Editorial

Hopefully you have been able to take part in activities, and socialise, since the remaining Covid restrictions were removed. It's good to see events start taking place again so please check out the diary for things to do locally. Following its use as a Covid testing centre, one of the buildings hosting events again is the Oast Community Centre. Three bands are performing there on 10th September. The closure of music venues such as Beacon Court has limited the places for live music so it's good to see a venue for bands to perform locally.

There were some great responses to the photo of Marshall Road in July. We have received fascinating photos of Edwin Road that will feature in a future edition along with some earlier history. We've also had a letter asking about a missing bridleway that used to exist between houses on Spekes Road and would have joined the existing bridleway that leads towards Hempstead Valley, past the Fairview Road junction. If you have any recollections of when it disappeared or how to trace missing bridleways please contact the editor.

Over recent months there seem to have been a continuous stream of roadworks around the area, from the highway works in Otterham Quay Lane to City Fibre laying new cables along the A2 and some residential streets. The team behind them seem to be kept busy as the locations keep changing. Hopefully it might be a nice challenge for the kids to spot them when they are out and about too!

Letters to the Editor

Further to our recent correspondence regarding the motor car pictured on the cover of the May 2021 issue, I attach a picture of that model recently taken at our A7OC Rally at Bewl Water, where we had eighty cars attending. The picture shows a 1929 example which has been restored to a very high standard, and clearly shows the distinctive circular ventilation disc on the scuttle in front of the door, along with the calorimeter on the radiator. The pram hood irons on this example were not on the car in the previous picture, but were purely decorative and probably optional.



The open tourer pictured on the front of the **July edition** is harder to identify as the picture is dark and doesn't show any

distinctive features that I can see. Several car manufacturers were producing cars of this size and style in the mid twenties, though there were very few saloons. The artillery wheels and scuttle mounted lamps are typical of the period. Interestingly, there is no rear door for access to the back seats, but there appears to be a step behind the rear mudguard. There may have been a rear door on the opposite side, but in the interests of body rigidity this may also have been omitted. If I was a betting man I would guess that the car was again an Austin - this time a 12 horsepower model. Out of interest, the engine in this car was very reliable, and was also employed in Austin London taxis up until the late 1940s! Hope this is of interest. Regards

Toe Rags in Rainham

(recollected to Maggie Francis)

Horace Moore is a Rainham boy through and through. He was born in 1933, lived at 205 Station Road and has shared memories and some of the many stories of his life and time growing up in Rainham.

The Oast House next to the Station was the main Office for Wakeley Brothers' many businesses. Horace remembers horses and carts going up Station Road taking wheat to the Oast, where the sacks of grain were hoisted up from the back of the carts into the building, but Horace was more aware that the wheat came in on the barges.

That was where he was happiest, down by the water, with everything associated with the river.

When Horace was a lad, Rainham was just a small community with the majority of the population involved working in various ways on the river, in the brickfields or in the agricultural community.

Along with the rest of the local children, he went to Solomon Road School from the age of 5. No fancy introductions to school in those days. As he says, 'You just got left at the door on the first day and was left to get on with it'. By the grand age of six and half, Horace was doing his first job. George (Cully) Carter had young Horace picking up winkles with him and running up and down Station Road selling them from door to door. Young Horace would sell the catch from an old cart, calling on the locals to buy a basin of whatever it was that he and Cully had caught that day.

Horace loved the river and would go shrimping and winkling in the winter on the mud flats. Spring found him trawling for pink shrimps and brown shrimps and fluing (catching flounders). People would buy them

off the boats.

At the age of 13 Horace was taken on as an Apprentice to Jack Carter (Cully's grandson) to become a Freeman of the River Medway. Four years later Horace was called up for National Service. His love of the river made him want to go into The Naval Reserve, but he couldn't because he was colour blind. Instead he went into the Army and served in Suez. He earned 36 shillings a week in the Army and, apart from 5 shillings which he kept for himself, sent all the rest home to his dear old mum. He found out later that his mum had saved up all his for him. Once out of the Army and home in Rainham, he did all kinds of jobs associated with the river. He worked on various barges, moving timber, cement and ballast. He was on one, 'Kentish Hoy', a 120-ton motor barge, which had been built originally in 1904. Horace belonged to the river and it was obviously 'in his blood', but he realised the need to get himself established. He was good at catching the fish and had a natural talent for selling the fish door to door. His opportunity to allow his love of sharing 'the catch' with the local population of Rainham came in 1984 when he established Hales and Moore fishmongers in Station Road to build a business with his family.

Horace loves to tell wonderful tales of old Rainham, one of which he has shared. When talking about old friends, he related tales of how they ensured they managed safely across the mud flats. Apparently, the boots had to be a very tight fit so that the feet were secure and you could get a better, more solid grip on the mud! What better way than to get some old bits of rag and wrap them tightly round each toe to fill out the boots?

Who knew that was where the term 'toe rag'

Nature Notes

(Joe Ennis)

NATURE NOTES FOR JULY/AUGUST I paid a visit to a river, only four miles long, but which played an extremely important role in the development of the coastal town through which it still flows.

I drove, passing the spires of Canterbury Cathedral on the horizon, and continued along the A2, as it keeps to the general direction of the old Roman Road across the high, flat ridge of the North Downs. Approaching Dover, I left the by-pass and turned back onto the old A2 to Lydden Hill, at the head of the long valley that leads to Dover Docks, some five miles away. I arrived at the village of Temple Ewell, nearby to which the River Dour begins as a spring. This is one of Kent's very few chalk streams. It has had a chequered history and bears little resemblance to the idyllic chalk streams of Hampshire and elsewhere which we see on the television. When the use of running water to power machinery was at its height, the Dour was lined with eight corn mills, five paper mills, sawmills, a tannery and an iron foundry. It was not until 1993, after 92 years of petitioning of the Environment Agency and its predecessors, that the Dour was given back its age-old recognition as a river, to recover its dignity and importance. It now receives the protection in law afforded to all rivers and the mill buildings have gradually been demolished or converted for other uses. Even so, the Dour still suffers from the legacies of its industrial use. Firstly, there are many obstructions to the passage of fish and eels, particularly in the weirs that have been left behind. Secondly, the natural course of the river is fragmented by, for example, former millponds. That said, it is now clean and supports a significant colony of native brown trout which spawn in the gravel beds, in the winter, in the river's lower reaches. I planned to follow as much of the course of the river as was possible by car. Just after Temple Ewell, I came to Kearsney Abbey, where a total of five interconnected ornamental lakes feed back into the Dour.

The lakes, Abbey and surrounding parkland are owned by Dover District Council and very popular with local people. I found myself following the river through a maze of streets, where I stopped occasionally to look, with a sense of curiosity and expectation. I saw no trout but the water was clear and there was floral evidence that the Dour was a chalk stream; floating rafts of water crowfoot were anchored to the gravel bed of the river. Sadly, the display of hundreds of its white flowers on the surface of the river had finished blooming but I also noted yellow flags, purple loosestrife and water mint.

I eventually arrived at the Crabble Corn Mill which is one of the most complete and working 18th century corn mills in Europe. It is a tall building covered in white painted clapboard. There was a notice about guided walks on the River Dour Path Trail from Wellington Docks to Temple Ewell, organised by the White Cliffs Countryside Partnership. I would have liked to be able to follow the Dour by foot, as it runs besides roads and footpaths, behind railings, at the bottom of domestic gardens, between buildings and under bridges. It would have been intriguing to follow all of the, sometimes unpredictable, course of the river. As I moved further into Dover, the traffic was getting denser, so I made a return to Temple Ewell.

My exploration of the village's narrow streets and lanes revealed such names as Brookside, Riverside, Watersend and Mill Street, showing the proximity and importance of the Dour. The old corn mill in Mill Street has been converted. The Dour itself, just off the High Street, is little more than a brook during a hot August yet not far from its source. I crossed over it via a small bridge, from under which flew a male grey wagtail with a splendid yellow breast. It may have had a late brood, in

a space created by a dislodged brick. Hart's tongue fern, which favours chalk soil, was growing at the base of the bridge and a walk upstream revealed typical waterside plants such as great willow herb, water mint, water parsnips, fool's watercress and purple loosestrife. As I sat, children of Temple Ewell Church of England primary School, which stands next to the church of St Peter and St Paul, were having games on the nearby village playing field. I could hear their squeals, the babbling of the nascent chalk stream as it flowed over the weir of the old mill, the calling of jackdaws in nearby trees and the occasional rumbling of a passenger train travelling slowly as it approached Kearsney Station. These sounds did, I think, sum up nicely an afternoon in the life of present-day Temple Ewell.

September in the Wilder Garden (Victoria Golding)

This is a month of renewal. It is a long time since I've had a new pencil case and new school shoes, but I still feel the excitement a new school year brings.

We are told to be mindful and "live in the moment", but for me planning brings freedom. This autumn we will complete our large wildlife pond! It has been a long time in the making but next month I hope to give you a progress report. The pond plants we bought for it last year have happily grown and seeded in their watery containers, but they need to be in their permanent homes. A frog is living in one of them already!

If you want to introduce a pond to your garden, autumn is a good time to make a start and get it ready for spring. There is lots of advice on how to do this on the Wildlife Trust's website, for

example.

Plant of the month There are still many autumn flowers to provide nectar and

provide nectar and pollen, like nerines, hesperantha and Japanese anemones, but my favourite at this time of year is ivy,



full of ivy bees and providing nectar for the last brood of holly blue butterflies. Ivy only flowers when it climbs upwards, so do allow it to cover an old shed or wall or unsightly fence.

Job of the month

Remove the last of your rotted leaf mould, sieve and bag it up to use as seed sowing compost, then start your bin with the first leaves that drop. In dry weather they drop early, but we won't be seeing that so much this year! Add plenty of twigs and paper to your compost heap, water well, mix and cover. Gather your windfalls and cut the fruit for the bird table. If you have other wildlife visiting, leave some cut pieces on the ground round objects are difficult for hedgehogs to deal with.


