#### Hello there,

Just got the Action Forum through the door with the Hempstead Working mans club on the cover. My Great Grandfather John Sidney Spiller was the Chairman and my Grandfather Sidney John Spiller was the Secretary who sadly died in 1940 aged 38 with lung cancer.

In 1927, they bought a few plots that were being sold off and built the bungalows opposite, where my Mother was born and still lives and where I, myself was born.

When Mum was about 12, her mum, Dorothy Spiller, with her partner, Ernest Ashby, used to work the bar, and Mum's job was to collect and wash the glasses.

Since then there has been a lot of changes and it became the Flying Saucer in around 1952 (I think).

I grew up with the pub being outside the front door, with the noise of laughter (and the odd argument) coming from it's doors, but as most were locals, they all knew me and said hello. The old opening times of 11 till 3, then 6 to 11 applied.

Not sure about the car though.

The off licence was to the right end side of the building, the then hall was knocked down and made into the now car park.

We were never allowed in there, but my brother (Peter Collins) frequented it often with not far to stagger home! He sadly also died young at 40 due to cancer in 1999.

#### Austin Seven Owners' Club

Hello and thanks for the latest magazine. I always read it avidly, and have done since I moved back to Rainham in 1971.

I am the secretary of the Kent Centre of the Austin Seven Owners' Club (London), and as such have many friends across the county who are very experienced when it comes to identifying the Austins depicted in old photographs such as the Hempstead scene on the front of the May 2021 issue of Action Forum.

I initially thought the motor to be an Austin Seven, but there were certain things that didn't quite "fit". After consulting two of our club experts, the conclusion is that it is an Austin Seven, but not a standard model. This Seven has a special fabric covered wooden panelled body made by Mulliner, and would have been produced on a standard rolling chassis supplied to them by the Austin Motor Co. This model would have been shown in the Mulliner catalogue, and was available in 1927/28. This would have been an expensive option compared with the standard Seven, so only a few of these would have been produced. There has always been a group of motorists who want to be "different", and this was a way of having a nicer little 7hp car, more "refined" than usual, when commonly, the alternative would probably have been one of 12hp, with all the additional running costs that entailed. All the main car manufacturers in the UK were producing fabric bodies at the time, but they proved lacking when it came to durability, and the fad didn't last long. We are lucky enough to have some members who still own and run such cars, but they are now a great rarity – the cars, that is!

I hope you find this interesting, and if you would like to know more about pre-WWII Austins do let me know.

## Riverside Country Park Forum

My daily wellness-plod regularly takes me through Berengrave Lane Nature Reserve and across the Lower Rainham Road to Riverside Country Park.

In 2020, after completing an online survey about the park, I was invited to join the Riverside Forum and have now attended the first two (Zoom-based) meetings co-ordinated by Medway Green Space and Medway Norse.

The last meeting (24/03/21) shared details of the recent planting programme along Motney edge, where 950 new plants have been added. The Riverside Bee project was also described, along with the creation of the Bee Garden, Wildflower Meadow and path.

A ten-year plan has been created for Berengrave Lane Nature Reserve, and whilst plans for the replacement of the lower boardwalk have been delayed due to site flooding, further public consultation is planned for later this year.

## Earth Day 2021 in Rainham

On April 22nd, Rainham celebrated Earth Day 2021.

Rainham Eco Hub celebrated in style, with residents involved in litter picks and schools learning how to have a positive effect on the local environment.

Classes were involved in activities ranging from how things grow to calculating our carbon footprint!

An eco squad for primary-aged children (4-11 years old) was launched, encouraging children and their families to work together to look after and protect the environment in Rainham.

Cozenton Park hung hand-crafted medallions for people to find.

Rainham Recreation Ground held a tree scavenger hunt.

Residents were encouraged to shop locally, walk, join community groups etc.

St Margaret's Church announced they have been awarded the Bronze Eco Award.

Medway Council's Recycling Team hosted a roadshow outside Rainham Library where the team explained how they take part in the national Terracycle scheme. It runs at each Medway Library/Hub - the Kids Food Pouch Recycling Scheme collects used baby food pouches of any brand, including any kids yoghurt pouches. All fifteen libraries and hubs have a recycling bin inside (normally near the children's section).

Proceeds from this recycling goes to a child bereavement support charity 'Holding On, Letting Go'.

Don't forget, whilst there you can also grab your kitchen caddy bins (free), liners (26 - £2) and dog poo bags (50 - £1.60)The Recycling Team noted their support for Medway's reuseable bags (blue for cardboard/paper, white for glass/tins/ packaging).

Please don't use the clear, single-use plastic bags as anything other than overflow recycling. They are not bag liners and just create more landfill.

# Nature Notes (Joe Ennis)

Now in Maytime to the wicket
Out I march with bat and pad:
See the son of grief at cricket
Trying to be glad.
A E Housman 1859-1936 (Author of "A
Shropshire Lad.")

At my secondary school we pupils were required to play cricket and rugby. Like A E Housman, I was never very fond of cricket. But, as time went by, I began to enjoy sitting for an hour or so watching any game of cricket I came across in my travels in the Kent countryside. Such a sojourn would give me the opportunity to take in the scenery, soak up the atmosphere and give the occasional clap for a ball well driven and a wicket well taken. I write below about three of my favourite pitches, those at Goodnestone, Leeds and Milstead.

Goodnestone is near Wingham, between Canterbury and Sandwich. It sits in a landscape of large open fields of cereals and sheep. The village consists of Goodnestone House, whose gardens are open to the public, a primary school, a village hall, a church (which houses the post office), a row of almshouses and a pub called the Fitzwalter Arms.

It is a typical estate village with an air of coherence and timelessness. Visitors to Goodnestone House can, if they wish, watch any cricket match in progress from a seat on the Lower Terrace. The pitch is on the edge of a parkland of oak, sweet chestnut and lime trees. House martins and swallows can be seen hawking for flies above the cricket field. The former nest under the eaves of the Georgian house and the latter on beams in various outbuildings on the estate. The persistent calls of young rooks can be heard at their nesting site in a nearby clump of sycamore trees. Refreshments can be had at the Fitzwalter Arms and in the Old Coach House after the payment of a modest entry fee

to Goodnestone Park Gardens.

The cricket pitch at Leeds, near Maidstone, is in the grounds of Leeds Castle and within the sound of the bells of St Nicholas' Parish Church. The turrets of the castle can be seen peeping through the trees in the valley of the diminutive River Len and spectators have a view, on the horizon, of the long line of the North Downs. Adjoining the pitch is parkland of oak, beech, sycamore and horse chestnut trees, in the shade of which sheep shelter from the heat of the day. Just within the boundary of the pitch is a large, old common lime which sprouts nests of side shoots at its base and around burrs on the trunk. Now that the common lime at the St Lawrence Ground at Canterbury has come down, the specimen on the Leeds pitch appears to be unique in Kent. Any ball which is hit into the tree and which fails to find its way to the ground is declared a six. On a pleasant May day, one can typically hear the calls of swifts as they chase each other around the tower of Leeds church and, from the direction of the parkland, the wingclaps of wood pigeons and the occasional "yaffle" of a green woodpecker. The loud calls of barnacle and Canada geese flying above the waters surrounding Leeds Castle can often be heard. Refreshments for spectators are to be had at the George Public House in Leeds village.

Milstead is a hamlet in the North Downs to the south of Sittingbourne. It is surrounded by coppiced woodland and cherry, apple and pear orchards. The woodland is actively managed by the Torrey Hill Estate which converts sweet chestnut poles into various forms of fencing. A by- product of this management is that, in the spring, the woods sport spectacular displays of bluebells as well as a good show of wood spurge, greater

stitchwort, red campion and yellow archangel. Although newly created cherry orchards with dwarf stock now predominate in the area, a few old orchards, with standard trees, under which sheep graze, have survived. Such a combination, once common in Kent, is gradually disappearing. The cricket pitch at Milstead lies in a slight depression at the heart of the village and is surrounded by oak, horse chestnut, ash, sycamore and field maple trees. The cricket club was founded in 1857 and has a pavilion and a score- keeper's hut which are both thatched. As I sat on the boundary during one May visit to the pitch the predominant sounds, apart from the crack of leather on willow, were the calls of a few remaining immature rooks clinging tenaciously to the uppermost branches of a rookery next to the church of St Mary and the Holy Cross. The rookery was spread between a large, evergreen holm oak and an adjoining spinney of wych elm trees. A quintessential sign of spring was once an active rookery in the English elm trees of a village church yard. As a result of Dutch elm disease, that kind of scene is but a memory, certainly in Kent. But, at Milstead, one can still sit in a country church yard and listen to the sounds of a rookery in nearby elm trees, albeit wych elms rather than English elms. Visitors to Milstead Cricket Ground can obtain refreshment at the Red Lion Inn in Rawling Street, Milstead.

## June in the Wilder Garden

(Victoria Golding) Gardening for a Wilder Kent advisor

What a season we are having! From no rain to speak of in April, to a May that was wet and very cold. Many of my plants are six weeks behind, so to talk about what will happen in June is crystal ball territory! The abundance of rain has given me a lushness that I don't normally see and I've been thinning my stone fruit so the branches do not break. I am pruning the perennials, (known as the "Chelsea chop", as this is usually the time of year for the Chelsea Flower Show). I'm even moving some that have outgrown their homes because the ground is so wet! I am mulching with some more of my sieved compost. I love seeing the little red worms that have digested all the shreddings that help balance the heaps. If your compost looks slimy, you need more woody material and paper. If it is in a sheltered place, like mine, make sure it isn't too dry. At last I have seen Holly Blue butterflies. As we have both holly and ivy in our garden, we usually have a good population but land adjacent to us has been redeveloped for housing and good insect habitat removed. I feared our little outpost was not going to be enough, but maybe I was too pessimistic and it was the cold and wet weather affecting them. Flowering trees and shrubs are wonderful for pollinators. Try to cultivate a different shrub for flower all year round. Make a photographic record, month by month, to see when the seasonal gaps are.

#### Plant of the month

There is always room for another lavender. No room in the border? Get a big pot! "Gros Bleu" is the best for bees.

#### Job of the month

Did you try **No Mow May**? Try to keep it going in areas with wild flowers and patches of tall grasses. You could have grasshoppers later in the summer and wouldn't the children love that!

# The Co-op Treats (cont. from May) As told to Maggie Francis by the late Alan Major

The children with 'tickets' would sit in long rows across the grass at the Rec and volunteer lady members of the Rainham Co-op Women's Guild would walk along with large wicker clothes baskets filled with sandwiches, bread and butter, buns and slices of various different cakes. They would be followed by other lady helpers carrying long white enamel jugs of tea to be poured into the dozens of outward thrust cups and mugs.

When the children had finished eating, members' children could also have free rides on the swings, roundabout, coconut shies, hoopla and other sideshows. The children of the non-members had to pay for the privilege of sitting down to eat and enjoy the swing rides etc. The 'Treat' was aimed at being a perk for Co-op membership.

Penfold's Fair, with a magnificent roundabout and all the rides, was an attraction along with the side-shows at the 'Treat' and set up on the Rec. There were running races, egg and spoon and sack races for boys and girls whose parents had obtained tickets from the Co-op previously for them to enter. Races for adults were held after Tea or in the early evening, the winners receiving 'useful prizes'.

What would seem nowadays to be a somewhat amusing contest on 'Treat' day in the 1930s was to clean a silver spoon which had been made really black and tarnished. Alan recalls, 'The spoon, along with a yellow cloth and a tin of C.W.S. Silvo polish was laid out for each competitor and on the word 'go' the children started to clean vigorously. A time limit was set after which the judges judged for cleanliness and brightness. The prize? A big package of C.W.S. products - brass polish, silver polish, polishing cloths, blacking etc.! Maypole dancing was another attraction in the 1920s with beribboned, white-dressed local girls trained by a Mrs Brunning whose father, Mr Bardon, was President of the Rainham Co-op at the time. It was such an exciting day and so enjoyed by the local population of Rainham and those living in Upchurch and Lower Halstow. Sadly Co-op involvement with the 'Treats' ended before the 1939 War but it was a fun day with crowds of lively people enjoying themselves.

An extra perk enjoyed by the local children of the Council School in Solomon Road, was on the Monday after the 'Treat'. As soon as they left their classes for dinner they raced to the corner of the Rec and on their hands and knees turned over every blade of grass, in the hope of finding dropped coins. Sometimes they were rewarded with pennies and halfpennies but just occasionally a shiny silver sixpence was found half trodden into the turf!


