Editorial

My assumption that the boys in our front cover photo last month would match the names supplied for a year later was wrong! Only three actually appear. Derrick Cooper middle row left hand side with Barry Mullarkee seated next to him and Andrew Page back row extreme left. Apologies to the others named - we hope to include your 1957/58 picture in the future. Four years ago, largely due to the inspired ceramic poppies display in London, we were all very well informed as the centenary of the outbreak of the Great Call 01634 362746 and ask to speak to Mrs Moon. War approached. The United Kingdom declared war on Germany on August 4th 1914. 'Blood Swept Lands Dear Editor and Seas of Red' was an art work in the moat of the Tower of London, between July and November 2014. It consisted of 888,246 ceramic red poppies, each representing a British or Colonial serviceman killed in the War. The artist was Paul Cummins and the title was taken from the first line of a poem by an unknown World War I soldier. Back in 2014 a £40 million First World War Centenary Cathedral Repairs Fund was launched by the government inviting applications from participate in group activities that may focus on a Catholic and Church of England cathedrals to address urgent repair works. The fund prioritised making buildings weatherproof, safe and open to the public as well as ensuring they would be in a good condition to host acts of remembrance for the centenary of the First World War armistice in 2018. Rochester Cathedral Received a total of £823,000 which helped to repair and replace aging roof structures. The Cathedral is joining organisations across Medway in hosting a '5,000 Poppies' exhibition this November which will feature thousands of poppies knitted by the local community to commemorate the anniversary. Through the summer visitors will have an opportunity to knit poppies at the Cathedral. The 5000 poppies movement began as a small personal tribute by two Australian women Lynn Berry and Margaret Knight to honour their fathers who both fought in World War II, and has become an international tribute of respect and remembrance to those who have served in all wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations. RAINHAM SCHOOL for BOYS

Dear Editor,

With reference to Vic Wickenden's letter last month. I left Solomon Road Council School in June 1940 following its reopening after closure due to evacuation. I then attended Orchard Street School until 1943. My class teachers as I progressed through the school were as follows. First a very elderly teacher (he seemed to us) Mr Wilbrams, bow-legged, we used to joke he had been in the cavalry. Second class was the teacher Vic could not name, Mr Taylor, He indeed seemed to get satisfaction from whacking the boys. He once hit me on the head, just passing, with the edge of a ruler that hurt for the rest of the day. Desmond Nicholls from Broad Walk was in the class, he was rather 'overlarge' in size. Mr Taylor frequently had Desmond bend over in front of the class while he wacked his backside several times for no obvious reason. Class three was Mr Sergeant, quite the opposite with the boys. His history lessons were often reminiscing about his experience as a German prisoner

of war during the 1914-18 conflict. Top class was Mr Gleadle, tall, authoritive, a good teacher who sometimes arrived in RAF uniform and did not teach in the afternoon when we had a replacement. While in Mr Sergeant's class I sat near Richard Harrison, from Wigmore, who wanted to be an artist – I still have one of his drawings. I have sometimes wondered if he achieved his ambition. We also had Mr Sneath for metalwork and carpentry, despite the shortage of materials (for some reason we called him Mr Slice). In place of a regular teacher we sometimes had Mrs Dudding, from the girls school, or Mrs Drake for general subjects. One session a week Mr Bowden, a music teacher, tried to teach us 'Where a bee sucks' etc. Mr Bowden was a quiet, rather shy, timid man outwardly and did not have much control over us. Sometimes it was almost hell let loose but it all changed unexpectedly. The torment for him ceased when the boys learned that his wife who had been very ill had died. Our attitude changed and there was no more baiting Mr Bowden, his classes became more orderly and we honestly tried to learn to sing. I also have happy memories of those years even of Mr Taylor who was eventually called up to the RAF. With reference to Jayne Laming's letter Arthur Green Newsagent and his wife are interred in the extension of Stockbury's St Mary Magdalene churchyard.

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR JULY

"The Pipistrelle or Common Bat is, in a general sense. familiar to everybody, for it may be seen in the evenings flying everywhere, even in the streets of crowded cities," states my 1971 Observers Book on Wild Animals. Those were the days; when bats were everywhere and large, attractively coloured moths were attracted to the lights in people's bathrooms. I bring readers up-to-date in writing about three fauna that have diets of insects caught in the air. In the spring of last year Mr W, a retired farmer who lives along the Lower Rainham Road, phoned me in some despair. After many years of swallows nesting in his stables and other outbuildings, not a single swallow had turned up. I went to see him and reminded him about the long, hazardous journey that swallows undertake, from South Africa and, in particular, across the Sahara Desert. Then, out of the blue, Mr W rang me to say, in some excitement, that a pair of swallows had been nesting in a part of his goat house that he rarely enters. Young swallows were lined up along a beam. By the time I could get down to the farm, the young had flown and were nowhere to be seen. I was a little disappointed but very pleased for Mr W. This spring I'd heard nothing from Mr W, so I rang him. This time he really had had no swallows. I reminded him of the downpours and cold east winds we had had in the spring which could have adversely affected swallows in the south east of the country. His darkly lit stables and other outbuilding are ideally suited for swallows and I hoped that he would be lucky next spring. Enquiries at the Countryside Park on the Lower Rainham Road revealed that swallows were breeding in the area and I myself saw at least six feeding over the scrub outside the Water Treatment Plant on Motney Hill, in some of whose building those swallows would be nesting.

The number of swifts in Rainham have dropped dramatically over the years; no longer do we see and hear non-breeding juveniles scream over the church roofs and around the tower on warm sunny, summer evenings. There is a small colony centred on the

former oasthouse alongside Rainham Station, Small numbers of swifts can also be seen above the houses in Third Avenue in Gillingham and in Twydall Lane. A friend of mine, Mr G, is absolutely delighted when he sees the first swifts of spring, in early May, in the air above Rainham and is quite despondent, in August, when he sees the last of them. He rang me with news of a group of thirty or so juveniles which he saw screaming through Rainham. He described them as like a crowd of hooligans from another area bent on causing mischief. We discussed the matter, both of us knowing quite well that one cannot treat them as hooligans. He and I concluded that the group he saw comprised juveniles from various colonies in the area who had joined together for company and enjoyment. Their screams can only be described as expression of joy and excitement. There would also be an element of showing off to each other and, in particular, a young male may be seeking to impress a young female. Much like, then, the juveniles we all know and love!

On two or three occasions a long-standing friend of mine has rung me about the bats she has roosting. during the summer, in the gable end wall of her house. In particular, they roost behind the "rustic" wooden boards that overlap each other and which are affixed to the triangular breeze block wall between the two barge boards. Having spoken to me again, quite recently. I thought that I ought to experience for myself the bats leaving their roost in the evening. A date and time at the end of June having been agreed for my visit, I decided to refresh my memory about what were most certainly female pipistrelle bats in a maternity roost. Pipistrelles are Britain's smallest bat and are the most common ones to be seen in towns. They fly with rapid twists and turns and, in flight, they can frequently be heard uttering shrill, little squeaks. The young are born between early June and mid-July in maternity roosts which consist almost exclusively of females. Each female usually has just one young which is born bald and blind and is suckled by its mother. Those with young to feed may take several feeding trips during the night whilst their youngsters are left inside the roost, hanging upside down, in the care of the creche. Female pipistrelles can be active

On the appointed evening my friend (Mrs J) and I settled ourselves down in a garden seat each, on the drive, with a good view of the gable end. I asked her how many bats we could expect to see and she said that she counted forty-nine the evening before but there could have been more if she had staved longer. About twenty minutes after sunset the first bat flew out, followed in quick succession by others from different crevasses in the planks. We began to count them together. Some turned down one side of the house and some to the other but all then headed in the direction of Cozenton Park. The exodus was all over in half an hour and, quite amazingly and almost unbelievingly, we counted of serious leg grazes after falling over and the orange ninety-three bats, repeat ninety-three. Bearing in mind dust stuck to their clothes. Outdoor artificial nets the date of my visit, at the end of June, some of the females might already have given birth and some might still have been pregnant. The exodus was an awe-inspiring wildlife spectacle, here in Rainham, and new school had better facilities than previously. Mrs J and I had the privilege of being the only people to witness that particular evening's performance.

THE HOWARD SCHOOL in the Early Years

Moving from Orchard Street to the 36 acre site at Derwent Way in September 1968, the boys found the new school much more spacious. Many were puzzled with the name and thought it derived from the building in Station Road and worked as a familiar scrap metal company that had constructed the site. In reality the building was named after Dorothy Howard who had served as Education officer for Medway and had been active in local community and political affairs. With a school population of about 500, Mr Bacon served as headmaster. Most of the Orchard Street staff continued although a few retired while well-known caretaker Mr Millgate remained at Orchard Street when the transfer took place.

Mr Newell continued as the art teacher and later became acting-head after the retirement of Mr Bacon, while Mr Gibbs continued as the principal English teacher, the librarian and wrote the annual school play. He left the school soon after its opening to teach at the former Sittingbourne teacher training college.

football and cricket teams before retiring aged 81 player and athlete, taught PE and games. New teacher arrivals included Mr Ansell and Mr Bullen who also played for Rainham Cricket Club, Mr Clark who taught PE and Vaughan Jenkins, a rotund Welshman with a booming voice. Sixth former Alan Suttie from Maidstone Road, who later became a graphic artist in London, served as head-prefect. Because the playing fields were new a large number of stones appeared from below the surface, so many school football matches were played at the Langton

Playing Fields, during the summer some home cricket matches were played at Berengrove Park. A red gravel area existed for football practice but boys complained existed for cricket practice but the playground was preferred by pupils for sport. With a big gym, spacious science labs, well-lit classrooms and a dining hall, the Well-known pupils from the period included George Meegan who later became the first person to walk from the tip of South America to the top of North America for which he is in the Guinness Book of Records. Footballer Derek Hales played for Luton. Charlton, West Ham, Derby and Gillingham. He later returned to the Howard School as a part-time football coach. Stuart Hart became landlord of The Angel pub collector around Rainham while Raymond Hales. Alfie Fisher, Andy Findlay, Geoff Stone, Mick Arnold, Peter Heath and Malcolm Young became well -known local footballers.

With the closure of Gillingham Grammar School, the pupils from there moved to the Howard School in 1975 where they formed the grammar section of a new bi-lateral school, one of only five in the United Kingdom led by headmaster Mr Hicks. This amalgamation of the old Rainham Secondary School with Gillingham Grammar expanded the Howard School population to about 1,500 boys. The school remains one of the largest in Medway today.


