When emergency works clash with planned improvements it can have a massive impact on traffic jams in the area so maybe we all need to consider which times we could walk or cycle as alternatives to our cars, helping the environment as well as stress levels.

When out in Rainham recently I noticed a garden floral display that was covered with electric fence wiring. Whilst effective at preventing theft or vandalism, it's a sad situation that someone feels it necessary in their front garden.

On a more positive note, it was great to see the recent gig at the Oast Community centre being sold out. There are similar events coming up there, and elsewhere, and I'm sure they'll appreciate your support.

Splashes leisure centre is now scheduled for demolition due to problems found with the building. Checking Action Forum for when it opened in 1990, I doubt they expected the pool's lifespan to be under 30 years but it will be good to see the new building rising from the rubble over the next few years and seeing new facilities available for the area.

Whilst on the subject of facilities, this year we've made the most of being able to travel in the UK and, in one North Yorkshire town, spotted a fully-stocked refill shop on the High

Prefab Memories by Brian Austin

Your cover picture on the front of the August magazine certainly brought back childhood memories of living in a Rainham prefab, when we had not a care in the world, and the sun always shone!

There were some errors in the locations mentioned. We lived in Russells Avenue, which was at the top of Solomon Road, where it still is today, not the end of Scott Avenue. There were eleven "houses" there, all of which were demolished and replaced with permanent housing in the early sixties I believe. The houses mentioned in Solomon Road, Scott Avenue and Sunderland Square were not actually prefabs; they were constructed from what was basically a steel frame with reinforced concrete panels. These houses were not intended to be temporary, as in the case of prefabs, but I believe there was an unforeseen problem with the degradation of the concrete, resulting in their premature demolition in 1997. The 38 houses in Sunderland Square were replaced by a development of over 100 houses.

The main omission on your list is Mardale Road, which, along with its neighbour Wakeley Road, formed probably the biggest concentration of prefabs in Rainham. My family left Russells Avenue in 1958 to

move to Gillingham, as the prefabs had already exceeded their intended lifespan, and, let's just say they were "past their best!" I enclose a photograph of "our gang" taken in Russells Avenue in 1957. From left to right: Mick Curness (no.9); Keith Relph (no.8); my brother Keith Austin; Brian Austin (me) (no.6); and Robert Goodwin (no.4). My brother lives in Wigmore, and I in Rainham. I haven't seen the other three for a very long time, but I believe Mick Curness went to Canada and Keith Relph to Northern Ireland.



Although prefab winters had become decidedly uncomfortable by the late fifties, most of the prefab occupants I have spoken to over the years seem to remember their time in them with affection. I certainly do.

P.S. In the background of the photograph my father, Jack, can be seen polishing his beloved motor bike and sidecar combination. He never seemed to be as fond of any of his subsequent cars as he was of his "bike."

Barclays Bank, Rainham

Following in the footsteps of HSBC and Lloyds banks, Barclays Bank is closing its doors for the last time on 15th October, leaving NatWest as the remaining clearing bank in Rainham. The building housing Barclays bank was sold in 2016 and rented back to them so it's unclear what will happen to it now.

The London and Provincial Bank Ltd opened its Rainham branch as a sub-agency to Chatham in July 1899.

The bank mainly catered for small tradesmen and private customers with limited means, and confined its attention to the London suburbs, South Wales and the Eastern Counties. It was not until 1891 that a branch was opened at a leading commercial centre outside the London area, in Bristol. In 1917 the bank amalgamated with one of its formidable rivals, the London and South Western Bank, to form The London, Provincial and South Western Bank which subsequently merged with Barclays in 1918.

It was not until 1902 that Rainham acquired its own premises, originally based in one of the shops next to the Post Office. The London and Provincial Board minutes of 14th October 1902 state that the Branch manager had written to the Board, on the 10th October 1902, suggesting the purchase of a site for the building of branch premises:

"Rainham. Premises. With reference to Board minutes of 14th inst. Letter of 20th from Mr Long (Inspector) concurring in Branch Manager's recommendation that the freehold property at corner of High Street and Station Road be purchased for £475, but that the question of building there on, be allowed to stand for the present to be purchased."

The changes in Rainham branch's premises are recorded in the Barclays Schedule of Title Deeds. This shows that the branch was originally located at "Myrtle Cottage", High Street opposite what is now JCB Citroen. The London and Provincial Bank obtained the land adjacent to this building in 1902, presumably because they were occupying the building. In 1913 a tenancy was granted to the London and Provincial Bank for 14 years at a rent of £30 per annum and in 1926 this tenancy was renewed at £42 per annum. In July 1938, Barclays Bank at Rainham moved to new purpose-built premises at 89-93 High Street on the corner of Station Road where it has remained since.

Originally 89-91 High Street was rented out to other businesses (shown in the cover photo as Mattocks Sweet shop in the 1950s) but these became part of the bank itself in the late 1960s.

The Coronation clock was attached to the wall in 1953 so the cover photo was taken prior to that happening. The church school was adjacent to the bank on Station Road before Rainham Shopping centre was built and you can just see the edge of it in the photo. There have been other minor changes to the building over the years with the entrance being moved to the left and the cash machine that was in the wall on the corner of Station Road moved to the far left of the bank building in the mid 2000s.

Nature Notes (Joe Ennis)

DUNGENESS NATURE NOTES FOR SEPTEMBER

In September, birds that have spent the summer in the UK are moving through Kent, and other counties, on their way to the Channel coast. Warblers such as chiff-chaffs and blackcaps can be spotted lurking in domestic gardens. They spend daylight hours feeding, unobtrusively, on the insects and berries found on shrubs and bushes. When not building up reserves for the journey onwards, they rest and keep out of the sight of predators. Some may double their weight in preparation for their long journey to Africa. At dusk, the migrants recommence their overnight journeys towards the coast. Concentrations tend to gather at ideal coastal locations such as the Sandwich Bay area, Dungeness or the Dover to Deal stretch of coastline. Here they continue to feed, rest and await the next still, clear night to cross the

Swallows, house martins and sand martins do the opposite of many other insect-eating birds. They travel south by day, feeding in flight on airborne insects. They roost in large colonies overnight, typically in reed beds. Upon waking, the birds chatter to each other, before rising into the air and circling around to get their bearings. They appear to exhibit more urgency during their northward passage in the spring as compared with their, somewhat, leisurely progress south in the autumn. Birds which migrate in large flocks, such as swallows, can probably draw on the experience of older birds but some young birds, like those of the cuckoo and the swift, travel alone and must, therefore, find their way to Africa by themselves.

It was in September a few years ago, that I was lead by one of the wardens, to walk all the way around the RSPB bird reserve at Dungeness, in search of migrants on passage. The reserve is part of the wider National Nature Reserve and situated on the largest shingle formation of its kind in Europe. Not unnaturally, it consists largely of shingle but also includes fresh water pools, grassland and

reed beds. Despite its barren appearance, the reserve is home to nearly a third of Britain's plant species and is also the habitat of many species of dragonflies, butterflies, bumble bees, amphibians and mammals.

Sallows and willows grow prolifically at Dungeness and more different kinds of planteating insects have been found on these tree species than any other, including oak. It is not surprising that we came across many insecteating birds, including common redstart, wheatear, whinchat and a number of warbler species.

Some birds that mainly eat insects, such as blackcap, will also take elderberries and blackberries. There were plenty of these berries growing at Dungeness so it is not surprising we saw quite a few blackcaps. Berries readily available at a time of migration can be quickly gathered and digested; they are low in fibre and rich in sugars, the latter of which convert easily to body fat.

We saw a group of yellow wagtails picking up insects disturbed by the hooves and mouths of grazing cattle. We also saw flocks of swallows, house martins and sand martins hawking for flies above the water-filled and reed-lined Burrowes Pit, which is overlooked by the observation room in the reserve's visitor centre.

In due course it was time for lunch and a visit to the more well-known part of Dungeness - the "nose" of the promontory, where it juts into the English Channel. Despite some untidiness, or perhaps because of it, the ness is a fascinating place. Fishing boats are drawn up on a shingle bank surrounded by abandoned huts, shipping containers and railway fish vans. There are former railway carriages serving as weekend cottages and purpose-built cottages for fishermen with outside stairs leading up to space in the roof for fishing

tackle. There are two pubs and a café serving fish and chips, an old lighthouse from where one can see from Beachy Head to the White Cliffs of Dover and a terminus of the Romney, Hythe and Dymchurch Railway. All of this in a National Nature Reserve!

Inevitably, there is some thoughtlessness by visitors. Ancient shingle formations are being damaged by 4X4 vehicles and much litter is left along the shoreline.

After lunch I watched a large flock of great black-backed and herring gulls, adults and juveniles, sitting in the sunshine and out of the wind, in a trough in the shingle. This part of Dungeness may not look like a National Nature Reserve, but the gulls remind us that it is indeed part of such a reserve and deserves to be so.

October in the Wilder Garden (Victoria Golding)

What a difference a month makes! Last issue I alluded to the amount of rain we had and almost immediately it became dry. Since then I have watered regularly to allow the autumn plants to emerge. Although it doesn't need watering, at the time of writing, my ivy is still not in flower, later than other parts of the county. As the foliage in the pond dies down, I am doing a little clearing. I will leave any cuttings by the side of the pond for a couple of days to allow any creatures to get back in, although they may need a helping hand. Some tadpoles don't continue their development to frogs and carry through from summer till next year in that form, rather than as froglets. We have some of these in our old pond that are doing this. This is the first year I have noticed this.



I promised an update on the new pond and am pleased to report that it has a liner and we have water in it. I need to replant my new pond plants in deeper pots as we have made a couple of shelves, some for marginal and some for deeper-water plants. They have all been selected for their wildlife value, which I shall explain in greater detail next year. I am going to get another flowering rush *Butomus umbellatus*, as it is good to have plants with long stems. This would aid hatching dragonflies and damselflies as the larvae crawl up out of the water to complete their metamorphosis. (We live in hope for future years!)

Plant of the month

By deadheading your perennials, you can still have colour in the garden in October. Those that have finished blooming for the year can be divided to fill a gap, or to exchange with friends and neighbours. I will be lifting some of my tender plants, especially large-flowered salvias, to keep in the cold greenhouse over winter. I kept my Salvia patens "Oxford Blue" last year and it has been wonderful this year.

Job of the month

Keeping on top of your leaves to provide plenty of leaf mould for the garden next year is a good thing, but do also earmark places where you can let natural accumulations provide shelter and food for all kinds of creatures.


