service and refreshments. Station, Davey the Butcher and Sunburst Books in Station Road or The Net office at Saracen Close but it programme allowing entry into all gardens over both is expected to sell out before the next batch is produced. Rainham Community Orchard is situated on on www.stmattswigmore.org.uk and on St Matthew's Lower Rainham Road at its junction with Lower Bloors Lane by the kind permission of the landowner Jimmy Zammit. Since July 2014 many man hours have been spent by volunteers initially simply clearing years of overgrowth so that the trees became accessible. Once this was partially achieved and the first rather sparse crop gathered the gigantic task of pruning 5000 trees began. This is an annual event through the winter months and more help will be very welcome in a few months time. At the moment pleasant summer days can be spent in a micro environment keeping the enthusiastically growing grass and wildflowers in check. The orchard is managed organically to produce a good crop of apples but also as a small 5 acre area where native flora and fauna coexists to their mutual benefit and for the enjoyment of us all. No pesticides or sprays are used so birds, butterflies, insects, badgers, foxes and rabbits are all welcome. A good place to spend time unwinding and relaxing from the stresses of everyday life. Experts at Kent Wildlife Trust have advised on the best ways to encourage diverse species of native wildlife whilst still maintaining a workable orchard. In this age of profit driven intensive agriculture, which is the only way our fruit can compete commercially with cheaper foreign imports, we have become used to the sterile rows of dwarf cordon trees. Still very pretty with spring blossom and certainly extremely productive they are more like factories for growing fruit than the orchards of yesteryear. So thankyou to the volunteers who spend time each week maintaining the Community Orchard. They will be very pleased to welcome you 10.00am - 12noon any Tuesday or Thursday to see what they do and maybe join them and enjoy the sound of birdsong and the sight of butterflies and the occasional hedgehog. What a glorious few weeks we have experienced recently, lovely warm sunny days and just enough of the wet stuff to replenish supplies and give the plants a good drink. Probably tempting fate to hope it will continue but over half term would be good especially for those of us at Guide Camp! Whatever you are doing do enjoy this wonderful time of year and we will be with you again in July.

#### BERENGRAVE LOCAL NATURE RESERVE Dear Editor

The Nature Notes in this edition of Action Forum are about the above reserve, which is in an abandoned chalk pit. The pit, in which there are the remains of two wash mills, is a relic of Rainham's industrial history. Your readers may therefore like to read this short history of the pit. It was opened in 1901 by the Essex owners of the largest fleet of Thames sailing barges on both the Thames and Medway estuaries and, for the next twelve years, chalk was dug by means of pick, shovel and crowbar and loaded into side tipping trucks. The latter were pulled by cart horse, along a narrow gauge railway which went under the Lower Rainham Road, by means of a bridge, to a nearby quay played the 'beautiful game', I would love to see one. on the Medway. Here sailing barges took the chalk to various cement works in the area. In 1913 the owners of the pit opened a modern cement works at the bottom of Motney Hill Road. To increase production, explosives were used to break up the chalk face. Workmen no longer had to work dangling by a rope and bringing down the chalk with a crowbar. However, the chalk still had to be loaded by hand or shovel. The chalk was taken by narrow gauge steam locomotive to a building in the pit in which were a series of machines, including the two wash mills mentioned above, all driven by a stationary steam engine. Here the chalk was turned into a slurry which was pumped through two large diameter pipes, under the Lower Rainham Road and to the cements works.

By 1923 the cement works had been doubled in capacity and the chalk was taken directly to the works in tippler trucks hauled by a steam locomotive. The wash mill and the rest of the machinery in the pit were shut down. In 1931 the cement works were deemed to be uneconomic and were closed. Subsequently part of the works and the chalk face reopened for the production of cement clinker (unrefined cement) but closed down for good in the late 1930s or early 1940s. There is a very interesting and exquisite model of the probable layout of the machinery in the chalk pit which has made by Mr Fraser Miller and which is on display in Rainham Library.

# Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES the FIRST HALF of SPRING

This month's notes are about recent visits to Berengrave Nature Reserve, which is situated in an abandoned chalk pit. Last used for the quarrying of chalk in the late 1930s or early 1940s, nature has taken over the abandoned pit. (There is a short history of the chalk workings in the pit on page 3 in this Action Forum.) On an early spring visit I entered the reserve at the entrance on Berengrave Lane just below Chalky Bank Road. There was a scent of blossom in the air from wild cherry trees, blackthorn bushes and an overgrown cherry plum hedgerow. I sat down on a seat from where I had a birds' eye view of the trees in the pit bottom. Hidden among them is a lake, the level of which rises and falls according to the level of the water in the underlying chalk. The low lying, almost continually wet areas of the reserve have been largely colonised by willow and sallow trees, creating what is known as a willow carr. This is evident, in early spring, by the widespread extent of willow and sallow catkins, the male ones yellow with pollen and the female ones green. These catkins are the blossom of three closely related trees of the salix family collectively known as "pussy willows". The banks of the pit below where I often sit are covered in an impenetrable tangle of brambles and nettles, a favourite nesting site for warblers and certain other small birds such as dunnocks. Another attraction of Berengrave for birds is that some 450 species of insects and other invertebrates, such as caterpillars, live on the leaves of willow and sallow trees, more than any other species of tree, including close contenders such as English oak and silver birch. During one recent sojourn on the seat I saw or heard, among many other birds, willow warbler and blackcap, which are summer visitors. Unfortunately, I noticed that a pair of magpies had built a nest of sticks in an ash tree near to where I sat. The birds are notorious predators of eggs and young in the breeding season. Not far from the magpies' nest, I spotted, later in the season, a long tailed tit with a white feather in its beak. It was clearly lining its oval shaped nest made of moss and lichens, materials which are readily

available due to the humid atmosphere in the pit I also recently visited the pit bottom, the main entrance to which is on the Lower Rainham Road. A little way inside the pit are the remains of two wash mills in a clearing, usually a good place to see flowers, butterflies and birds. With binoculars, notebook, pencil and a flask of coffee, I camped out on a block of concrete. There were clearly a lot of wrens about, not surprising bearing in mind that they are the most common resident bird in the UK. Their song is incredibly loud for such a small bird, with many trills, and it rattles along to a hurried climax. I could see a chiff chaff at the top of a tall silver birch tree, pecking at insects in between snatches of his familiar and somewhat monotonous song. I could also hear a blackcap's rich and melodious song and eventually noticed him on a prominent perch in a sycamore tree. Having had no response from one perch he would fly to another. Would he ever find Miss Blackcap with her fetching hat of reddish-brown feathers? A great spotted woodpecker flashed by, which was not unexpected, because I had noticed a newly created hole, about two inches in diameter, in a silver birch just yards from where I sat. After a while I saw the bird flying towards me and land on my blind side of the tree. It popped its head around the tree and had a good look at me. Having plucked up courage, it sidled into the hole and, in doing so, revealed its red rump. On a sunny, mid Spring day, I revisited the clearing in the pit, which was awash with the bitter-sweet scent of hawthorn blossom, which scent always take me back to my native Leicestershire. I headed towards a metal seat beside the northern arm of the lake. The water level was very low. I had hoped to see a kingfisher which species has nested in the reserve in the past. I had also hoped to see or hear any sedge or reed warblers nesting in the reed beds. My tally was largely confined to mallards, coots and water hens I did however spot a little grebe in its summer plumage of a reddish patch on its neck, slinking along the edge of the lake under cover of foliage. A heron flew over, but saw me, and did not land. Behind my seat was part of the willow carr. The willows are draped in fine roots, which are reminiscent of the beards of old wizards and which show the highest level to which the water in the

pit has risen in the rainy seasons. The trees are not unlike those in a mangrove swamp. Overall, the carr gives off a muddy, musty smell, and has a primaeval atmosphere about it. I retraced my steps to my favourite perch on a concrete block in the clearing. A blackbird, a song thrush and a robin were in song. Comma and red admiral butterflies flitted backwards and forwards. Hoverflies were also present. They mimic honey bees and wasps and, as a result, insecteating birds steer clear of them. It occurred to me that, members of the club, by phone 07847 733992 or email by now, there must be young in the great spotted woodpeckers' nest that I was keeping an eye on. Sure to have 4 pints of ale or cider (there will be over 60 to enough, the two parents came to and left the nest in quick succession, with what appeared to be grubs dug out of rotten wood, in their beaks. It was strange that both birds attempted to sneak into the nest without me charities. Every penny raised is spent within the seeing them but when they left the nest they poked their heads out of the hole, had a look around and then flew off more or less straight towards me.
