#### THE RAINHAM, KENT, WAR MEMORIAL **FIRST WORLD WAR, 1914 – 1918**

Rainham's war memorial at St Margaret's Church lists the names of 99 men who died between 1914-20. The men of Rainham represented a variety of military Services. For example, 23 joined the Royal Navy, 12 served with the local, Buffs (East Kent Regiment), two men fought for Australia, and four represented Canadian regiments.

Two men, Colour Sergeants Thomas Swan (AIF), and Francis Baker (Buffs) were awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal.

Details from the Commonwealth War Graves Commission reveal the ages of 69 of the Rainham men, which ranged from 17 to 61 years.

It also provided addresses and family details of many of the men who fell in the First World War. For example, the memorial includes brothers, fathers, sons and husbands. At least 14 men lived in Station Road, six in Ivy Street, and three from Tufton Road. Others lived in 'cottages' along Bredhurst Road. London Road and other Rainham addresses still present today.

The Rainham men listed are buried locally, and throughout the world, including France, Belgium, India, Iraq, Egypt, Turkey and Russia. Many others have no known grave.

The loss of 99 Rainham men would have had a considerable impact on a small, closely knit population of around 4000 people, dependent upon agricultural labour.

We can only imagine how the war touched the lives of so many Rainham families.

For example, see the following three men, who lived in William Street:-

It can be seen, that these men were the same age when the Great War began, and lived nearby each other in the same street.

Their loss would have been tragic for any family, particularly as the first two men died within three days of

Rainham would have been continually affected by such casualties, which escalated as the war progressed. For example, the Rainham memorial reveals 7 men lost in 1914, 15 men in 1915, 22 men in 1916, another 22 men in 1917, 24 men in 1918, and 6 during 1919. Another two men recorded on the war memorial died in 1920, Two Rainham men, died when HMS Princess Irene' was sunk on 27/5/15, and another three men were lost when the Cruiser HMS 'Natal' went down on the 30/12/15... It may be of interest that 2nd Lieutenant Harold Greenhalgh recorded on the war memorial, was the Headmaster of the Rainham Council school. The Landlord of the local pub also lost a son.

The Rainham memorial records the names of those that died during the War. It does not include the wounded or all those who also served during the First World War. I am sure many local families, or those with a Rainham connection, could add to these details and tell what they know of the experiences of those who returned. Electoral registers would show where more of these people lived. Census and Parish records would reveal more about their families. Local business directories would indicate their occupations. Newspapers of the day may provide photographs of these servicemen, as well as individual details.

I hope someone may research this, so that those names recorded on the Rainham memorial, and all the others who served, will be remembered. The memorial is not only a record of Rainham's contribution and sacrifice, but also rich source of local history. Wilder Gardening without upsetting your neighbours

An online workshop Thursday 12th November Our wildlife is in trouble. We are suffering loss of Biodiversity at an alarming rate, but it's not too late. We can all do something to reverse the trend & these actions, however small, will add up to a huge difference.

I work with an award-winning team of Volunteers at Kent Wildlife Trust who are eager to encourage people to make their gardens & local green space more nature friendly. This year, because of Covid 19, we are unable to visit gardens in person, so the Volunteers have been giving wildlife friendly gardening advice using digital means. We have found similar questions occur on regular basi s and, rather than just issuing a standard list of "frequently asked questions", we have planned a series of short, friendly workshops. #### MEMORIES OF STATION ROAD, RAINHAM

The article in the Jan/Feb issue of Action Forum jogged memories of my walk to Rainham C of E School at the top of Station Road in the early 1940s. I was born in 1934 and have lived in Rainham all my life. Our family lived at the far end of Henry Street (then a cul de sac).

At the junction of Henry Street and Station Road on the lower side was Brinsons, a general store who kept a limited stock due to war time rationing. On the opposite side was Hales the Butcher. Being a small family butcher he was able to deal with small groups of families who collected scraps and waste food to feed a single pig, rabbits or chicken.

A little further down Station Road was Tom Pearce, a gentleman's barbers. Whilst we were waiting our turn there was a box of metal puzzles to try and solve, also a machine secured to the wall with two handles on the front which when rotated gave you a tingling feeling in each hand.

On the opposite corner of Henry Street were two empty shops (after the war these became Johnsons Iron Mongers).

The next place of interest was Kemps Builders, Undertakers and Timber yard where logs were piled up before being lifted by the shearlegs crane onto the rack bench for conversion into planks. Then I come to Wakeley Road junction (named after William Henry Wakeley, the farmer who owned the land on which it was built). On this corner was a general store, Roots. If my memory serves me correctly he had a small van to deliver goods. A few yards up Station Road was a greengrocers, Pilchers. They sold only local grown produce again due to wartime restrictions.

Further up the road which is still one of the entrances to Rainham Recreation Ground was Bert Dunk and his daughter Elsie who ran a Fish shop, where you could purchase wet fish, or in the evenings fried fish and chips, a piece of cod or similar for 2 old pence and/or one old penny or a halfpenny of chips (remember 240 old pennies made £1). He displayed a selection of fish which every Friday morning he

hawked on a large barrow along local streets. The area between the Fish shop and railway line was a large allotment ground which was extensively worked during the war years, now a car park.

Opposite the allotments was the Post Office (post master - Enoch Raines) He was assisted by his two sisters. It also served as a general household store. Many of the goods for sale were displayed hanging from hooks in the ceiling i.e. pots and pans, garden sieves, enamel jugs and bowls also coal shovels and

Then there was the Signal Box. Mr Post operated the gates by turning a large hand wheel to open or close them, they slowly swung across the road. He was watched with great interest when traffic and people were waiting for the gates to open.

On the lower corner of Solomon Road was an A.R.P. ( air raid post) shelter constructed of concrete with steps leading down for their safety. This was manned by volunteers, one of whom was my father. Tufton Road corner was Mr Briggs, General Store & Tobacconist. Also on rare occasions he sold Dinky toys. All young boys were keen to collect these model airplanes. Next door was Mr Albert Petts, the boot and shoe repairer. He was in great demand to mend footwear, he also sold rubber heels, quarter irons, hobnails and pieces of leather and shoe brads. My father was a regular customer as he used to sole and heel the families shoes, soles wore out quickly as people had to walk everywhere.

On the corner of Webster Road was Wilkins an Iron Mongers and Garen Tool shop. They kept a large display of things which could be used in the country to catch vermin. In the shop a trap door led down to the cellar, Mr Wilkins or his son would go down to fill your can with paraffin, Also for items not regularly sold. Customers were amazed to see Nelly Wilkin grab a fist full of tin tacks with her bare hands to weigh - a real tough old lady.

Arnolds fruit and vegetable shop was opposite on the corner of Hothfield Road. All the produce for sale was locally grown. May Worley's Newsagents was further up the road. She was later joined by her brother who rode a large framed bicycle when doing his evening

Perks the Grocer was on the corner of Longley Road. Fridays were a treat for us as they sold small beef sausages, half the size of a modern chipolata, which were cooked for Sunday breakfast. The Co-op Butchers was a few doors up. Sides of meat hung from the ceiling. Meat was boned, chopped, cut and weighed to supply the rations for each family. Three men Mr Lacy, Mr Stevens and Mr Parnell cut and served the rations 4oz of meat per person during the war and for some time afterwards.

Further up Mr Frank Rule's Newsagent & Tobacconists kept a selection of snuff which was weighed on special scales for very small quantities. The paper boys and young girls delivered to all of Rainham. Next was another butchers 'Kemsley' who also displayed their sides of meat hung from rails. At the top of Station Road opposite the school I attended was Rainham Co-op divided into two sections (grocery & provisions and Drapery & Millinery) The grocery side had a big display of goods on sale in the window and rashers of bacon were cut to order. The haberdashery side had little to display as this was the era of 'make do and mend' or knitting replacements where possible.

Some elderly residents may have fond memories of other places inn Station Road which I have omitted. Dick Grice 01634 363516

#### **Rainham Community Orchard**

The orchard was born of a conversation between the landowner, Jimmy Zammitt, and Hamish Mackay Miller in 2014. A volunteer project from the start, the aim was to recover a neglected orchard while encouraging wildlife and flora. Any profits were and are donated to various conservation charities including Kent Wildlife Trust.

The first two years were hard work as volunteer numbers dwindled to a handful. Jungle clearance rather than orchard management best describes that period and we remember the early pioneers with gratitude. Gradually we brought the orchard into better shape. It is now a constant round of mowing, strimming, weeding, mulching and pruning but we now have the numbers to engage in other activities. Our organisation has been loose and consensual and we have progressed as much by trial and error as any

more formal means. We discussed and agreed most things at our post work tea, coffee and cake gatherings, which often featured home-made offerings from volunteers. Sadly Covid means that we now stand in a well distanced circle instead and the catering and our occasional barbecues are no longer possible.

In addition to maintaining what we have we have also planted over forty new trees, predominantly traditional varieties. These are a mixture of donations from Brogdale and grafted specimens. The latter were the work of the late John Hill, such a knowledgeable and thoughtful member of our group. John was interested in promoting wildlife in the orchard and instigated the building of log pile refuges, bird boxes and feeding stations and the planting of wild flowers. These and other, similar ventures have been enthusiastically continued by other volunteers.

The Pick Your Own Weekends that we hold each autumn are a focus for our work and give us the chance to show off the orchard and meet the people of Medway. It is a reward for us all to see the pleasure that they and their children take from their time in the orchard. This year we took over £4500 – a record.

We meet every Tuesday and Thursday from about 9.30am and visitors and volunteers are always welcome. We also have juice for sale on site. We have a Facebook group Rainham Community Orchard which carries news and pictures if you want to take a virtual look.

## Nature Notes

COSMO NATURE NOTES FOR OCTOBER

I was recently given a copy of "Panoramas of English Villages", published in 1993. In it the authors claim that "Villages are eternal. Nothing in the 20th century seems to portray old-age values as powerfully as villages do". As it so happens, I have a related book entitled "Boxley Village Memories" by Robin Ambrose, published in 2014, which contains memories mostly of the first seven decades of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. I wondered what age-old values the Boxley inhabitants revealed by their memories Itherefore visited Boxley on a fine Autumnal day, paying particular attention to certain people and places mentioned in the book. Boxley is on the road to Penenden Heath Maidstone via Bredhurst and the road through it is called The Street. I began my visit at The Green, at one end of which is The King's Arms and at the other the Church of St Mary and All Saints. I had read that, in the past, the pub had been well patronised by farm workers at the many mixed farms in and around the village. It was particularly crowded on pay days and this was so into the 1960s. A regular patron of the King's Arms was the Reverend Hale, described as "Boxley's last gentleman parson." Not able to ride a horse or drive a car, he would visit his parishioners on foot or by bicycle. He was seen as a man of the world who enjoyed a drink. Adjacent to the pub is Forge Lane, at the end of which, now a dwelling, was the forge of the village blacksmith, at one time Harry Hills. From the top of the Lane one could often see thousands upon thousands of red poppies growing in crops of wheat. Today the view of one of serried rows of vines.

Back on The Street, and heading up it, I passed a red brick terrace of houses, the first one of which, behind a red telephone box, was "The Nurses' House." One of the nurses was Winifred Kendall and another was Evelyn Trousdell who was remembered as "a sweet and gentle lady". The Parish Nurses wore cloaks and bonnets, travelled to their patients by bicycle and carried their equipment in a black Gladstone Bag. The wages and expenses of the nurses were paid from a Fund to which the well-off ladies of the Parish donated. At the other end of the terrace once lived the village carpenter and wheelwright, Isaac Cripps. His

workshop was next to his house and, after his death, it was turned into a garage which now stands disused. His wife cared for the two young girls of Mrs Styles at Boxley House and she was known, not unnaturally, as Nanny Cripps. Further up The Street is a detached red brick house with a bright red front door which was once The Woodman Inn. It was favoured by members of the Cyclists Touring Club, the Medway Wheelers and the Maidstone Aces motorcyclists. Further still up The Street, where the modern houses are, was a large cherry orchard which, in July, was full of the horse drawn, colourful caravans of local gypsies who picked the cherries.

Once upon a time, the Parish had a policeman. PC Ted Kirby served after the First World War and another, more recently, was PC Tom Rumble who patrolled his patch on a heavy bicycle. Occasionally he would have to visit places on the top of the Downs, which involved pushing his bike up Boxley Hill. He carried a pair of binoculars which enabled him to observe likely suspects in the countryside. He kept a close watch for youths out catching rabbits with ferrets and nets, shooting plump young rooks, poaching trout in the grounds of Place House and, less seriously, scrumping apples and cherries. Tom spent many hours supervising the dipping of sheep, a requirement of the law. Gypsies were a problem when setting up camp on private land but poachers were a much bigger problem. In 1945 the Church of England Primary School in The Street closed and the children had to go to school in Maidstone. Vicky Sadler remembers walking home from Eastborough School and, on hot, summer days, she and her friends would take off their socks and shoes and paddle in the sheep wash, off Tyland Lane, and through which ran the chalk stream known as Boxley Brook. The cold spring water was clear and was pure enough to drink. In due course the old school became the village hall and here met the Young People's Fellowship, set up by the Rev Tom Pritchard. It was a great success but was wound down in 1958, sometime after Rev Tom moved on. On leaving with her father, Tom's daughter Jan had said that "growing up in beautiful Boxley, and especially living in the Vicarage, with its wonderful gardens, was such a privilege and one that I shall never forget."

On the fine Autumn day of my visit I had noted the fiery mixture of the vellow and crimson leaves of the

wild cherry trees along the edge of Boxley Wood; the gold, orange and purple foliage of the large beech trees next to the church and the golden yellow leaves of the field maples down Tyland Lane. I have not left way. Reverend Clifford was always a pleasant and myself any room to write about the domestic staff who approachable man, as was his Curate of the time Brian worked at Boxley House and Place House. I live in Devon but whenever I visit my mother in Parkwood I browse through Action Forum. On one front cover was a picture of the St. Margaret's Church Choir June 1963. I was 15 years lived in Solomon Road. I went to school with Terry old when the picture was taken and it all came flooding back! I started to remember not only those in Richard, and their mother and father were all so the picture, but also those not in the picture.

I remember most of the adults in the choir and look back with particular affection on Harry Freegard, the Choirmaster, who was a hard taskmaster but also a very fair, friendly and encouraging man. Why do the birds of the north Kent marshes need

Each winter, the continuous swathe of coastal habitat between Gravesend and Whitstable plays home to thousands of wading birds and waterfowl from as far afield as Greenland, Scandinavia and the Arctic. 250,000 birds shelter here in winter

16,000 hectares are home for many rare species These are fragile habitats, protected by international and European designations owing to their importance for wildlife. Visitors can unintentionally cause disturbance to wildlife.

Cold and wet weather can make life tough for birds and when they are disturbed they can stop feeding, or may even fly away wasting valuable energy. They need to spend as much time as possible feeding to ensure they can make the long flight back to their breeding ground in spring.

#### Good behaviour guide on land

Stay a good distance away from feeding or resting

Follow signs and requests and keep to paths. Keep your dog under close control, on a short lead if unreliable.

Exercise your dog away from birds and never allow dogs to chase birds.

Stay on the landward side of the sea wall whenever possible.

Always clean up after your dog and take all rubbish

#### Good behaviour guide on the water

At high tide stay away from roosting birds. Avoid landing on the islands, they are used for breeding in summer and roosting in winter. Keep noise levels low.

Only use authorised launch sites.

Keep to the speed limits.

View wildlife from at least 100m away and move if they become agitated.


