One hundred years ago should you have been unfortunate enough to contract a notifiable disease, the most common being diphtheria and scarlet fever often deadly for children before the days of antibiotics, the small fever cart on the right of the picture, outside the Green Lion in Rainham High Street, would have collected you for the journey to the Isolation Hospital at Keycol Hill. This was a grim 'workhouse' type building with high windows. No visitors were allowed inside so having walked from Rainham worried parents could only climb on boxes and peer through the windows in the hope of glimpsing their child. A stay of several weeks or months was not uncommon for the lucky ones who survived the infection, reminiscent of Covid 19 today.

The Origins of Action Forum and a proposal for the future.

When I returned to Rainham after university I joined the Rainham Help The Needy Committee, a group from St Margarets Church raising funds for crises such as the famine in Biafra caused by civil war in Nigeria. We wanted to involve more than just church members. but how could we inform them? We decided on a newsletter funded by local businesses keen to tell the rapidly growing population in the area about their services. We soon realised that selling advertising and recruiting volunteer distributors was a big task that would be much easier if we repeated it. There were, however, many other small voluntary groups in the area who wanted to publicise themselves and their monthly publication was born.

The first edition was published in March 1969 and distributed to 10,000 homes, 51 years later the print run has doubled to 20,500 to include the new homes that have been built in that time. The core of the magazine remains the publicity given to the many and very varied voluntary groups in the area that help to make us a community rather than just a dormitory for commuters. The Memories of Rainham, old photographs and other history articles we publish also help newcomers on modern housing estates to appreciate that they have joined a long established Advertising Manager to be responsible for collating "village" as the oldest residents still call Rainham. I have a box of flint tools dug up in my garden proving tMeresborough was occupied in the Stone Age. I met Barbara in 1971 and persuaded her to join the Rainham Spectacular in May 1972. We were married in December and moved into our house in Meresborough on return from our honeymoon. As others dropped out she gradually took over sole responsibility for editing AF and learned paper paste-

up to create pages to send to the printer. Later she mastered computer technology so now each issue is emailed direct as a single file. She also took on sole responsibility for organizing the the distributors. For a few years we paid an agency to do our distribution. When we returned to volunteers we donated the money saved to St Margarets and St Matthews parishes to use locally and a third to overseas projects. Recently this has been Tools with a Mission who collect and refurbish unwanted tools and send them to African villages to held them become self sufficient. See the advert for The Medway Volunteer Workshop in Chatham that does some of this work.

In March as the Covid crisis developed it became clear that we would not be able to publish an April edition and Barbara took the decision outlined at the start of her editorial. During April she became seriously unwell and was eventually diagnosed with Hodgkin Lymphoma and is now on chemo.

Our proposal for Action Forum is that it should come under the umbrella of a new charity / not for profit organization being set up called "Rainham Community Projects" It will take the lease of 21/23 Station Road, Rainham and provide a legal framework for other groups that fit its title. #### BERENGROVE HOUSE

Originally Berengrove Park had been part of the Manor of Queencourt, comprising 485 acres of arable, pastureland, picturesque woodland and ponds situated on either side of Berengrave Lane and stretching as far as the present day Rainham railway station. It was part of the possessions of the Crown until Queen Eleanor, widow of Henry III gave it to St Katherine's Hospital in 1273.

Over the centuries Berengrove Park was mainly used as a paddock for sheep or cattle grazing until other uses were found. During the second half of the nineteenth century fetes and the Rainham Flower Show took place there. 'In 1889 the fourth annual show of fruit, flowers and vegetables, in connection

He was known as 'Squire' Walter - people touched their caps to him. He was a Churchwarden at St Margaret's in Rainham for 28 years, and died in 1885 at the age of 80. His children remained at Berengrove, where they were well looked after by numerous servants including a coachman: their housekeeper and cook had and well-dressed gentleman who prided himself on been with the family for many years.

When Pevsner's original edition of 'West Kent and the Weald' in the 'Buildings of England' series was published in 1976, only two buildings in Rainham were thought worthy of inclusion. One was, of course, St Margaret's Church, and the other was Berengrove Park. This was briefly described as 'Red brick. Georgian. Four bays, two storeys, and a parapet. Porch had already been put in place. So although no census on fluted Doric columns.'

Berengrove Park then consisted of 18 acres with a house, outbuildings, a garden, an orchard, and a park. During the 1920s Elizabeth, the Queen Mother regularly stayed there for an annual holiday as a guest servants, Kathleen Moran who was 21 and Florence of Lt Colonel Day of the Royal Engineers, who bought Holdness and Annie Downie, both born in the 1880s. Berengrove along with Berengrove House from the Walter family in 1921 for £3,330. In the early 1930s he was the local Scoutmaster, allowing his grounds to be used for the boys' 'Revels' in 1932. He owned a donkey, whose braying sometimes alarmed strangers walking down Berengrave Lane in the dark. Rainham cricket club rented their ground from Lt Colonel Day for £15 a year but by letting it out for grazing to local farmer Mr Longley at a cost of £25 they were able to cover their costs and make a profit. However, hurdle gates had to be placed around the cricket square to protect it from the livestock that grazed on the outfield. These had to be removed and returned at the beginning and end of each game. From 1937 Colonel Arthur Iremonger, a keen cricketer, owned Berengrove Park, allowing Rainham Cricket Club to continue playing there, and holding the position of club president. He even had a tree grubbed that was situated next to the cricket square and had an indoor net constructed in the long room of Berengrove House so that the cricketers could practise

'150 Not Out - the Complete History of Rainham Cricket Club 1856-2006', by David Wood (available for Sunburst Books, 21 Station Road, Rainham £15) records that the Colonel 'served in the Royal Engineers, and had participated in putting down the Easter Rising in Ireland in 1916 during his time in the British Army. He was a well-mannered, well-spoken always dressing for dinner. He was a patron of the club throughout the late 1930s-1950s and was a wellknown figure in Rainham. He actually played occasional games for the club as a lower-order batsman.'

When war was declared in 1939 most of the administrative framework for the planned 1941 census took place, enumerators collected details of households on September 29th 1939, and from these a National Register was compiled. On that date the only people recorded at Berengrove House were three In January 1940 a special meeting was held at Berengrove to discuss the short term future of the Cricket Club. Petrol rationing had curtailed mowing the pitch. Club membership had to be opened to nonresidents so that enough players could be found to field a team, and matches were played against Services teams rather than other local clubs, many of which had been forced to close. Col. Iremonger offered to lower the rent to help. A charity match in aid of the Red Cross was played at Berengrove between Rainham C.C. and the Cooperative Society, raising £10. During this match Dockyard worker Frankie Bye took 8 wickets for 30 runs, and the result was a win for Rainham by 7 wickets. Home matches later that year had to be played at Langton Playing Fields in Gillingham as the Military authorities had commandeered Berengrove Park for grazing. There were to be no more matches until after the war. When it was over Colonel Iremonger was keen to see cricket back at Berengrove, and following a public

#### NATURE NOTES

Dear Editor.

I enjoy the articles in AF by Joe Ennis. He reminds me of my father in law, a countryman from the Midlands who I used to take on the country walks you used to feature in AF. He would spot birds and animals on these walks I was just not aware of and loved this area. When I moved to Rainham in the early 1960's, on the first morning I was awakened by the dawn chorus, quite amazing. Sadly no longer, few birds of any note appear in my garden these days. Pigeons, Crows, Magpies and Seagulls prevail. I live in Wigmore with a south facing bedroom and at dawn or just after each morning I witness over around 20 -30 minutes dozens of birds flying with some purpose in a south, south south westerly direction. There are a number of groups. some flying very high in formation, others around tree top height much more aimlessly and odd stragglers. I assume in the main they are birds who have roosted on the marshes or mud flats but am not sure. I am not sure what species they are but I would be interested to know where they are headed. I have seen odd groups return in the evening but I think the return must be over a longer period or wider area. Perhaps Joe could throw some light on this.

The Editor of Action Forum has passed, to me, a copy of your e mail to her. The flocks of birds you refer to flying over in the morning are almost certainly black headed gulls which will have been roosting on the Nor Salt Marshes in the Medway, opposite the Countryside Park, where thy are surrounded by water. They are thus safe from foxes. Facebook and Twitter. If you draw a straight line SW from Nor Marshes and over Wigmore it leads to the arable fields on the top of the North Downs beyond Bredhurst. Here the gulls will feed on worms, leatherjackets and other invertebrates in the fields of winter wheat or oil seed Community Orchard rape. They sometimes fly in V shapes but on windy days formation cannot be maintained. Birds flying at a higher altitude may be gulls going to a destination further away but flocks of ducks or geese cannot be discounted. You are quite right about the flocks coming back in more straggly formations. Apart from those larger birds that you list as seeing in Wigmore you may also see jays, green woodpeckers

and flocks of jackdaws,

As for song birds, I have a blackbird singing outside the house at 4am and later. I have also heard a song thrush singing, during the day, in a tree overlooking the Skoda Garage at Hoath Lane. I do not have a big garden (I also live in Wigmore) but I hang out containers of wild bird seed, sun flower seed and suet pieces. I also put suet pieces and dried meal worms on the ground and under a protective cage for ground feeding bird like blackbirds. These feeds encourage not only blackbirds, a dunnock, house sparrows, blue tit, robin, goldfinches and a green finch. I do not see all of these species every day. They come and go. I should add that we also attract flocks of not very welcome starlings and a cheeky long tailed field mouse which sits unconcernedly in the cage stuffing himself with suet pieces.

## Nature Notes

These are the Nature Notes that Joe had submitted for the April 2020 copy of Action Forum which was overtaken by events and did not happen.

All subsequent monthly Notes will also be posted towards the end of the relevant month. #### NATURE NOTES FOR MARCH

South Wood lies between Hempstead Road and Capstone Road and is ancient semi-natural woodland. It is a quiet wood and one in which I enjoy sitting, on my portable seat, in the dappled sunshine of a spring or summer's day. In it grow some twenty-three species of tree and large shrubs, including ash, beech, field maple, hornbeam, oak, sweet chestnut and wild cherry, which are a mixture of standard and coppiced trees. In spring the beech trees burst into life with their delicate, light green leaves and the cherry trees become covered in white blossom. 'Lambs' tails', bright yellow with pollen, dangle from the coppiced hazel shrubs. Also in spring, much of the floor of the wood is carpeted in wood anemones, with their white petals, followed a little later by a sea of bluebells. Appearing in clusters are common dog violets, early purple orchids and yellow archangels. All of these flowers need to take advantage of the spring sunshine before the deciduous leaves in the canopy of the wood cut down on the light. Birds such as blue tit, great tit and great spotted woodpecker nest in the wood in spring. They, among other species, time the hatching of their eggs to coincide with the emergence of caterpillars feeding on the fresh green leaves of the oak and other trees. It is quite common to see, and hear, the fledglings of blue and great tits following their parents through the wood and calling for food. At the height of summer, South Wood, like most other woods, is comparatively quiet, in the main because birds are moulting and keeping out of sight. In late summer and early autumn jays and squirrels can be seen burying acorns and sweet chestnuts in the leaf

litter of the wood. At the same time of the year, an attractive crop of berries can be found at the western edge of the Wood, overlooking Capstone Road. They ripen in the afternoon sunshine and include those of the whitebeam, alder buckthorn, wild privet, dogwood, blackthorn, dog rose and spindle. On a bank of chalk down land adjoining Capstone Road, grow the purple flowers of knapweed and light blue ones of field scabious. The deciduous trees normally put on a good show of leaves in autumn, particularly the wild cherry trees with their red leaves. Parties of the various species of tits, sometimes accompanied by other species such as goldcrests, may be present in the wood in winter, seeking insect eggs and grubs among the trunks and branches. They are easier to spot once the leaves have fallen.

Nearly all ancient woods like South Wood are overgrown as a result of not having been managed for many years. The vast majority are no longer valuable on economic grounds and I shall explain why. In his book 'The History of the Countryside', the late Dr Oliver Rackham, the noted Cambridge botanist, explained that woodland such as that at South Wood is land on which trees have arisen naturally. Almost all natural woods were actively managed, for many hundreds of years, by the art of woodsmanship. including the widespread practice aimed at yielding successive crops of wood in perpetuity, either by coppicing or pollarding. Rackman states that the trees of a wood were divided into those that had been left to grow into a standard tree, such as an oak or ash, which yielded timber, when cut completely down, in the form of beams and planks. The remainder of the trees in a wood were classified as underwood, which included that mostly in the form of poles grown from the stools of the above mentioned coppiced or pollarded trees. Rackham tells us that woods were very valuable property. Indeed, the return from underwood alone, leaving out any valuable timber. was more than that from arable land. For at least 600 years up to Victorian times the prices of trees, both in the form of timber and underwood, either remained steady or rose in value. Nevertheless, by the middle of the 19th century, the huge demand for oak bark for tanning and timber for shipbuilding had collapsed. Unfortunately, many wood owners had been encouraged to grow oak trees at a time when demand seemed never ending and in woods like South Wood

and neighbouring East Hoath Wood it is clear that oaks that have long reached their maturity have not been felled and coppiced stools, particularly those of sweet chestnut, are now well overgrown.

#### THE ARISTOCRATIC CRICKETING TUFTON **BROTHERS OF RAINHAM**

In the Tufton family vault of St Margaret's church lay the remains of John and Henry Tufton who gained fame as first class cricketers over 200 years ago. Son of Sackville Tufton, the 8th Earl of Thanet and Mary Sackville, Henry Tufton succeeded his older brother Charles as the 8th Earl of Thanet in 1832. Educated at Westminster school, he joined the army and became Ensign in the 26th (Cameronian) Regiment of Foot. Later promoted to Captain, he also became a Whig MP for Rochester and then Appleby in held until he died of suspected tuberculosis in 1799. Westmorland and Lord Lieutenant of Kent. The Tufton family owned estates in Kent, Yorkshire, Westmorland and Cumberland. Henry and John Tufton never lived permanently in Rainham, they only the only visible reminder of him and his brother Henry stayed periodically.

Henry Tufton made his first appearance in first class cricket for a Surrey and Sussex XI against an England

XI at the original Lord's ground in 1793. Cricket historian Arthur Haygarth mentions in his 'Scores and Biographies' that Tufton was a successful batsman and wicket-keeper during his short career. His most memorable performance took place against Thursday six and caught two batsmen. He played in 77 first ground. After this match he retired from the game aged 26. A few years later Napoleon's army captured eventually got released.

Because Henry Tufton remained single he became the

The honourable John Tufton, Henry's younger brother also excelled at cricket. Educated at Westminster 1799. He is recorded in 74 matches of which 48 were played for several clubs but mainly for Marylebone Cricket Club for whom he performed as a batsman and debut for Marylebone Cricket Club against a Kent XI at Dartford Brent on 27th and 28th June 1793. Arthur Haygarth in his 'Scores and Biographies' records Tufton as the first player ever to be given out leg before wicket (lbw) in a first class match. This happened at Moulsey Hurst in August 1795 when Tufton played for an England XI against a Surrey XI. Bowler John Wells trapped him leg before wicket. Before this players were recorded as being bowled if they were given out after being hit on the leg. Tufton's final first class match took place against a Surrey XI at Lord's old ground in which he scored one and four. He only had a short cricketing career which spanned 1793 to 1799. He scored 1.049 runs and took 14 wickets.

After he finished playing cricket aged 25 Tufton became MP for Appleby in Westmorland, a seat he Described as a 'gentleman of extensive abilities,' in 'Memorials of the Family Tufton,' he was laid to rest in the Tufton family vault in St Margaret's church and today is Tufton Road which bears their surname.

Ontinued from Page 5 meeting on April 9th 1946 that he had arranged at St Margaret's Hall it was agreed restart the Club. The Colonel offered the ground rent free for the first season, (Gillingham Corporation to mow the grass) and in October suggested that he lend the club £200 at 2½% over five years - this towards buying a motor mower and a pavilion. Local farmer and equally keen cricketer Sid Callaway gave fifty guineas: mower and pavilion (an ex-Army portacabin) were purchased. By 1949 the address of Berengrove House was officially 33 Berengrave Lane, and its residents were Colonel Iremonger and his wife Gwendoline, together with their son James. All three were registered as voters in 1952, James's name followed by the letter S indicating 'Service voter'. Shortly afterwards alterations to the building were carried out, creating some separate flats, one of which was occupied by the Culmer family, Edmund, Ivy and John, Their flat acquired a separate address in 1955 - 37 Berengrave Lane. Number 35 also came into existence, and here the residents were Colonel and Mrs Iremonger and Bridget Daly, who was perhaps their housekeeper. James Iremonger remained at the main house. Also listed there were Ruby Ingram and Sheila Lloyd, while three other voters lived in 'Flat 33'. This was the first occasion on which the name Lloyd occurred. A few months later Charles Lloyd was also registered there: in 1956 Sheila's name had been replaced by those of Dorothy and Ellen. Other residents at 33 were Frederick and Elizabeth Atkins and Joyce Shewbridge. I wonder whether Gwendoline's health was failing by this time, for she died early in 1959. The Colonel stayed in Rainham at No.35 for only a short time. He died at Folkestone in 1970.

It seems that the large house might already have been largely converted to a Nursing Home, for by the end of 1959 the Lloyds, the Atkins and Joyce Shewbridge had been joined there by eleven other people. Some of these would have been additional staff, others patients. Dorothy Lloyd was a nurse - perhaps she had helped to care for Mrs Iremonger. 'Berengrove Park Nursing Home' flourished, the total number living at the address reaching 29 by October 1966.

The whole area had been changing too. In 1957 the

Berengrove estate had been bought by builder George Ward who soon afterwards began construction of the houses in Holmoaks, High Elms and The Willows. Continured on page 13


