

This brings back many memories as I am sure it does with many readers of my generation. The Savacentre was a new concept: Sainsburys joined with British Home Stores to provide one enormous hypermarket where you could buy everything you could possibly need in one place. A unique idea in 1978. Hempstead Valley was the second store to open a year after Washington, Tyne and Wear. Such was the worry about shop lifting that no-one was allowed to take a shopping bag into the store, we all had to queue to check them into a bag room. We soon learned to leave them at home and hence the age of the free give away plastic carriers arrived. Little did we realise the harm we were doing to the planet and it has taken almost 40 years to break the habit and return to reusable bags. Customer loyalty was rewarded handsomely each Christmas - I recall free Turkeys or free Christmas Puddings being handed out just before the holiday. The annoying thing was you never knew in advance what the gift would be so found you had two turkeys or puddings rather in excess of what was needed so one of ours usually stayed in the freezer until Easter. If you have fond memories or even some pictures of the early days Ashley Halliday (see letter

page 3) would love to hear from you as he is compiling a blog of recollections.

Back to school and back to reality after our long summer of sunshine, do have a very good month and we will be here again with autumn in October.

ALAN PARMENTER

We recently received the sad news of the sudden death, at home on July 31st, of Alan Parmenter. After getting married in 1967 Alan and his wife Diane moved to Rainham from S.E London, Eager to be involved in the local community they volunteered to help with Action Forum, despite already having a four year old son and being pregnant with her second child Diane still helped by assisting with door to door distribution and holding monthly meetings at their home in Bedson Walk. They both became valued members of the editorial team. Alan also took on the task of Distribution Manager, a role he conscientiously filled for the next twenty years. I am sure people who helped with the distribution through the 70s, 80s and 90s will remember him delivering their bundles each month. At this time Rainham was growing rapidly and during this period our print run doubled from 10,000 to 20,000 copies. It was largely thanks to the volunteers on the editorial team that AF was so successful building a sound framework that continues today. Our thoughts and prayers are with all the family at this difficult time.

Correspondence ANCHORIANS ASSOCIATION

Dear Editor.

As a former Chairman of The Anchorians Association, and now its Secretary, as well as being a Governor of The Howard School, I have read with interest the various articles in recent months regarding the history of Rainham Boys' and The Howard. Age can tend to blur the memory (including my own!), but recent correspondence has included inaccuracies. David Wood's article in August 2018 seems to imply that The Howard School was named as such from 1968. This is not the case. Mr Wood is correct in stating that the school is named after Dorothy Howard, but this was on the establishment of the school in 1975, when Gillingham Grammar School moved from Third Avenue, to join Rainham Boys' Secondary School, forming what was then, I believe, the first bilateral (Grammar / Secondary) School in the country. I attended the Grammar School from 1973-75, moving to The Howard in September '75 until I left in 1980.

As for The Anchorians Association, this was established on Boxing Day 1926 by a group of 30 expupils and members of staff of Gillingham County (later to become, Grammar) School, which first opened in 1923. On the creation of The Howard, the School's Board of Governors approved the adoption of the Association as a ready-made old boys'

organisation. The Association moved in 1984 from its former clubhouse at the bottom of Featherby Road to its current site in Darland Avenue.

To cement the link between the former Grammar School, the Association and The Howard, the latter's badge includes an anchor; the Grammar School's Latin motto was Valet Anchora Virtus - 'virtue is our anchor'. Also, to reflect the link back to the Grammar School and to the Association, The Howard's principal colour is purple. While the Association's link with the Howard remains strong, it and its affiliated sports clubs (rugby, hockey, football, and table tennis) is open to all from the local community.

There seems to be confusion about when Rainham Secondary Modern School for Boys moved from Orchard Street to the buildings at Derwent Way.

I was amongst the first pupils to move to the new site and I left school at the end of my Fifth Year (Year 11 in current terms) in July 1967. As a school prefect and librarian I recall assisting Mr Gibbs set up the library during the holiday before the summer term of 1967. It is possible that the move was phased over time with the whole school not moving until September 1968; however, I gather that Rainham School for Girls is celebrating 50 years at Derwent Way this year and we were able to watch the construction of some of the girls school buildings from our new school.

I am grateful for David Wood's notes; evoking memories of the school. Incidentally, it was Mr Groves who introduced some of us to archery - not possible at the Orchard Street site but very safe in the spacious playing fields of the Derwent Way school!

Nature Notes

NATURE NOTES FOR AUGUST

Last August I visited a location characterised by sea walls, ochre sails, sea birds, common seals, sea lavender and wide-open skies. I set off east along Watling Street and, just before Faversham, turned left for Oare. I motored slowly through the dark and ancient Bysing Wood, composed mostly of massive oak trees and coppiced sweet chestnut, and fields of wheat and maize, before eventually dropping down to sea level upon reaching Oare Marshes. The latter have been developed into a nature reserve for waders and other birds by Kent Wildlife Trust. I stopped temporarily at a large layby from which I had very good views of avocet, lapwing, knot, dunlin and bar tailed godwit, the latter of which were likely to be passage migrants. I parked at the car park proper and then climbed up the sea wall, beyond which is The Swale and the Isle of Harty. The day was warm and sunny, with little or no wind, and a blue sky in which were large, fluffy clouds. Anchored in the low tidal waters of The Swale were three Thames sailing barges, their ochre sails furled up. I set off along the embankment in the direction of Whitstable. On the landward side of the footpath were small numbers of swallows and swifts flying low over the reserve in pursuit of flies. On both sides of the path were flowers such as wild carrot, fleabane, red clover and birds foot trefoil. By the time that I arrived at the bird watching hide facing down The Swale, I had noted butterflies such as gatekeeper, common blue, meadow brown and the summer migrant painted lady. From inside the hide I noted a couple of oyster catchers and redshanks probing for food in the mud of The Swale. More interestingly, I picked out, with my binoculars, a group of seals on the edge of Horse Sands in the middle of The Swale. I asked a man who had his telescope clearly trained on the seals, how many there were and he said 'about twenty'. One of the lady ramblers in the hide plucked up courage to ask the man if she and her friends could have a look and was told that they could. Before you could say 'The Wandsworth and District Ladies Walking Club', for

that is who they were, the ramblers eating outside on the bench and the embankment were forming an orderly queue, as ladies are apt to do, to see the seals. Common seals give birth to a single pup in June or July of each year. The pups are very well developed at birth and can crawl, dive and swim when just a few hours old. This enables common seals to breed in estuaries where sand banks are exposed at only part of the day, as is the case with Horse Sands. Soon after breeding, common seals undergo the annual moult of their fur, during which they spend most of the time ashore. The adult seals seen last year on Horse Sands may well have been moulting. One can get quite near to the Sands by walking along the south bank of The Swale from near to The Sportsman Public House at

After stepping out of the hide, I stopped for a while to admire the view. One can see part of the Isle of Sheppey, including Shell Ness at the eastern tip of the island; Whitstable; the skyline of Faversham. including the spire of the parish church and Shepherd Neame's Brewery; and the nearby Shipwright's Arms with adjoining Boat Shed at Hollow Shore on the Ham Marshes. The latter marshes are surrounded on three sides by Oare and Faversham Creeks. Ham Marshes are just one of three in the Faversham area which were won from the sea in mediaeval times and which are still grazed by cattle. The others are Luddenham Marshes and the Seasalter Levels. I walked up Oare Creek as far as the public house on the opposite bank. Those parts of the creek on the highest ground, immediately under the embankments, were lined with sea lavender, sea aster, sea wormwood and golden samphire, among the more common sea purslane. The Shipwright's was a matter of yards away as the black tailed godwit flies but, for natural history correspondents, it is the distance of driving into Faversham and then out again. Two herds of cattle were grazing on Ham Marshes at the time of my visit. A massive stack of round bales of hay had been gathered in for the feeding of the cattle, under cover. during the winter months. Wild carrot, hog weed and thistle (all rank weeds and a nuisance to farmers) lined the track to the public house, which is sheltered from

part of the embankment. House sparrows were chirping away in the trees. A sail maker now occupies unfortunate company's plans to improve its services the old boat shed and, at the time of my visit, the Thames sailing barge, 'Lady Pamela', was hauled up on the bank and was under repair. The Shipwrights' Arms is in an 18th century building and proudly claims to be an old fashioned, country pub. Around the walls are model boats, ships' lights and photos and 700 class 'see-through' type, with doors between paintings of Thames sailing barges. I had a massive ploughman's lunch, far more elaborate than was ever taken into the stubble fields by a ploughman. I had sat there's plenty of space for 'standees', as local bus down on a seat next to a ginger tom, who has little affinity with strangers, and who was curled up on a red cushion. It occurred to me that, in the past, the pub's customers would have been mainly working men - those building, repairing or crewing sailing barges and farm labourers. Hollow Shore is a living connection with the time when ochre sails were a common sight, moving slowly through the north Kent marshes. Those sails were trimmed, and the barges crewed, by just one man, a boy and a dog.

In May, rail passengers were faced with major changes to train times affecting the entire Southeastern BYO Drinks and Nibbles. For Air Ambulance, contact network. The complete journey www.medway.gov.uk/archives to Luton would take just under 21/2 hours. So, providing your flight from Luton Airport was at a civilised hour, you could dispense with the car.... The new service was planned to start on May 20th, but Holywell School, Forge Lane, Upchurch ME9 7AE. by the end of May trains using Rainham's new platform 0 (Platform Zero rather than Platform Nought, please) were still few and far between, mainly


