The Memorial to British Aviation - Eastchurch, Isle of Sheppey

In 1909 the Royal Aero Club established a flying field, where the first flight by a British pilot in Britain was made (500 yards in a Voisin biplane) at Leysdown, and the Short Brothers started their aircraft factory at nearby Shellbeach. Both relocated in 1910, 2.5 miles away, to larger premises at Eastchurch. The airfield was offered to the Royal Navy for their use and on April 1st 1918 it was transferred to the newly formed Royal Air Force and was active throughout the inter-war years and World War II closing in 1946. HM Prison Stanford Hill currently occupies the site.

The memorial reads 'This Memorial Commemorates the First Home of British Aviation 1909 near this spot Leysdown - Eastchurch'. See page 3 for a letter from Alan Major 'RAF Centenary'

He passed away in 1985. years of age who met minimum property qualifications the right to vote, the Royal Air Force a new military command came into being in April and the Great War – the war to end all wars, finally reached an armistice in November. Certainly a year to remember even though in only a few short years the RAF was playing a deciding part in another world war most of it not very exciting, at the Air Ministry Unit, and it was not until 1928 that all women over 21 years West Drayton 1950 – 1952. could vote giving them equal rights with men. Dear Editor.

The recent 100th birthday Celebrations of the founding of the Royal Air Force, in April this year, brings to mind how many young men from Rainham were involved in the fledgling service. I know of two, but there may have been more.

Charles William Norton, son of Joseph and Alice Norton, born Gravesend 1904 was brother to my mother Annie Norton. Whilst living at 313 Station Road, Rainham he won a scholarship to Gillingham Technical School and as he completed his schooling the Headmaster held a meeting for all the boys about to leave and told them the new RAF service was seeking youths to join up to train as pilots, aircrew or in ground maintenance staff trades.

our trees. At last we can get out in the garden and start Charles went home excited to tell his mother who was not convinced it was a good idea, but father said 'Why not?' etc and agreed. Charles applied and was accepted as did his school pal Sydney Gulvin, whose parents ran the village shop in Bredhurst. Both boys were in the second entry to RAF Cranwell, the RAF Training College, in 1920 known as 'Trenchard's Brats'. Charles trained as an Air Mechanic and on passing his course was posted to Eastchurch. It was an exciting time as development activity with aircraft was still ongoing. The Short brothers were frequently there during the week. One of them, in his very large car, used to stop outside Rainham Post Office on each visit to send a telegram to Eastchurch saying 'Let them know I'm on my way', which the RAF duly did. After various UK postings including Hendon, with the aerobatic flight, Charles was discharged in the 1930s when the Government was 'economising' by reducing the service – a familiar story. He worked for Gillingham Council digging road trenches until in 1936 he was recalled, during re-armament, and after refresher courses was made a Flight Sergeant Instructor. At the start of the war he was posted to RCAF St Thomas, Ontario on the Empire Air Training Scheme to train Canadians as aircrew in RAF Europe. At the end of the war he returned to the UK and was demobbed but retained as a civilian instructor at RAF In the meantime his school pal, Sydney, had travelled a different route in the RAF ending as a Squadron Leader and on retirement being involved with the Shuttleworth Collection on a base where he had served during his early career.

As for me, I did two years RAF National Service,



Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR APRIL

In early April I motored over the Old Kingsferry Road/Rail Bridge and visited Elmley National Nature Reserve in search of the brown hare. I drove very slowly along the track over the grazing marshes. As usual, there were lots of birds to be seen there, but I have no space to write about them in these Notes. After about two miles, the marshes come to an end upon my reaching the high ground on which sits Kings Hill Farm. The family trust that now owns and farms the Isle of Elmley had set aside a small strip of land around the base of the high ground which had been planted with sun flowers and other flowering plants that had produced seed for finches and other seed eating birds during the winter. I was attracted to a flock of small brown birds feeding on seeds on the ground. I pulled up behind a white car whose driver was apparently taking photos of them. I noticed faint traces of red feathers on the heads and breasts of some of the birds and concluded that it was a flock of linnets I used to see these birds in the fields along Spade Lane, at the eastern end of Rainham, devoted to the growing of flax. The linnets would fly continuously down to the flowers heads from overhead electricity cables and then fly back up again. It was quite some time before I noticed two hares, immediately in front of me, resting in the sunshine, with a row of dead flowers giving them some protection from the wind. The man in the white car was clearly photographing the hares and not the less interesting linnets. One of the hares was lying on her side (clearly a female being guarded by a male) with the white fur of her belly exposed to the sun, her four legs outstretched and her head resting on her fore paws. Her eyes were closed. The male was sitting up with his ears at the alert. He would occasionally scratch behind his ears with his hind leg and clean his face with his fore paws. His eyelids would sometimes close, but tired that he may have been at a time of the day when he would normally be asleep, he had to remain alert against competitive males. The large, yellow eyes of the male had a very glossy quality about them. What was amazing was that a third car joined us. Car windows

were opened and binoculars and cameras were poked through, but the two hares, only about twenty yards away, remained relaxed. A little later, a third hare crossed over the track and into a scrubby area of land. The hare stopped and looked at me in my car and then loped unconcernedly away.

Finally, a little way along the track, I noted as many as five hares resting in the short grass on the slope of the hill. Conventional wisdom is that a hare rests in a 'form' such that, in a field of short wheat or grass, when its head is down and its ears are flat on its back. it cannot be seen above the vegetation by a predator such as a fox. Three of the five hares were apparently alert, with their ears upright, and the two which had their ears down seemed to be having a snooze. All five were visible with the naked eye and had made no attempt to get under cover. I think that the explanation is that the Trust controls foxes in order to stop them plundering the eggs of ground nesting birds which it describes in its brochure as 'predator management'. The hares may have never seen a fox on the reserve and have got used to the cars that move slowly along the track on every day of the year. Outside the breeding season, brown hares are predominantly solitary and nocturnal, but can be seen feeding in the early morning and at dusk. The female comes into breeding condition in late winter or early spring, as a result of which hares are seen more regularly during the day. In the breeding season hares lose most of their customary caution and come together in pairs and small groups. Male hares can sometimes be seen following each other around so as not to miss out if they come across a female. The more extreme antics are the origin of the saying 'Mad March Hares'. These antics include a string of males chasing after a female in a chaotic free-for-all; competing males squaring up to each other on their hind legs and sparring with each other with their forepaws; and an unreceptive female warding off an over-passionate male either with her forepaws or, if she gets very irritable with the male, her teeth. Unfortunately, I was not at the reserve early enough in the morning to witness any of these antics. It should be borne in mind that 'Mad March Hares' are up to their antics throughout the summer breeding season but once mowing grass, cereal plants

RAINHAM FIFTY YEARS AGO in 1968

The year began with a serious flu epidemic that affected thousands of people in the Medway area causing high levels of absenteeism from work and school. Blizzard conditions and heavy snow followed causing train cancellations, massive traffic jams, power cuts and severed telephone lines.

It wasn't all bad news as Rainham Theatrical Society had staged a successful production of the pantomime 'Robinson Crusoe' to packed audiences at the Oast House Theatre, while Rainham Social Club thrived with tag wrestling matches and regular live bands. Rainham Ladies Choir also did well and at the Llangollen International Musical Eisteddford in Wales they finished sixth out of 24 participating choirs. With expansion of the Parkwood Housing Estate and a rise in the local population, modern facilities were increasingly demanded. This led to the former Church of England School in Station Road being earmarked for demolition followed by the construction of Rainham Shopping Centre with a pedestrian precinct and car park as part of a redevelopment plan for central Rainham. Plans were also drawn up to redevelop Rainham Mark with more space for shopping. In June Gillingham Council bought the marsh near Motney Hill from the Rugby Portland Cement Company for development.

A new school known as the Howard School was constructed at Derwent Way and the teachers and

and root and other crops have grown tall the hares are pupils from Rainham Secondary Modern School in Orchard Street were transferred there in September. site. With the closure of the Church of England School in Station Road and the transfer of pupils to Orchard Street, the vacant building, which dated back to 1846, was bought by Gillingham Council and temporarily leased to the Rainham and Wigmore Community Association who organised social and recreational evenings at the premises. Local traders contributed 400 items of household furniture for use in the

> Championship and reached the final of the Kent Sunday Premier Cup but were defeated 4-0 by Catford United in the final, Rainham Youth won the Medway Minor League Championship while Rainham Football Club First XI finished fifth in the New Brompton

During the summer Rainham Cricket Club had an average season while girls from the Rainham Secondary School Athletic Club performed well. At the Faversham Gala Sports Meeting in June Jill Wesson won the 100 yards event and Carol Hooper won the Junior 100 yards. The junior relay team also finished first. Later, at the Bexley Sports Meeting Carol Hooper won three races while Jackie Mudge won the 220 yards event.

In October Rainham held its first ever trade fair which took place at Rainham Social Club attended by an estimated 4,500 people. Opened by the Mayor of Gillingham it proved highly successful. Films were shown, advice given on painting and decorating with dancing, hairdressing and butchery demonstrations and a fashion show.

The year ended with news that farmers Wakeley Brothers were planning to attract young men into farming by providing them with modern four bedroom houses in Rainham. The old nineteenth century cottages which housed Wakeley Brothers workers lacked modern amenities with outside toilets and no bathrooms. By December 1968 twelve new houses were constructed for the farm workers and six of these were situated in Otterham Quay Lane. This ended an important year in the history and development of Rainham. 
